



Seeking a better life, Barney McGettigan, at age 22, emigrated to the United States where he met London born Margaret Bradshaw whom he married in 1833. Equipped only with an ax with which to earn a living, he came to Sandusky in 1836 where he met Datus Kelley and was hired to cut wood on Kelleys Island. The family first lived in a log house near the "Indian Burial Grounds" that was later the site of Addison Kelley's mansion (ERI-1645). In December of 1841 he entered into an agreement with Datus & Irad Kelley to buy 52 ac. on the island's east side to be paid off in part by the cutting of cord wood. (The original of this agreement has been given to the KI Historical Association by family of James McGettigan, son of Barney). On this land, Barney built his first house of logs not far from this present site. After the land was cleared he planted row crops and later grapes. Sometime before 1865 (as indicated by the Nunan Map of that date, he built this larger frame house to accommodate his growing family. Here Barney and Mary spent their long lives farming the land and raising their 12 children.

Only a few on the south shore i.e. Stribbling's, 1923, and Hummel's, 1925, pre-date it. It was built in 1930 by Roger and Alice Hills Williams on a 1/2 Ac. parcel purchased from George and Emma Becker (ERI-1746). The land had been farmed by Becker's son, Reuben, and acres of vine-



yards extended to the west. Mr. Williams was the son-in-law of Norman E. Hills, author of A History of Kelleys Island, Ohio, then residing with his second wife, Jenny Bristol, in the Bristol home (ERI-1694) on Water St., and it was at Mr. Hill's urging that the land was purchased. A Civil Engineer, Mr. Williams designed his cottage and it was built by island carpenter, Ralph Dwell, assisted by the young Oscar McKillips. (See ERI-1566 and 1576) The stone fireplace and chimney were the work of island stone mason, Godfreid Schock (ERI-1572). The house was originally built on stone supporting piles with an open porch across the eastern face. In the 50's the northern half of the porch was enclosed to form a small bedroom, and the southern half screened and recently fitted with sliding windows.

The foundations of an early James McGettigan house (See ERI-1757) lie immediately to the north of the cottage.

43. History and Significance This house has been moved from its original location on Ward Rd. to the present site where it has been faithfully restored. The house was built for the residence of the Rev. Robert McCune c 1867. He had been called to the island to organize the first English speaking church here, and until it could be built, he held services and meetings in his home. These continued			
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings The house sits in an expansive lawn facing the lake. It is landscaped with white picket fence, limestone paths, and formal herb garden in the rear yard. A large barn lies to the east. The holdings comprise some 20 acres on which some produce, herbs and pigs are raised.

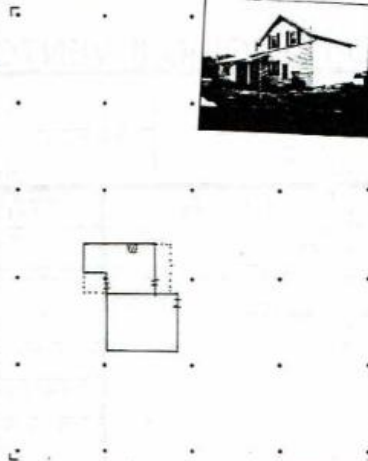



until 1877 when the new church known as the Congregational was dedicated. (Land for the new church on Division Street opposite Chapel Street had been donated by Mrs. Lucy F. Murray) During his tenure on the island, Rev. McCune took a leading part in the affairs of the English speaking community of the island, and was called to deliver the funeral oration for Datus Kelley. The next known resident was the family of John and Mary Baumler, c1880. John had emigrated first from Switzerland in 1851, living in the boarding house of John Riedy near the south shore. He worked in the quarry there until he could earn enough money to send for his wife. By 1870 they had a farm in the center of the island, and the 1880 Census shows them at this location. For the next 30 some years John and his son Henry, after him, farmed and raised grapes on these 5 acres. In 1894 a house was added to the east for John's son Louis and his family who worked in the quarry. A third son Frederick, was a blacksmith and lived on Division St. (ERI-1585) These houses, as well as those to the west were later purchased by the KIL&T. Co. and eventually turned over to the Cleveland Museum of Natural History from which the current owner purchased. Prior to this purchase in 1970, the house had stood empty for many years and was in a great state of disrepair, but the current owner saw its potential and appreciated its historic significance.

*a house on the north end of the Estes property. This would be the house originally occupied by the Monaghans. He was listed as a farmer, and he was probably engaged in managing the widow Estes' farm as we know was later done by L. Smith c.1880, (See ERI-1550). In 1859 Monaghan purchased the 88 ac. tract directly north of the Estes land, bounded by Woodford Rd. and what was later to be known as Monaghan's Rd. from Charles and Edward Kelley. He built his house the next year near the Woodford Rd. and almost opposite the house in which he had been living. According to Hills History it was surrounded by cedar woods with access through a large gate in the fence which enclosed the land.

His daughter, Mary, married Michael Hughes, another Irishman who had come to the United States in 1868, living first with his brother-in-law, John Reinheimer, and working as a fisherman. After his marriage he made his home with the Monaghan family, where his children were raised.

C.1910, the house was purchased by Henry Trieschman, Sr., and used to house his slaughter house employees. The northern 35 ac. of Monaghan land had been previously acquired by the Trieschmans.

In the early 1920's Fr. V. Chuloupka bought the house for his "Villa" volunteers (ERI-1663). C.1956, when the State purchased the land for Park purposes, the house was moved to its present location.
