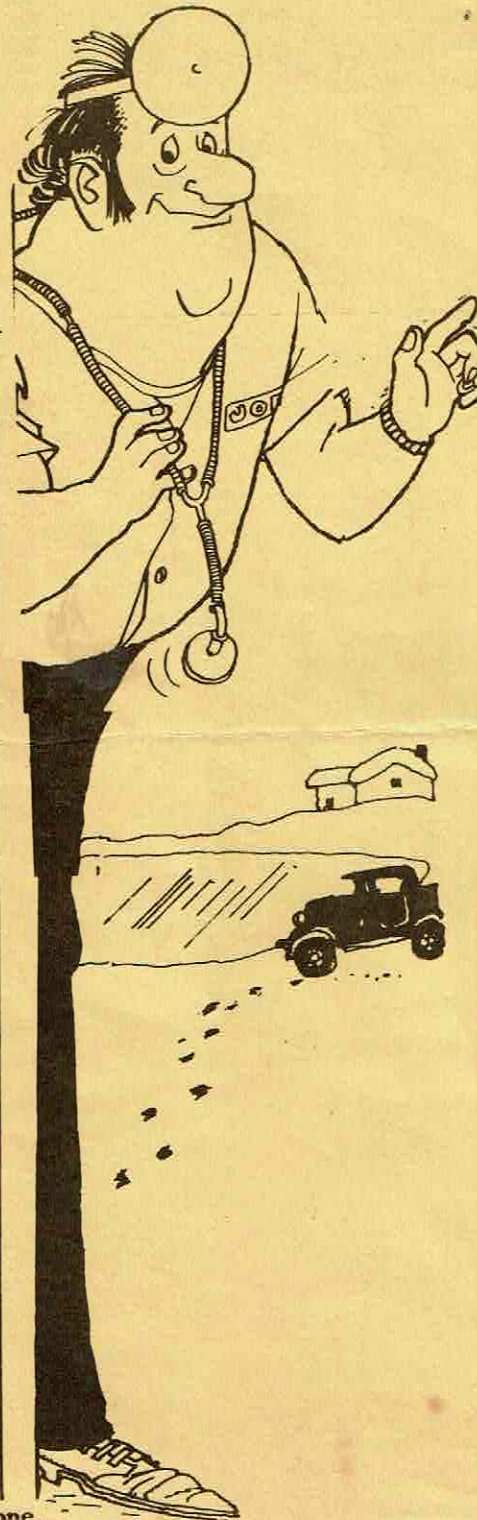

**NEW DOCTOR ARRIVES AND
ISLAND RESIDENTS HAPPY**
February 1, 1934

An all day search which extended throughout Ohio to find a doctor for Kelleys Island ended Thursday night when Dr. H.A. Crossett, Toledo, former Army doctor, crossed the ice to take the post.

Acceptance by Dr. Crossett of the place ended a search started earlier in the day by Dr. F.M. Houghtaling, city and county health commissioner, and island inhabitants to find a physician willing to take the place vacated by the death of Dr. John M. Haas, 65, who died Tuesday.

Appeals were sent to the State Board of Health and to Toledo, Cleveland and Columbus medical schools. Every physician contacted wanted "time to think it over."

Dr. Houghtaling was in despair late in the afternoon. A baby is scheduled for arrival at the island shortly, probably within a few hours, and he had found no doctor willing to go to the island, despite an offer of \$50 a month, living quarters, and transportation to the island. In addition the doctor receives fees from patients.

Thursday night, however, Dr. Crossett accepted, went to Lakeside and was there met by island inhabitants who transported him in an automobile over the ice.

Dr. Houghtaling said he would have given a local man preference but all local men whom he thought possibly might accept turned it down. The loneliness of Kelleys, cut off as it is from the mainland most of the year except by air, made most physicians hesitate about accepting it.

Dr. Crossett is about 35, married and has one daughter, according to Dr. Houghtaling. He has had little private practice, having been in the army medical corps several years. The wife and daughter are still in Toledo and will go to the island later, according to Dr. Houghtaling.

'the doctor beat the stork across the ice' Dr. Houghtaling said. I was about half in the notion of sending one of my health nurses over to care for the birth when the doctor accepted.

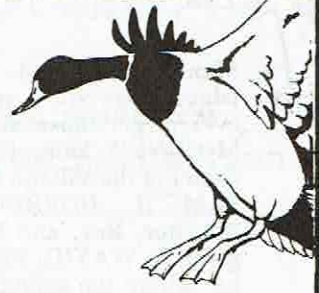
WEDDING BELLS TO CHIME

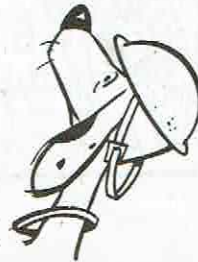
MAN'S BEST FRIEND

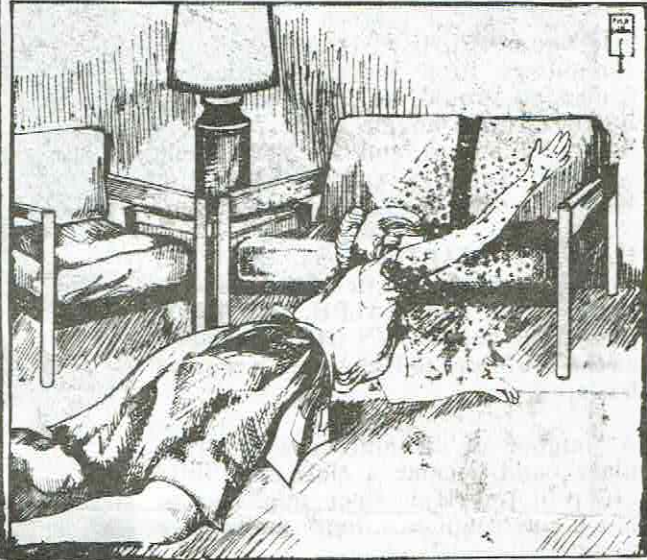

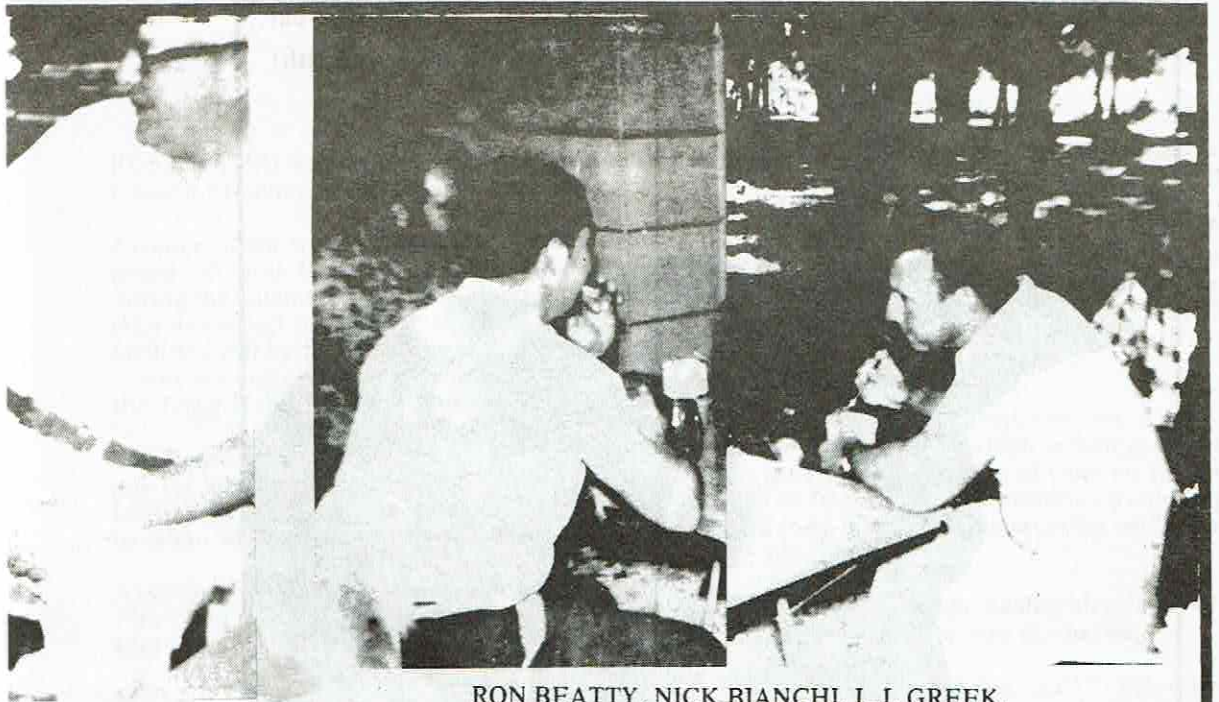

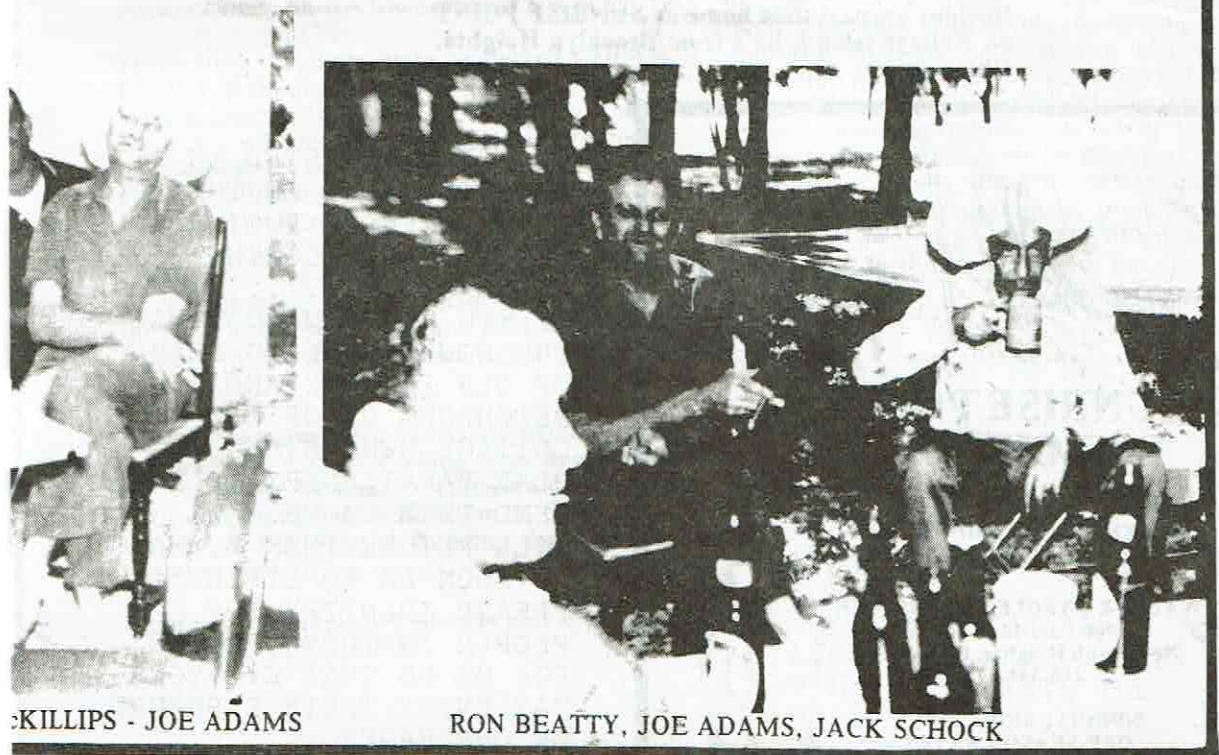

VILLAGE COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

RUSS MATSO was reinstated to his position of Council Member at the August 6 meeting.

Arrangements were made for the roads to be roped off and Open Container signs posted during the Business Peoples Kelleys Island Day (Homecoming) on August 15, 1981. Portable facilities will be furnished by the association so it was not necessary to obtain use of those in the Town Hall, as in previous years.

The Board of Public Affairs is to be advised to pay for labor and repair to sidewalk in front of LEROY MYERS home, damaged by MILLERS backhoe while repairing fire hydrant.

Assistant Fire Chief FOX was appointed active Fire Chief, as STEVEN JAMES has resigned as Fire Chief. His letter of resignation stated that he wishes to remain as a member only. MAYOR MIKE MCCUNE requested that JAKE MARTIN and NICK BIANCHI talk with JAMES requesting his continuing in the position since he has always done a fine job.

Three code variances were requested - DEAN HENRY of the Baptist Camp Patmos asked the right to use facilities of the 5-10 camper units for a 3 week period at the Camp Site for a once-a-year prayer meeting held for the elderly. LILIAN KOKAS for a Gift Shop in her home on Division Street, and KIM WATKINS on their new rooming house. Planning Commission has already given approval on all three requests. MATSO made a motion that these be referred to solicitor BILL SMITH to study and report to council legal variances necessary.

Airport Manager KEN HAIG reported that he removed the Airport Parking Sign designated for use of the General Telephone Co. of Ohio until they contribute a donation to the Village for use of the Airport Building for personal business calls.

Chief of Police reported 30 calls and 23 arrests for a month of July, 1981.

Flood damage insurance was discussed with a lengthy debate from the floor. BUD YOSCOVITS questioned the property he owns in flood area and how it can be sold if in a restricted area. BILL GORCHESTER questions the Island being bogged down by Federal Governmental regulations. NICK BIANCHI stated that people should not be restricted to what they can or cannot build.

MAYOR MCCUNE reported on a proposed Micro-Wave Tower which is being considered by the General Tele. Co. of Ohio for installation on the Island. Communications would improve and the use of the cable crossing could possibly be eliminated.

The possibility of purchasing bicycle racks to be installed downtown was discussed.

From the floor: KIRK ZETTLER questions deer problem on island and the destruction of gardens and property. NANCY KELLEY questions her property. Mayor stated that a public hearing date would be set up. The question of junk cars at the airport was answered by KEN HAIG, who reported that as long as they are legally licensed, they cannot be moved unless an ordinance is set up to do so. Other cars in question will be moved as soon as junk dealer arrives. PAT JOHNSON questions follow-up of complaints made to police chief. SHADLE asks that all councilmen take an active part in the Homecoming Parade.
