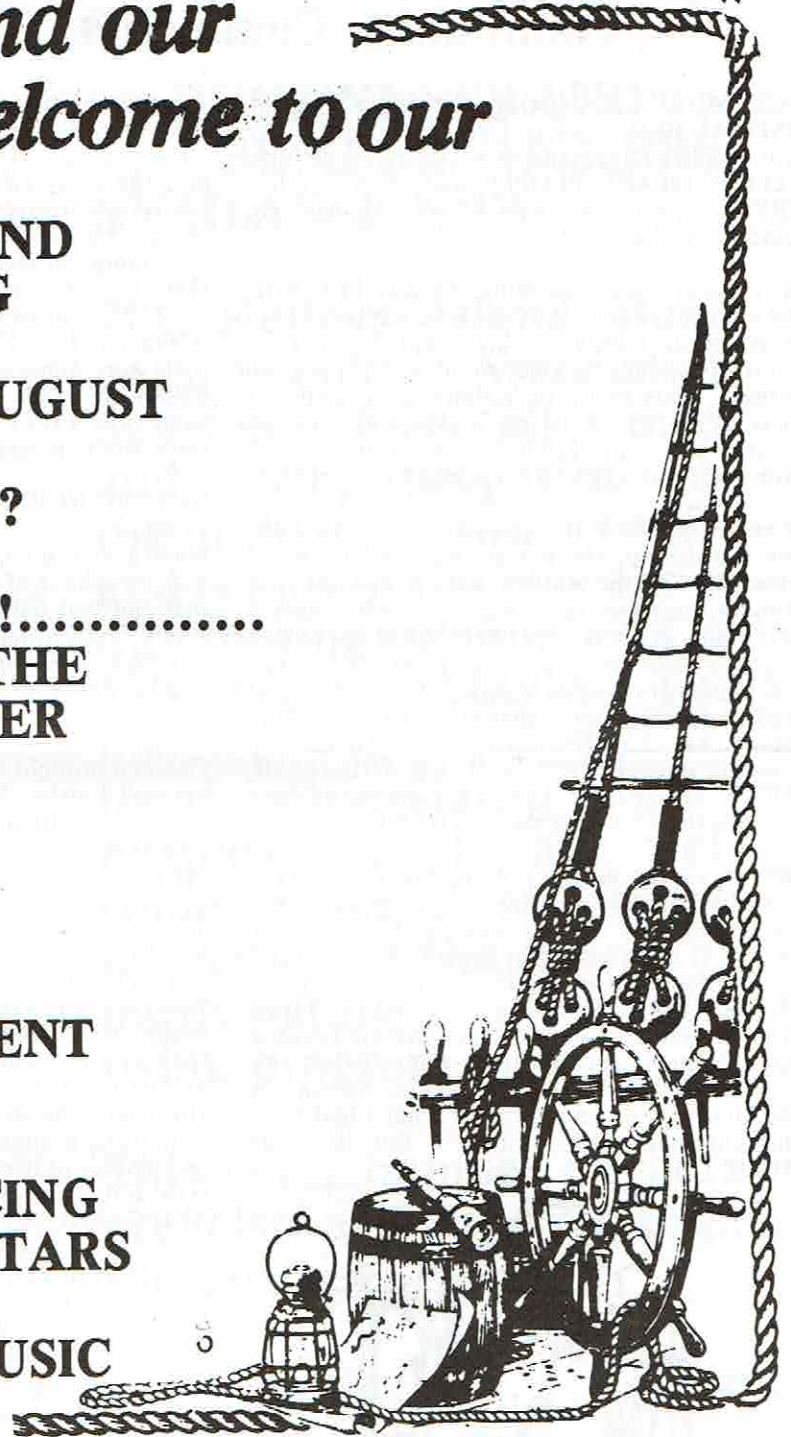

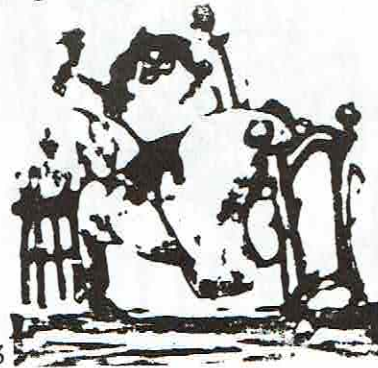

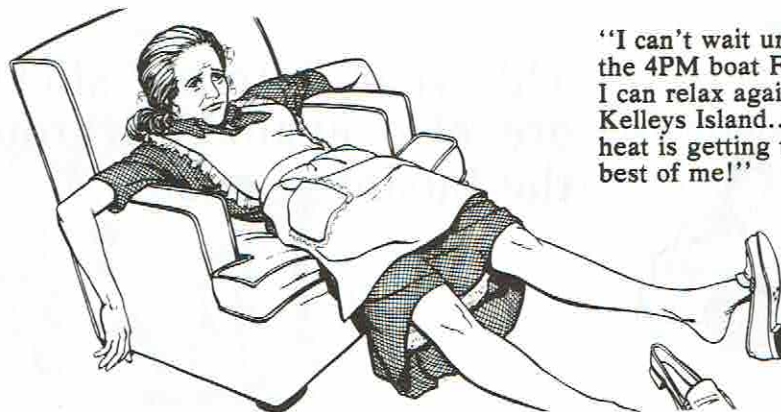

HIGHLIGHTS OF COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 10, 1982

PRESENT: BIANCHI, MARTIN, MATSO, MYERS, SCHOCK, YOSCOVITS, SOLICITOR WM. SMITH JR., PLANNING COMMISSIONER HAIG, TREASURER SEEHOLZER AND OTHER CITIZENS.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE: Myers explains meeting was held concerning disposal fees.

LANDS & BUILDINGS: Matso states a meeting was held with insurance co. along with Jake Martin regarding the coverage of the village-owned automobiles and machinery. Cost of roof repair to Town Hall will be paid by the insurance. Matso asks council approval for purchasing a new metal back door and repair of present basement windows of the Town Hall for additional security.

Motion by Bianchi for Matso to order metal door and necessary materials for window repair, all approve.

DUMP FUND DUMPED

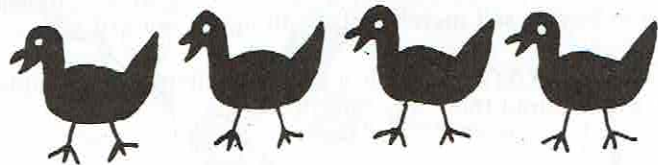
The creation of a Landfill Ordinance #347 was tabled at this meeting after a long discussion regarding the use of monies allocated for this purpose. Yoscovits stated that the Landfill money appropriated in the previous year was not used for this purpose, but was filtered through the general fund. He suggested a special fund be set up for this money, but most members disagreed, feeling the fund needs flexibility. The ordinance was tabled until the next meeting.

LITTER CONTROL GRANT DROPPED

Mayor McCune explained to council that the Litter Control Grant has been dropped because no reply was received from the village.

Permission granted the American Radio Relay League use of the pavilion 6-26-82.

Insurance package policy from T. W. Steinmann & Assoc. of Sandusky accepted by council for one year \$5,000.00 Village has option to renew two one-year contracts at same rate.



STREETS & SIDEWALKS: Martin reports that the State of Ohio has finished work on the West side of island. Yoscovits states that Mr. Bozic and Mr. Minshall are not satisfied with the completed job. Martin and Mayor McCune stated that Minshall agreed it was a job well done and that several other property owners have asked for more pipe to be laid with the amount due to be shared by these property owners. Reportedly, 8 lots were improved with piping and new drains.

Reportedly, Mr. Botic stated his disapproval of the location of the new drain on his property. The mayor answered that the project has been studied for the past two years and that state engineers located drains where the lowest drainage is available to keep the road cleared of water. Following a discussion, it was decided that each landowner will be billed individually for work completed. Martin also reports that the state has leveled off a section of the cemetery lot which should now be seeded. Matso reported that the wooden building at the cemetery is in need of repair and the metal building located there would benefit from illumination.

BIDS FOR NEW FIRE TRUCK RECEIVED

Five bids were submitted for the new village fire truck with specs indicating the cost must be kept between \$49,000.00 to \$63,000.00. Rob Watkins asked if the necessary legal papers were available to obtain permission for the department to burn 5 houses condemned by the Erie Co. Health Dept. The Kelleys Island Fire Department answered one fire call this month, a grease fire which was ignited on the stove at a residence in the Kaempfe allotment.

Watkins again stated that the bid from Grumman was most suitable for the needs of the Island Fire Dept. Solicitor Smith suggested that someone other than the local fire dept. review the bids in order to determine the approximate \$10,000 difference in prices.

AIRPORT: Martin states that he is attempting to obtain tar for the east-west runway. Haig again questioned vacated car parking at the airport. After the discussion that followed, a decision was reached that the solicitor draw up an ordinance demanding a \$25.00 yearly parking rate be charged individuals who insist on parking at the airport. A sticker showing payment of same will be placed on the cars in question.

The park and downtown area will be a hub of activity with many events planned to please all ages. From 1 - 3 in the afternoon, the old firetruck will be on display in the park. 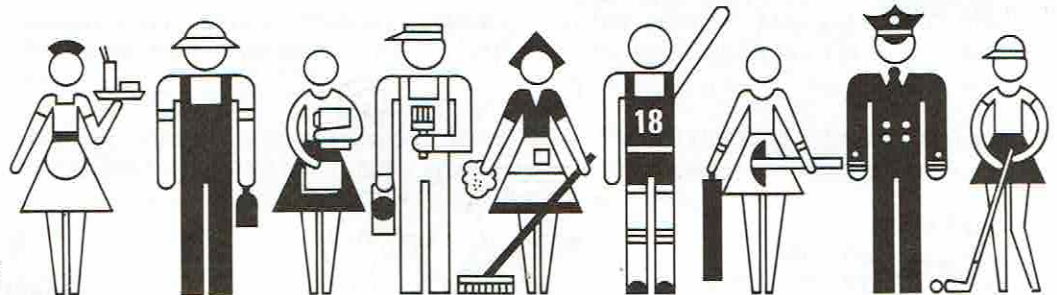

SINGLE IN TENTH GIVES KELLEYS ISLAND VICTORY OVER LOCAL BREAD TEAM

B. ERNE's single in the tenth inning with the bases loaded gave the Kelleys Island baseball club sufficient runs to take another game Monday at Kelleys Island from Light House Breads and win the series. The score was 3 to 0.

Victory put the Kelleys Island players in the running for Erie-co championship.

The Kelleys Island club scored a run in the first inning when HALT muffed DURKETT's ball at first base. O. KILLIPS walked. When BAUMAN singled into right field, DURKETT scored.

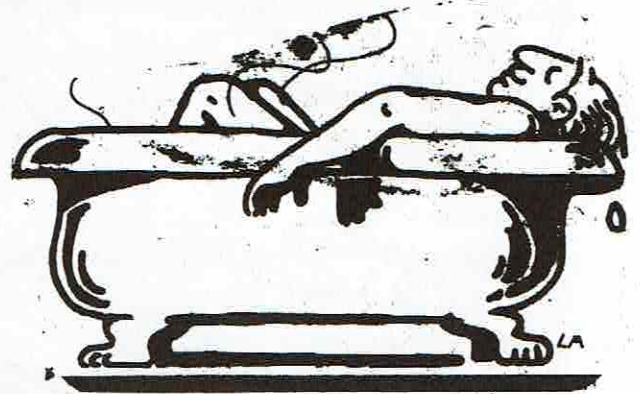
Light House Breads tied up the score in the third inning when CLARK walked and finally scored when BLOUGH singled.

Each club scored in the eighth inning. "REGGIE" KOTZ singled and went to second base when PERKINSON threw wild to second base. KOTZ scored when TIGGES singled into center field. Kelleys Island scored when NORRIS got to first base when ERNST muffed his ball. The next two players grounded out to advance NORRIS to second base. When SCHNITTKER singled into centerfield, NORRIS scored.

The Breads scored one run in their half of the tenth inning when SAHR, HALT and KOTZ all singled. SAHR scored when NORRIS threw KOTZ' batted ball wild to O. KILLIPS at third base. The third out was registered with the Breads still having the bases loaded.

With the bases loaded the Kelleys Island club's ERNE drove a single into center field to score BURKETT and BAUMAN.

B. ERNE struck out 13 batsmen to set a record of strikeouts this season against the Breads. Errors cost the Breads the game as "BUTCH" SPEER held the Kelleys Island players to four scattered hits and as many runs.
