



HIGHLIGHTS OF COUNCIL MEETING Oct. 7, 1982

Compiled from minutes by C.A. bright

Mayor McCune called the meeting to order at 8PM, the first to be held in the new building. Present were: BIANCHI, MARTIN, MATSO, MYERS, SCHOCK YOSCOVITS, Solicitor Wm. Smith Jr.. Treasurer Seeholzer, Building Inspector Haig and other citizens.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: FINANCE, none LANDS AND BUILDINGS, Matso states that Koch Aluminum of Sandusky will supply 8 storm windows for the town hall at a cost of \$1,695.00 or \$1,889.00 to supply and install the windows. A motion follow to purchase and install by Koch, agreed unanimously.

STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, Martin states a truck may be available for \$2,000 from the state and another given free. After much discussion, it was decided to wait until next meeting to decide to buy or not.

rew engine is a great improvement and is working to the satisfaction of the fire department personel. He asks that new member, DAN ZETTLER be accepted to the department. A motion to that effect is unanimously pass by council.

PLANNING COMMISSION Haig states a varience to build a garage on the property of JOHN BECK has been approved by the commission as well as all the property owners within the immediate area. Council adds their vote of approval on the project.

CHIEF OF POLICE, reports 18 information calls.

TREASURER, reports \$19,025.55 in the General Fund, \$8,385.24 in the Expense and \$30,017.93 in the balance column.

LEGISLATION: Mayor reads Ordinance 355 appropriating unappropriated funds $\overline{\text{of}\$1,000}$ from General Fund to Cemetery Fund.

BUILDING INSPECTOR POSITION

A letter from RICHARD WINGATE was read by Mayor asking for the position of Building Inspector. This was turned down until the clerk posts a public notice stating that the opening is available.

CLAUDE SMITH HIRED AS CONSULTANT

Motion by Martin to appoint C. Smith as consultant to the Board of Public Affairs was unanimously accepted. A letter of thanks was sanctioned by council to be sent to George Butts who has resigned effective Nov. 30, 82.

BUILDING PERMITS

The clerk reported that five new building permits were granted since last' council meeting.

TOWN HALL FOR POT LUCK

Interested Citizens representation requested the use of the Town hall for their village Christmas Pot Luck to be held 12-11-82. Granted permission.






ISLAND FISHERMEN TO BE GUARDED....

Congressman W. L. Fiesinger, in a telegram to Sandusky Newspapers today, assured protection to ice fishermen of Kelleys Island and others in this vicinity who fish through the ice off the island. In response to protests of Kelleys Islanders that the Marblehead Coast Guard station is slow in furnishing protection to fishermen while in dnager. Fliesinger has taken steps to have the Coast Guard station place a man on the north side of Kelleys Island as an observer during the ice period in order to alleviate danger of loss of life.

Constant communication with the Marblehead Coast Guard station will be maintained by this observer, Congressman Fiesinger stated, and he will advise and assist fishermen during the ice period.

Several protests had been filed with the local Congressman from island fishermen, among them one by the Commercial Club there, headed by Frank Hamilton. This, the most recent, came after several ice shanties were lost Monday and after it was thought for awhile that the lives of about ten fishermen were in danger.


Other accidents have been recorded on the ice there this winter while ice anglers have been following the island's major winter industry. A month ago, an auto plunged through the ice. No casulties have resulted so far, however, from this winter's ice fishing.


Marblehead Coast Guardsmen have asserted that the ice freezes into the rudders of their boats and that at times during the cold days, they are unable to even get the engines in their boats to turn over.
