Found out the winner for GERALINDE BETZENHEIMER's annual ornament contest.

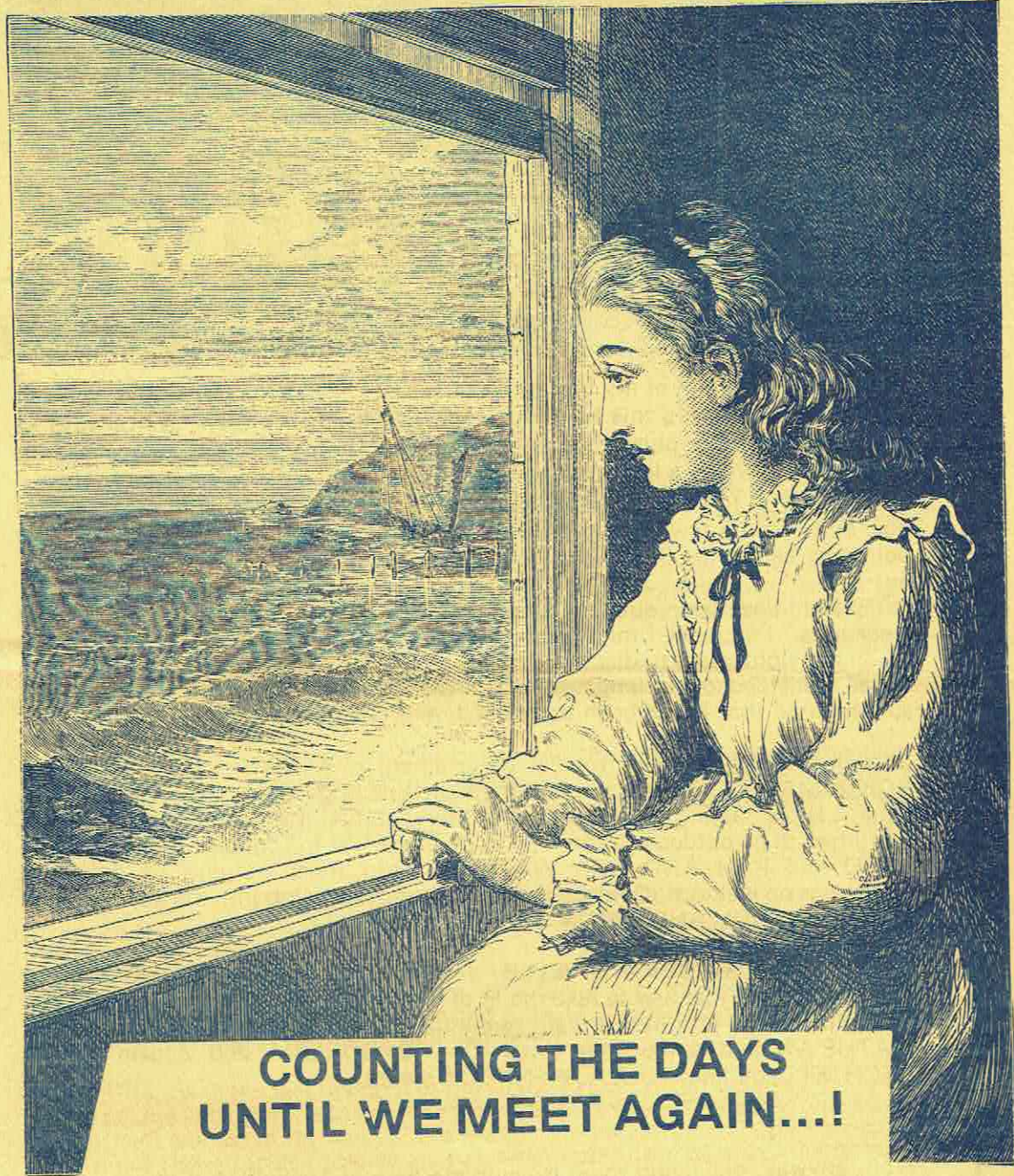

Zion's Christmas program was held on Christmas Eve, and I was so disappointed as I knew so many people who were leaving for the mainland and

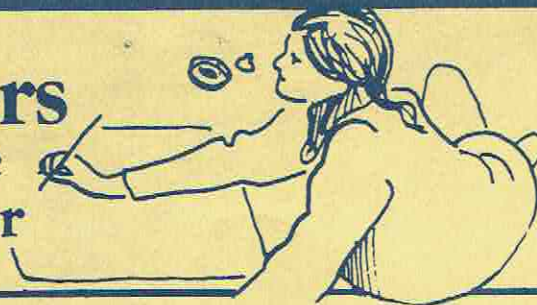

HIGHLIGHTS OF COUNCIL MEETING JANUARY 6, 1983 at 8PM

PRESENT BIANCHI, MATSO, MYERS, SCHOCK, YOSCOVITS

Mayor McCune read a letter from Councilman CHARLES MARTIN requesting to be excused from the meeting as he is vacationing in Florida. ROLL CALL: YEA: MATSO, MYERS, SCHOCK, NAY: BIANCHI, YOSCOVITS

FIREMEN WILL NOT VOLUNTEER TO INSTALL TOILET

Yoscovits asks that the minutes of last meeting be amended to read that the volunteer firemen will not volunteer to install the toilet at the fire station. He then questions ordinances being passed on the first reading only because of only 4 votes. Solicitor Smith answers that it is necessary for a 3/4 vote in order to advance to the 3rd and final reading.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE: No report

FIRE DEPARTMENT: Fox reports three new members...DAVE PHINNEY, TOM ULLRICH AND TIM ULLRICH. Motion by Bianchi to accept new members. All Yea. Chief Fox then states that chimney cleaning brushes are available to anyone wishing to use them. Contact FOX OR ROB WATKINS.

PLANNING COMMISSION: KEN HAIG reports on GTE request to construct a microwave tower behind the present site of the telephone exchange building. No action is taken at this time. SMITH, MCCUNE AND HAIG are to investigate further.

HAIG states that LANDS AND BUILDINGS should look into the condition of the bridge on Monaghan rd. near his home. YOSCOVITS suggests that council look into the new Federal gas tax that has been earmarked for bridge repair. No action taken at this time. HAIG then reports the ditch bordering the pond on Monaghan Rd should be cleaned out. McCune states that Beatty is working on that job now. Haig wishes to make council aware that he believes BEATTY AND McKillips are operating a quarry. Smith is to investigate the legalities.

AIRPORT: HAIG reports the landing field is not in good shape. Cars should be removed. He also reports that CHIEF McKillips is not aware that he is a member of the airport committee. The Mayor answers that he has personally made McKillips aware that he is indeed on the committee.

TREASURER: SEEHOLZER reports receipts \$5,893.84. Expenditures \$26,893.04, balance \$50,303.67. Because of the depleted balance in the general fund, spending will be kept at a bare minimum and cut backs will occur whenever possible. Additional revenue is expected to be available in March.

FLOOD INSURANCE: YOSCOVITS states that citizens have requested the flood insurance be brought before council until they are notified that the referendum petition has been filed. Solicitor Smith reports that the petition has been filed with the board of elections and will be on the ballot at the general election held in Nov. of 1983.

OLD BUSINESS: NONE REPORTED UPON

BANK DEPOSITORY

Motion by Yoscovits seconded by Bianchi to send letters to a minimum of 4 banks requesting information for bank depository, all agreed to keep Third National Bank as their depository until a resolution is passed at later date to change this.

HUNT CLUB MEMBERS SELECTED

McCune asks council to nominate two members to be active in the Hunt Club organizing committee. BIANCHI AND MYERS voted to the committee

PIGGYBACK TAX ISSUE AIRED

Solicitor Smith reported on the meeting held with Rep. Fred Deering & several persons from Put-in-Bay. A preliminary draft of the proposed Bill to be presented to the State legislature was passed out to council members for their review. The bill requests that the islands be given status as a separate taxing district in order to impose a 1½% piggyback sales tax. At present the bill reportedly states that the tax will be collected by the state, according to vendor licenses, and that Deering is attempting to attach a rider to the bill including fairy boats. Council advises that the Business People be informed about the bill. McCune requests that a special meeting be held with representatives from the Chamber of Commerce before the next regular council meeting. KIM WATKINS is to notify members of the Chamber of commerce.

MISC. FROM THE FLOOR

Myers reports that Terry Miller was not aware that separate invoices must be made for each tank that is filled. Yoscovits requests the use of the downtown area and park on the third Sat. of August for the annual Homecoming celebration.

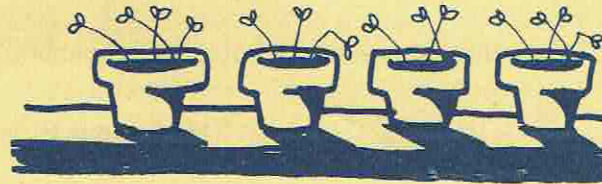

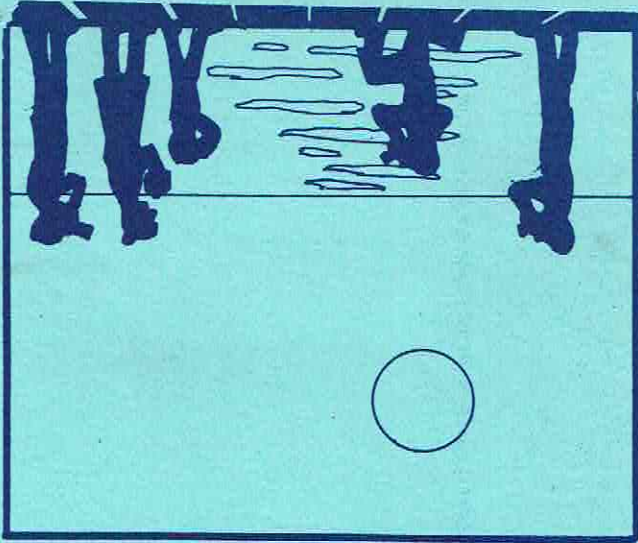
(EDITORS NOTE: What about this Earl, are you related to the good doctor in question?)

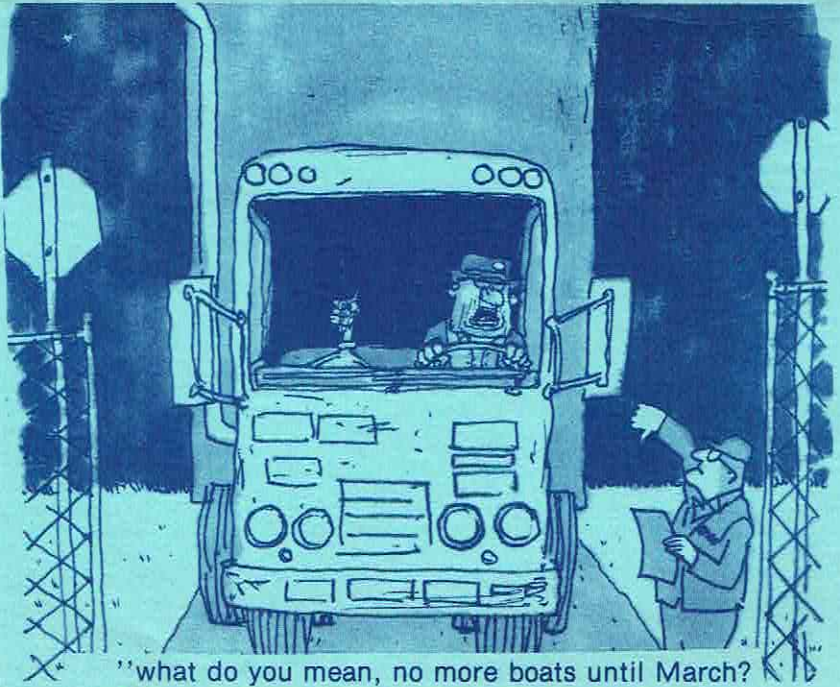
