

Sippin' at the Rock...

Rock, paper scissors-er, is that 'rock, paper, slippers?' No, the name is "Rock, Baker, Sippers," a variation Denise Feasby coined for her new venture, a bakery out here, on "the rock," as the island is sometimes affectionately referred to. A "fun name for a fun place," she explains, as the origin of the name came to her one night after her daughter asked what she was going to name her new business.

The bakery is in the space next door to the former coffee shop. Kurt Greene Construction is responsible for turning the bones of the new space into Denise bakery dream.

Her newly face-lifted shop in Caddy Shack Square is a new direction for Denise, who fell in love with Kelleys on a camping trip 20 years ago. She kept coming back, buying Martha and Joe Onders' place on Division Street with her husband "Boot" a decade ago. After he died (too soon, too young) in 2008, she realized she "was going nowhere." With her three daughters married and in their own homes, she found herself coming home with nobody there. So she decided to quit her job (28 years in customer service and data entry) and "throw caution to the wind." She moved to that summer weekend home from the town where she had lived all her life, Antwerp, Ohio. Denise found work at Dockers.

where she used her book-keeping skills and acquired new interests and ideas for supporting herself in this resort community.

The idea of a bakery was the inspiration of an old mentor and friend, Goldie Getrost, who had lost her husband many years before and was similarly adrift, unsure of what to do with her time and life when a neighbor asked her to give piano lessons to their children. A gifted pianist and organist, that simple request provided Goldie the direction she needed. Denise remembered Goldie's message, "I used what I could do, to make a living." Denise says, "I can't sing or dance, but I can bake." And here she is, doing just that.

Drawing from her favorite (and most successful) recipes, she plans to provide the island with cake donuts, her signature (giant) cinnamon buns, and assortments of cookies, muffins, breads, dessert tortes, and specialty "photo" and carrot or cheese cakes. Pastries always seem to require a beverage accompaniment, and Rock, Baker, and Sippers will offer espresso, lattes, cappuccinos, Caruso coffee with a bold variety featured each week, and Harney & Sons hot tea selections. There will also be brewed ice teas, lemonade, and smoothies.

All this available 7 days a week, from 6:30 a.m. until 6



p.m. (planned hours at the time of this printing). As with any new business plan and venture, adjustments may occur as demands grow. Local businesses and restaurants have already approached Denise to enquire about her baking specific items for them. The first step, she notes both cheerily and sensibly, is to open to the public. And that is exactly what she is working towards doing each day, painting the inner walls warm "coffee" colors, placing counters, and envisaging where to position racks of tempting goodies, where to place the coffee carafes for the most convenient traffic flow.

Opening for business this Memorial Day weekend, Denise plans to remain open May through Halloween. A special treat for her this summer is to have her grandson Cody Bradford as her first employee. What better way for a new beginning than to top it off with the pleasure of having your grandchild at your side for an entire summer!

Kelleys Life welcomes this new addition to the island's fare, and wishes Denise happy success as she offers us all a fresh alternative to morning java. Let's raise a cup to that, especially if it's accompanied by fresh baked challah, warm sour dough, or crusty French bread.



Ron (Ronald) Ehrbar, Kelleys Island Police Chief, manages a unique and special force. Serving the different populations of permanent, semi-permanent, and temporary residents or visitors requires adaptability, yet consistency. Providing the police services typically expected by the public could be daunting when "the public" mass shifts from a couple hundred to what can be several thousand, then back again.

The Chief's calm demeanor and his 33 years of experience with the City of Cleveland Police Department are core attributes of the KI Police Department's strengths. Modestly, Chief Ehrbar cites the abilities of his team, two to eight part-time police officers (at any given time of year) for keeping the peace in a steady, professional manner.

The actual police work is handled by the men (and women, who are sometimes employed) who are out in the public, on the street walking, riding a bicycle, or driving, while he handles the "administration" of the system. Everybody's problem, whether it is a barking dog or an emergency, is important to that person, and every phone call, every concern, becomes the work



of the Chief's office, to be treated with respect and given the attention needed.

Spring is the most challenging time, says Ron, as he plans and orchestrates the many demands of getting his staff and resources ready for the summer when seasonal and weekend crowds arrive by private plane or pleasure craft, or take the ferry as walk-ons, with bicycles or motorcycles, or in their cars, vans, and campers.

The most rewarding aspect of his

work is the team of officers, whom he readily describes as "tremendous" in their abilities to handle all and any of the routine or unexpected situations that can suddenly occur, even in the confined space of the island. KI officers deal with all of the situations seen in a much larger community.

Kelleys Island is a world where Ron is at home: the fourth generation Ehrbar to live on Kelleys, he planned to live here after his career in the city ended, coming home to the place where he spent weekends and longer vacations, virtually all his life.

Low key and approachable, Ron enjoys talking with islanders and visitors, alike. His most important task, he states, is "keeping people safe." Since the island's chief business is tourism, it is his role to ensure that his department and his officers remain both "fair and accountable," while maintaining that safety.

Consistent with his personal and professional principles, Chief Ehrbar works comfortably with the many safety units in surrounding counties and townships to build rapport and collaboration that jointly works to sustain harmony in the several distinct but related lake-connected communities.

He does not claim to know everything, and appreciates the help he receives from police units, United States Coast Guard, fire service personnel, border, immigration, and similar units of men and women working jointly to maintain peace and a healthy way of life for all. He prides himself on building bridges and connectional efforts, from which all islanders benefit.



Looking for Kelleys Island roots



Michael Beatty

I am the great, great grandson of Johann Ludwig Bette, (Louis Beatty) a German farmer who immigrated along with a total of 21 families in 1849 from Johannestal, Russia to Akron, Ohio. By 1851 Louis had arrived on Kelleys Island and began establishing vineyards. By 1872, Louis had become a successful wine maker and a prominent member of the island's community. He took his newly acquired wealth and returned to Johannestal. However, due to political tensions mounting in Eastern Europe, he was forced to return to Kelleys Island where he brought his two remaining sisters and their husbands. My wife, Teri (Bianchi) is the granddaughter of Adamo and Guiseppina (Adam and Josephine) Bianchi, Italian immigrants who made their way from San Marino, Italy in 1928 to Kelleys Island.

With the birth of our son, Ryley in 2009, I have become quite interested in researching our family ancestry, most specifically, on Kelleys Island. Over the past two years, I have been in touch with many island historians gathering information on the various historical families of Kelleys Island. The deeper I have dug into the islands' ancestry and the more information I have gathered, the more amazed I have become as to how much of a tangled web the ancestry of the island has become.

I am proud to share what information I have gathered, and have published it on a website I have put together. This website contains an extensive database that currently contains over 2,700 individuals, 826 families, and 657 surnames, all of which have ties to Kelleys Island. This website provides the ability for anyone to step back through time to research their roots. There are many reports available to use to help you link yourself through the various fami-

lies and answer the age-old discussion every islander has had at least one time, "I'm sure we are related somehow?"

This collective repository of family data, as it is presented, is by no means complete, and most certainly contains errors. Access to the website itself is public and available to anyone who chooses to use it. Registration to view deceased ancestors is not necessary, however, I invite you to register a free account.

Only individuals who are in, or should be in, the tree will be given membership access. By default, all registered users will be attached their own record in the tree, or closest relative, and given the ability to customize the website to provide quick access to the information they find most relevant and to focus their research in a more defined area of the tree specific to your needs. However, in publishing this website, I am reaching out in hopes you can offer your own personal contributions with additional information, pictures, or documentation as well as to provide corrections. By your request, I would be happy to provide "editor" rights to any registered user. With editor rights, you will have the ability to help me to grow the family tree by making additions, changes, and corrections. Please be patient with your registration and allow a few d your account to get setup.

I would also like to point out that it is a priority of mine to keep private information on living people confidential. I recognize that the family tree cannot grow unless you are willing to share your information. My goal is to provide as much information as possible without infringing on your privacy. Built into the website are strict privacy rules in regards to living individuals. All personal information that is provided on living people will be kept private and will only be made accessible to second cousins and closer. At your request, I would be happy to restrict your information even fur-

You will also find available links to a message board to allow you to ask questions and respond to questions and discussion on the islands ancestry as well as a link to a Facebook page to help connect with other islanders interested in researching their roots.







Ask Serving Our Seniors Financial Elder Abuse - Know the Signs

Serving Our Seniors is a local, notfor-profit organization funded by the Erie County Senior Services Tax Levy. Serving Our Seniors is a geriatric social service agency that provides a variety of help to Erie County residents age 60 and better. The organization's purpose is to assist older people in maintaining their independent

As more of our population becomes senior citizens, it is expected that there will be more skilled predators ready, willing and waiting to take advantage of the income and assets of older people.

According to the Ohio Dept. on Aging in their 2005 "Ohio Elder Abuse Task Force Final Report," financial abuse/exploitation is under reported. It is estimated that 1 out of 25 senior citizens have fallen prey to others (http://www.aging.ohio.gov/resources/ publications/eatffinal.pdf) who have influenced senior citizens out of their

Some of the exploits are: **Telephone scam** - A stranger calls

you in the middle of the night, saying 'Grandma, I'm in Canada. I've been in a traffic accident and I was arrested. I need \$2,000 to make bail." "Can you wire me the money?" The senior citizens replies, Jimmy, is that you? The imposter says, "Yes, Grandma. It's me, Jimmy." "Can you send me the money? Please don't tell my parents!"

The senior citizens wires the \$2,000.00 that morning only to find out a few days later that "Jimmy" was never in Canada, never in jail and didn't need

Mail scam - You receive an authentic looking check that is worth \$8,000. The letter tells you that you have won the Canadian lottery. The check is a portion of your 1 million dollar jackpot. To collect the rest of winnings, deposit the check into your account and wire \$4,000 to cover administrative expenses associated with processing your lottery prize.

The senior citizen deposits the bogus check and wires the imposters \$4,000.00. The check bounces and the senior citizen is charged a fee for the

bounced check, plus the senior citizen is out the \$4,000.00 he/she just wired to the scam artists.

In both cases there is nothing that can be done, because the senior citizen has been instructed to wire the funds to a foreign country. TIP: Consumer Beware! If you are ever asked to wire anyone money it is probably as scam. Report such activity to local law enforcement, Consumer Affairs Bureau of the Ohio Attorney General.

"Undue Influence" - Another manipulative tactic that is commonly practiced against older adults is what is known as "Undue Influence." Undue influence, in itself, is not a crime. However, it is the means that is used to commit a crime of exploitation/finan-

Undue influence commonly occurs when an individual gains a position of trust in the life of the senior citizen. Through the use of lies, deceit/fraud, threats, or force the "influencer" causes its victims to do things/agree to things that are not in the best interest of the senior citizen or may be contrary to the

senior citizens real wishes or desires.

For example, the senior citizen consents to doing things they really don't want to do; or things that are not in their best interest, i.e., giving money to the "influencer," whenever they ask. The money is being given due to the influence that has been applied. The senior citizen is not benefitting from the exchange and is doing it to comply with wishes/desires of the person who is influencing the senior citizen's behav-

Electricity theft: not worth the risk

Every year, electric cooperatives across the country cope with thievesfolks who deliberately tamper with their electric meter to steal power. Not only is this practice extremely dangerous, it's a serious crime that results in hefty fines and jail time.

Over the vears Hancock-Wood has found people doing some dangerous things-using knives, forks, magnets, jumper cables, and any number of other objects to get around paying for the power they use. However, not only are these persons stealing from their fellow co-op members they're also risking their lives and those of our workers. And they all eventually get caught.

According to the Cooperative Research Network, a division of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association, power surging through a compromised meter can cause an electrical catastrophe. A short circuit could produce an arc flash bright enough to cause blindness and powerful enough to launch fragments of shrapnel-like,

red-hot debris. Serious injury or death from electrocution, explosion, or fire often results from meter tampering. Only trained cooperative personnel wearing protective clothing should work on meters.

Anytime you get into a meter base, you run a risk. With an arc flash, somebody could get killed or seriously


Electricity theft is not a victimless crime. You're not-for-profit cooperative loses revenue and expends resources to investigate tampering. These costs are then passed on to the entire membership. National estimates vary, but The Washington Post cited revenue protection officials who claim between \$1 billion and \$10 billion worth of electricity is stolen from utilities annually.


Since everyone pays for lost power, please let us know if you suspect meter tampering. Contact Hancock-Wood to report possible theft of service. All information can be given anonymously.

Important questions to ask aging parents

Remember "the talk" your parents initiated (maybe) with you many years ago? Well, now it's your turn to sit on the opposite side of the table. If you're the adult child of aging parents, it's important to open up a conversation about their future needs and wishes. The best time to do so is when your parents are relatively healthy and active. Otherwise, you may find yourself making critical decisions on their behalf in the midst of a crisis - without a road map.

The reality, though, is that many adult children would rather avoid such a discussion, because it can create feelings of fear and loss on both sides, and adult children want to avoid getting too personal by asking about financial or other matters. Here are some questions in the areas of finances, health, living situation, and memorial wishes that can help you start a conversation.

Finances

• What institutions hold your assets? Ask your parents to create a list of their bank, brokerage, and retirement accounts, including account numbers and online user names and passwords, if applicable. You should also know where to find their insurance policies (life, home, auto, disability, and long-term care), Social Security cards, titles to their house and vehicles, outstanding loan documents, and past tax returns. If

your parents have a safe-deposit box or home safe, make sure you can access the key or combination.

- Do you currently work with any financial, legal, or tax advisors? If so, get a list of names with contact information
- How often do you meet with you financial advisor? Do you think it would be helpful to do so soon? Would you like me to come?
- Do you need help paying monthly bills or reviewing items like credit card statements, medical receipts, or property tax bills?
- Do you have a durable power of attorney? A durable power of attorney is a legal document that allows a named individual (such as an adult child) to manage all aspects of a parent's financial life if he or she becomes disabled or incompetent.
- Do you have a will? If so, find out where it's located and who is named as executor. If it's more than five years old, your parents may want to review it to make sure their current wishes are represented. Ask if they have any specific personal property disposition requests that they want to discuss now (e.g., Aunt Agnes should get the china set).
- Are your beneficiary designations up-to-date? Designated beneficiaries on insurance policies, pensions, IRAs, and investments trump any instructions in

your parents' wills.

• Do you have an overall estate plan? A trust? A living trust can help manage an estate while your parents are still living.

Health

- What doctors do you currently see? Do they have experience treating seniors? Are you happy with the care you're getting? If your parents begin to need multiple medical specialists and/or home health services, you might consider hiring a geriatric care manager, especially if you don't live close by.
- What medications are you currentv taking?
- What health insurance do you have? In addition to Medicare, which kicks in at age 65, find out if your parents have or should consider Medigap insurance a private policy that covers many costs and services not covered by Medicare and long-term care insurance, which covers the need for extended medical care.
- Do you have an advanced medical directive? This document includes you parents' wishes regarding life-support measures and the name of the person who will communicate on their behalf

Living Situation

• Do you plan to stay in your current home, or have you thought about downsizing to a condominium or townhouse?

- Is there anything I can do now to make your home more comfortable? This might include smaller projects like installing hand rails and night lights in the bathroom to bigger projects like moving the washer machine out of the basement, installing a stair climber, or moving a bedroom to the first floor.
- Do you employ certain people or companies for home maintenance projects (i.e., heating contractor, plumber, electrician, fall cleanup)?

Memorial Wishes

- Do you want to be buried or cremated? Do you have a burial plot picked out?
- Do you have any specific music or reading requests, or other wishes for your memorial service?

Rare Bat Discovered at Castalia Quarry MetroPark

Erie County MetroParks

Last week, an Eastern Small-footed bat, a bat species that has not been confirmed in the state of Ohio for more than a century, was found roosting in Castalia Quarry MetroPark!

Huron, OH, May 20-In April, Ohio State University School of Environment and Natural Resources applied for an Erie MetroParks special permit to monitor the migration paths of bats during spring migration. Erie MetroParks granted permission for researchers to use mist netting to capture bats for the purpose of attaching radio transmitters for subsequent monitoring.

Last week, Research Assistant, Andrew Kniowski, captured an Eastern Small-footed bat in Resthaven Wildlife Area. This bat species has not been confirmed in the state of Ohio for more than a century! The research team attached a radio transmitter to the bat and it was subsequently found roosting in Castalia Quarry MetroPark. The bat was roosting in the rock crevices on the southwest end of the quarry which is typical roosting habitat for this species. The bat remained for a couple of days but has since moved on.





Announcing the Annual Lake Erie Watersnake Census



Rare bird seen on **Kelleys Island**

Tues., Apr 26, KI Audubon member Mary Ann Rysek heard the telltale "thunk" on her window and got a glimpse of something little falling. Lying on the front porch was a "cute little blue bird" which she didn't recognize. Mary Ann knew a group had gathered at Judy DuShane's house for their regular Tuesday "coffee," so she wrapped the little bird in a clean washcloth and took it to the group and handed it to June Campbell. Mary Ann said it might fly away, so June, Lori Hayes and Judy DuShane crammed into a little bathroom and carefully turned back the washcloth to reveal a beautiful blue head. Indigo Bunting, said Lori. June thought Black-throated Blue Warbler. The little bird was timid but moving around like it might want to escape. More careful uncovering did not reveal the expected black throat, so June was immediately sure and excited that it was a cerulean warbler.

A quick search of bird books verified it as a cerulean, and one of them stated that the earliest record in Ohio

was Apr 22. This was Apr 26 -- right on time!

Lori called husband Pat Hayes who came right over to Judy's but doubted that it really was a cerulean warbler. Pat verified the breed, and now we are all getting excited.

The bird was moving around, and June held it in her fingers like Tom Bartlett taught her while Pat took pictures. The bird fluttered like he wanted to get away. The wind was still blowing strong SW, which was much too strong for that tiny little bird. It was taken to a sheltered place behind Judy's house and placed on the ground, but it did not try to fly. Judy supplied a paper bag, and the bird was taken home by Mary Ann to recover so it could continue its spring migra-

Cerulian warblers are considered an at-risk bird because of seriously declining numbers. Its winter habitat on the slopes of the Andes Mountains has been seriously destroyed to grow cocoa (cocaine) and coffee. In the USA, the mature woods habitat along the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers has also been lost.

Cerulian warblers live in the tops of mature diciduous trees, foraging insects in the canopy. It can be identified by its song but is very difficult to see so high up in the trees, especially after leaves pop out. Nests are built high in the canopy and concealed by leaves and vines, and 3-4 eggs are incubated by the female. Both parents feed the young. Breeding areas are as far north as southern Ontario and as far south as Arkansas with light distribution as far as the east coast. Formerly one of the most abundant breeding warblers in Ohio and the Mississippi River Valleys, its population plummeted in the 1900's due to habitat destruction. It is doubtful that cerulean warblers will nest on Kelleys Island.

What a way to celebrate the spring migration on Kelleys Island!





Puttin' on the bacon...

Things have been sizzling at the Island House Restaurant and Martini Bar, which opened in mid May under the second year of management by Jesse Kranyak. A new chef, a pretty much all new menu and lots of other exciting changes have been included for the 2011 season.



For starters they are offering free bacon at the bar when a drink is purchased. And, as Jesse states, "This ain't yo mama's bacon either." Chef Kevin Green, who spent four years training in at Le Cordon Bleu in France, candies the bacon with Szechwan seasoning and brown sugar, and then bakes it until it is crispy. The clientele has loved the mix of the incredible array of martinis, beers and other drinks, with the bacon.

The rest of the menu features an array of appetizers that include a daily stuffed puff pastry, calamari in a sweet Thai sauce, along with several other options. There's a variety of salads, including the fresh wilted veggie T's Salad that has become an Island House favorite. There are burgers boasting three cuts of beef and ground fresh daily, a lobster roll, a pulled pork sandwich; along with a number of different

pasta dishes. Main entrées include Blackened Walleye, a gigantic Tomahawk Steak-a large bone-in ribeye steak billed as "big enough for two," which at 32 oz. it should be, even though some of that weight is the Tomahawk-length bone. The Kobe Beef Steak is back, as well as the Lamb Chops. An almond encrusted Perch dish with a balsamic currant glaze and served with pink spiced rice and flame grilled asparagus is a newer item.
