# Kelleys Island's own Band of Brothers...

Kelleys Island VFW Post #9908 lists 98 members among its own. Loyal patriots, spanning the generations, these men (and a few women) sustain the Post and its activities faithfully, rain or shine, twelve months a year. In winter, the VFW is one of a handful of island institutions that serve up camaraderie and warm-hearted fellowship to both young and old through family activities that are wholesome fun on a cold and windy night. When the ice freezes, you'll even find a few snowmobiles that made the trek across frozen waters to "belly up to the bar" and share an evening's easy chatter with friends old and new.

As winter chill gives way (too slowly, it seems!), the familiar white building with the flag out front down Division Street (across from the cemetery, sort of) welcomes home its members and their invited guests.

The posts' members and guests this summer will notice winter work done by a generous group of volunteers has given the Post a face lift-a renewed, brightened, and lighter interior. Two new furnaces (one in each of the two main community rooms) chased away winter's blasts, and a paint job has brightened and lightened the bar, kitchen, and dining areas. With money saved for repairs and donations from generous members, walls, ceiling, cabinets, and cupboards have been sanded, repainted, and refreshed at minimal cost. The old chimney and vent areas have been boxed in, ceiling tiles replaced where needed, and lighting fixtures rearranged for an efficient alignment that spotlights plaques honoring and memorializing the service of veterans from the island who have served during times of conflict around the globe from the Civil War forward.

Hosting winter Sunday night potlucks and senior lunches, summer Chicken Dinner and Clambakes, and traditional turkey shoots, VFW Post # 9908 is a vital island institution. Historically it has supported community life by distributing funds, formerly to scouting and drill team activities,

to children's Christmas, KI Audubon Club's Junior Nature Camp, and to the churches and island charitable needs. VFW-related charities, such as the statewide cancer fund and the VFW Children's Home in Michigan are among its wider ranging activities of financial support.

Meetings are held the second Tues. each month at 7 p.m. at the Post, all year long. The VFW is open for business from 4 p.m. onwards, Thursday through Sunday, and anticipates a more extended weekly operation as the season approaches. Officers for the 2011 season include Post Commander Paul Finnegan, Sr., Vice Commander Charlie Burns, Jr., Vice Commander Bill Koenigseker, and Quartermaster Mike Feyedelem. The Post mourns the recent loss of long-time member Jim Sonnich

Membership is open to any who have served overseas during a time of conflict in all branches of the US military operations. New members who meet the qualifications are welcomed.

The Post is responsible for conducting Memorial Day and Veterans Day services at the island cemetery, which have traditionally attracted loyal crowds of supporters.

This year's Memorial Day service will be held on the official Memorial Day, Mon., May 30. Look for postings at the post office and Island Market for the start times for that service, anticipated to be late morning (around 11 a.m., exact time to be announced nearer the date).

Call the Post at 419-746-2707 for additional information or details of participating in food, fun, and fellowship of a friendly gathering.

And next time you're at the Post, check out the photos, pictures, and plaques that depict what the many members of this little island community have contributed, often with their lives, when they answered their country's call to service.







# Fire Department responds to letter

I am writing in response to a letter to the editor that appeared in the March/April issue of Kelleys Life from Ed Kuchar. Everyone should remember that there are always two sides to

When anyone tackles a big project

like restoring the Kelleys Island Mansion they have to realize there will be a large expense.

The EPA has regulations concerning the disposal of ALL materials generated during a remodeling. They do NOT allow burning of all materials. In

most communities no burning of any kind is allowed. The EPA allows us on Kelleys Island, because of our unique situation, to burn yard waste (leaves and branches), and then only during specific months when burning up here

When a person applies for a burn permit, the burn site is inspected by an island Fire Official for size, proper distances away from other properties in the area, and the materials to be burned-safety issues. If everything is alright, the permit is signed. This was not the case in question. There was plastic, vinyl siding, insulation and other non-allowed material in the proposed pile, therefore, the permit was denied. After some discussion with the person conducting the burn and the separation of materials, the permit was issued. If the proper procedures would have been followed, there would have been no further problems.

Kelleys Island has a well-trained, all-volunteer Fire Department. The name calling in the letter to the editor was TOTALLY unnecessary. It's unfortunate for people that volunteer their time and could possibly put their lives in danger to provide for the safety and well being for all those people that live on or come to visit Kelleys Island, to come under attack by some people for having to make decisions that assure

on Kelleys Island.



"An Island of his Own," and "KI- Our Escape from Reality."






tive is simply not so.


I hope you'll all keep reading about our island, our --Kelleys Life. Jacquie Kranyak

# Recollections of Kelleys Eighty Years ago and Thirty Years ago

Recollecting: "Fifty Years Ago"

Handwritten by Iva Riedy Erne [circa 1981?] via Geraldine Betzenheimer.

Thanks for sharing the wonderful memories.

In 1931 President H. Hoover was worried about the depression and stock market crash. Kelleys was still prosperous. Our population was about 1500 and there was plenty of work.

Ernest Fenwick was superintendent of the stone quarry which employed about 150 people. We also had Lay Brothers Fisheries. The "North Side Crew" that had 3 boats at the north dock and the South Side Crew that work from Koster's Dock, they employed about 20 men. Booth and Post Fish Companies also fished from the island. Independent fisheries were Bickley and Beatty and Elfers. Plus gillnetters that only fished in the spring and fall

Another big industry was farming. George Becker had a large dairy farm. His barn is now owned by William Finger. The island also produced many grapes and other fruits. The grapes were picked in baskets and sent to Sandusky, Detroit, and Toledo to be pressed. It was a happy time for the school children as they were let out of school for two weeks to help harvest the crop.

Our electric lines had been put in a couple of years ago but we still hadn't the water lines.

Frank Lange was the mayor of the island. Rev. C. C. Vandersal was the minister at the E. U. B. church and Fr. Jos. Maerder was pastor at St. Michael Catholic church.

We had plenty of stores. Arnold Elfers was in the grocery business. He had a gasoline pump in front of his store. His store is now Frank Pohorence's storage house. Trieschmann Meat Market sold only meats. It is now the Island Market. Across the street which is now Curilla's was Lange and Brown's General Store.

Russell Matso's Bar was owned by his father, Joe. It was an Ice Cream Parlor with the barber shop in back. Joe Matso was our barber. Emmet Martin had an ice cream parlor where Martin's bar is now. The Casino was Charley Martin's pool room. Across from the Casino was a gas station.

Mr. Wm. Burger sold grains and coal and had ice delivery service. He managed the store at the dock where Ron Beatty now has his fish cleaning business.

At this dock the passenger boats also landed.

Neuman's boats, the Mascot and Messenger, hauled freight and cars from after Labor Day to late fall then the spring season to Memorial Day. The Chippewa made two round trips to the islands daily in the summer. It only carried ten cars on a trip so we didn't have many sight seers. Most of the tourists spent weeks or all summer on the island.

In the winter we flew to the mainland with Parker or Hersberger. Hersberger held the contract for carrying the mail. We all flew on the Tin Goose. Mrs. Frank Reinheimer was our post master.

Mr. Charles Downing was superintendent of the school. Helen Marchky taught the 5th to 9th grades. There were 42 pupils in high school, about 50 in grades 1 through 8th. The Catholic school was open at this time with about 60 pupils enrolled.

The graduating class consisted of Catherine Bauman (McManamon), Samuel Bauman, Maurine Brown (Corthell), Jeanette Lange (Novak), Mary Marchky, Eileen Martin, Elizabeth Myers (Perkinson), Paul Perruchon, Iva Riedy (Erne), John Semanition, and Albert Washie.

In those days we had plenty of recreation. Baseball, swimming, and fishing in the summer. Card parties, dances, plays, ice boating, and skating in the winter. The Marina was dug in 1958, Kellstone started in 1964, and Homecoming started in 1976. The population figures: • 1930 - 630

• 1950 - 324 • 1960 - 171 • 1980 - 93 • 1981 - 94 [NOTE: Carol Nelson-Burns apologizes for any errors in the spelling of proper names; her intent was to reflect spellings as best they could be identified from handwriting.]

#### **Island history**

Iva Riedy Erne, Mar. 31, 1981

Many people ask us, "How many people live on the Island in winter?" There are 94 souls that still brave the winter's cold winds and snow. 45 males and 49 females of which 10 are school children and 2 pre-school.

Henry (Henny) and Rosella Beatty are our oldest native Island couple. Henny was a commercial fisherman and then Ranger at the State Park.

Virginia Miller is our oldest female. At the present time she resides at Canterberry Villa in Milan. Her husband, Karl, passed away in 1979. She has three sisters living: Olive Blatt of Sandusky, Meda Brown of Milan, and Ellis Hughes of Kelleys.

John (Jack) Sennish is our oldest Island man. He and his wife Esther live on Titus Road. Their home is surrounded by a lovely big lawn and well kept garden. Jack takes the mail to and from the airport to post office every week day.

This past year we were blest with three CETA workers, who with our two village men have done a marvelous job of painting the town hall, putting a roof on the jail house, plowing snow and cleaning brush along the main roads. Where they cleaned brush we noticed a wire fence on Monaghan Road. It was the fence that enclosed Trieschmann's pasture. That started us reminiscing of the old days.

Henry Trieschmann and then his son, Wesley, used the pasture for cattle they butchered and sold in the meat market. Henry Trieschmann passed away in 1924 and then his son, Wes, and daughter Elda, took over the busi-

Fifty or more head of cattle were brought over on the 'Arrow' or 'Chippewa' which docked at the foot of Division Street.

When the boat landed, the dock was cleared of all people and the drive began. Wes hired a crew of young fellows to keep the cows in line.

The cows were chased off the boat, then up Division Street to E. U. B. Church, down Chapel Street, then Woodford Road to the pasture gate. There they were kep[t] until the island needed meat.

The slaughter house was in the woods in the back part of the pasture. Wes would kill five or more cattle at a time. Elda would help cut them up and took care of selling the meat over the counter. Liver was given away.

Wesley passed away a few years ago and Elda lives on Shelby Street in Sandusky.

Trieschmann's Meat Market is now the Island Market owned by Frank and Laura Jean Pohorence.



# **Ask Serving Our Seniors**

Serving Our Seniors is a local, notfor-profit organization funded by the Erie County Senior Services Tax Levy. Serving Our Seniors is a geriatric social service agency that provides a variety of help to Erie County residents age 60 and better. The organization's purpose is to assist older people in maintaining their independent

Q: I have a Medicare Advantage Plan that I am unhappy with. I am told I have to keep it until the "Medicare Open Enrollment". When is that and what does it mean?

A: Open enrollment means it is a time of the year that "shop" for and switch to another Medicare Advantage Plan, if you have determined that it is in your best interest to do so. The open enrollment period to select a new Medicare Advantage Plan is October 15, 2011 through December 7th, 2011. Your new Medicare Advantage Plan would go into effect on January 1, 2012

Q: I have a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan that I am unhappy with. I selected the plan I am on when I was taking no medications, because it cost me the least amount of money. Yesterday, my doctor put me on 2 expensive medications and my Part D does not cover either one of them. Can I switch to a different Medicare Part D Plan? Will they make an exception for the fact that I am taking prescription drugs, now - and before I wasn't?

A: Unfortunately the answer is NO. You will have to stay with the coverage vou have until Dec. 31st, 2011. However, you have the opportunity to shop for a better Part D plan that will cover the medications you

are taking. The "Open Enrollment Period" is October 15thm 2011 through December 7th, 2011. This is the time to compare and contrast all of the different prescription drug plans that will be offering coverage in 2012. But remember, just because you selected a new Part D plan in October, your new prescription coverage does not go into effect until January 1, 2012.

Q: I have 6 months of unexpired unopened ZETIA. I took it for my high cholesterol and my doctor has switched me to something else. Can Serving Our Seniors give it to someone who needs it, but can't afford it?

A: No -- at least not yet. The Director of Serving Our Seniors, Sue Daugherty and the Affordable Medications Coordinator, Elmlinger, RN will be meeting with Ohio Senator Mark Wagoner, Ohio Representative Dennis Murray, a staff aid from US Congresswoman Marcy Kaptur's office and a staff aid from US Senator Sherrod Brown's office on May 23rd to discuss this matter to find a better solution to offers like yours.

Today, the only thing you can do is throw it in the trash. However, there is a recommended procedure for how to dispose of medications. This is how it works: Crush the pills into a powder (if it's a capsule - pull apart each capsule and empty it). Mix the powdered medications will used coffee grounds or kitty litter. Pour this into a container with a lid and throw it into the trash.

If you have unexpired medications that are unexpired, sealed (and evident that they have not been tampered with) we would like to hear from you.

Please send us the following infor-

\*The name of the drug you would like to donate

\*The dose of the medications you would like to donate

\*The quantity of the medication (the # of pills) you would like to donate --if the law allowed you to do so. We would also like to stay in touch with you on this matter -- if you are agreeable -- so please include your name and phone number and send this list of information to Serving Our Seniors, 310 E. Boalt Street, Sandusky. Or e-mail the information to mail@servingourseniors.org

Q: I am going to have knee surgery and won't be able to drive myself to the appointment or home again to Kelleys Island. Can someone at Serving Our Seniors help me with

A: If you are age 60+ and live in Erie County, yes we can help you. We can arrange for a volunteer driver to come the K I Ferry service dock and meet you there. He/she can also drive you back home. Seeing as your Knee surgery will prevent you from sitting comfortably on the ferry to return home, the driver and drive you to your home. HOWEVER, the driver is simply a driver. He is prohibited from assisting you up stairs and into your home. There will need to be caregivers or medics that can assist you from this point forward. Call our office for more information at 419-624-1856.

O: I heard there is a speaker coming to the Senior Lunch Group who is going to discuss "It's Not Always Alzheimer's Disease". When is this discussion going to take place? And where?

A: Serving Our Seniors is working with Dot Simonds to coordinate this. It will take place May 26th 1pm -2pm. If the lunch group is meeting on that day we intend to have this discussion immediately after lunch at the restaurant. The speaker is great! Very enjoyable and interesting. She is the Director of Programs at the Alzheimer's Association of NW Ohio. Please call Serving Our Seniors at 419-624-1856 if this topic is of interest to you. 





# Know what's below: call before you dig

Whether it's a dreamed up deck addition or a landscaping masterpiece, summer weather is a great time for outdoor improvement plans to actually play out.

But if your planned projects include digging, like planting a tree or bringing in a backhoe for trench work, you'll have to wait a few more days so the job can be done safely. Underground utilities, such as buried gas, water, and electric lines, can be a shovel thrust away from turning a summer project into a disaster.

To find out where utility lines run on your property, dial 811 from anywhere in the country a few days prior to digging. Your call will be routed to a local "one call" center. Tell the operator where you're planning to dig and what type of work you will be doing, and affected local utilities will be noti-

In a few days, a locator will arrive to designate the approximate location of any underground lines, pipes, and cables with flags or marking paint so you'll know what's below. Then the safe digging can begin.

Although many homeowners tack-

ling do-it-yourself digging projects are aware of "Call Before You Dig" services, the majority don't take advantage of the service. A national survey showed that only 33 percent of homeowners called to have their lines marked before starting digging projects, according to the Common Ground Alliance, a federally mandated group of underground utility and damage prevention industry professionals.

Although light gardening typically doesn't call for deep digging, other seemingly simple tasks like planting shrubs or installing a new mailbox post can damage utility lines. A severed line can disrupt service to an entire neighborhood, harm diggers, and potentially result in fines and repair costs.

Never assume the location or depth of underground utility lines. There's no need: the 811 service is free, prevents the inconvenience of having utilities interrupted, and can help you avoid serious injury.

# How to care for your septic tank and septic system

**Septic System Ongoing Maintenance** 

On Kelleys Island, taking care of your septic system is of major importance. We have a mix of older and newer systems here and below are some common sense guidelines to remember.

Divert rainwater from the septic drain-

A soggy drainfield won't absorb and neutralize liquid waste. Plan landscaping, roof gutters and foundation drains so that excess water is diverted away from the septic drainfield.

Don't overload the septic tank and drainfield

Check faucets and toilets for leaks; make repairs if necessary. Use aerators on faucets and flow reducer nozzles on showers to help lower water consump-

Reduce water levels for small loads of laundry.

Wait until the dishwasher is full to

Use a displacer to reduce the

amount of water needed to flush the toilet, or install low-flow toilets. Keep trees away from the septic system

Discourage root damage by keeping trees at least 100 feet away from the

> septic system. Trees with very aggressive roots, such as willows, should be even farther away from the system.

> The toilet isn't a garbage disposal

Never flush cat litter, disposdiapers, sanitary napkins, tampons, towels, paper facial tissues, coffee grounds, or cigarette butts and filters. They'll clog your septic tank in less time than you might imagUse garbage disposals wisely

A garbage disposal can double the amount of solids added to a septic tank. Choose a top-line disposal that grinds food into tiny particles that are easier for a system to digest.

Do not pour grease down the drain

Grease can clog the septic drainfield, making it impossible for soil to absorb liquids. If that happens, you'll need to have a new drainfield.

Avoid hazardous chemicals

Varnish, paint thinners, motor oils, gasoline and other similar chemicals can ruin your system and are a hazard to groundwater. Dispose of them prop-

Protect the system from damage

Do not drive over the drainfield, build a structure on top of it, or cover it with concrete or aspĥalt.

Do plant grass on the drainfield to minimize soil erosion.

Perform regular maintenance

Solids must eventually be pumped from the tank. Many experts advise a family of four with a 1,000 gallon septic tank to have the tank pumped after 3-5 years of full time use. Other experts say you can go much longer between pumping operations.

Never attempt to open a septic tank yourself. Gases and bacteria in it are dangerous.

Laundry Tips to Help Keep Your Septic Tank Healthy

Laundry contributes a great deal of water to the septic system and there are a few tips you should follow to prevent problems:

Don't run laundry wastes directly into the drainfield; it should be run into the septic tank. Soap or detergent scum will plug the soil pores in the drainfield and cause the system to fail.

Normal amounts of detergents and bleaches can be used and won't stop the bacterial action in the septic tank.

Inexpensive detergents may contain excessive amounts of filler or carrier and some of the fillers can be montmorillonite clay that is used to actually seal soils. The best solution is to use a liquid laundry detergent, which seldom have clogging fillers that may harm a septic system.

# Fixed Annuities vs. CDs: Is One Better Than the Other?

For most people, the answer to this question is it depends. While some features are similar, fixed annuities and bank certificates of deposit (CDs) also have characteristics that differ. What works for you may depend on which features best fit your financial situation and investment objectives.

Are you looking for safety?

Both CDs and fixed deferred annuities are generally considered "low-risk" investments compared to other investment options. CDs are sold by banks; fixed annuities are issued by insurance companies. In most instances, CDs are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) for up to \$250,000 per account. Fixed annuities are not insured by the federal government, but are backed by the financial strength of the insurance company that issues the annuity. Of course, annuity guarantees are subject to the claims-paying ability of the issuing company, so when considering a fixed annuity, make sure the issuing company is financially sound. You can get an idea of the financial strength of a company by referring to an independent rating company such as Moody's, A.M. Best, or Standard & Poor's, which evaluate the financial strength of insurance companies and publish ratings based on their assessments.

How long is your investment horizon?

CDs are often used for short-term accumulation. CDs are issued in a variety of maturity periods, from as short as one month to three years or longer. On the other hand, fixed annuities are better suited for long-term accumulation. Most fixed annuities have maturity periods of five years or longer, although some fixed annuities have maturity periods as short as two years. In any case, most CDs and fixed annuities assess a penalty for taking money out of your account prior to the maturity date. Some CDs allow you to withdraw interest as it's earned. However, if you want to withdraw principal, you'll likely be assessed an early withdrawal penalty. Likewise, many fixed annuities allow you to receive earned interest, and some annuities even allow a limited penalty-free withdrawal of up to 10% of the account value annually. But annuity withdrawals exceeding any penalty-free amount will also be subject to a withdrawal or surrender charge. What type of return do you want?

Both CDs and fixed annuities credit interest to your account. The rate of interest is often based, at least in part, on the maturity period of the vehicle: the longer the investment period, the higher the interest rate likely to be offered. CDs generally pay a fixed interest rate for the entire term. The interest rate paid by a fixed annuity may change annually, subject to a minimum interest rate that lasts for the entire term. There are some fixed annuities that pay a fixed rate of interest

for a fixed period of time, usually to maturity. While the interest rates of CDs and fixed annuities with similar maturity periods are often similar, since most fixed annuities have longer maturity periods than CDs, the interest rate offered may be a little higher than a CD with a shorter maturity term. It's also worth noting that fixed annuity companies guarantee a minimum interest rate for the term of the annuity, and sometimes, may guarantee a higher interest rate for a certain period of

Are taxes an issue?

If income taxes are a concern, be aware that the interest you earn on your CD (presuming it's not held within an IRA) is taxable in the year it's earned, even if you don't take the money. Conversely, the interest earned in a fixed annuity is not subject to income tax until you actually take the money out. With a fixed annuity, you have a little more control over when you'll pay taxes on your interest earnings. Also, interest earnings from CDs must be included as income when calculating whether a portion of your Social Security benefits will be subject to income tax. However, interest earned within a fixed deferred annuity (so long as it's not withdrawn) is not included in this calculation.

Withdrawing money at maturity

When your CD matures, you're able to take the principal and any interest earnings out in a lump sum, or you can usually renew the CD for the same or a different term, and often at a different interest rate. You can do the same thing with money from a deferred annuity. You'll be taxed on the interest earnings at that time, and, if you're not at least age 591/2, you may also face a 10% tax penalty on earnings as well, unless an exception applies. However, a deferred annuity provides you with the option to convert your account to a stream of payments that can last for your entire life. Known as annuitization, this gives you the option to receive periodic payments (e.g., monthly, quarterly, or annually) from your annuity for a fixed period of time, such as ten years, or for the rest of your life.

While some features are similar, fixed annuities and bank certificates of deposit (CDs) also have characteristics that differ. Fixed annuities are not FDIC insured, are not issued by a bank or government agency, and are not a deposit.




