





The program agenda includes discussing island public utilities and safety, centers for learning about the arts and history, strategies for island economic development, environmental issues, seasonal worker housing, sustaining community foundations, and more. We look forward to bringing back what we have learned to affect positive change on our island once again! This September, please prepare and plan in the event you must go for three days without electricity, water service, access to a supermarket, or local services for several days. Just follow these four steps:

- 1) Be Informed
- 2) Make a Plan
- 3) Build a Kit

While each person's abilities and needs are unique, every individual can take steps to prepare for all kinds of emergencies. By evaluating your own personal needs and making an emergency plan that fits those needs, you and your loved ones can be better prepared. By evaluating your own personal needs and making an emergency plan, you can be better prepared for any situation. Visit Ready. gov/seniors and consider the following. Learn more about how a disaster might affect your individual needs or the needs of someone you care for.

It's possible that you will not have access to a medical facility or even a drugstore. Plan to make it on your own, at least for a period of time.

Identify what kind of resources you use on a daily basis and what you might



do if they are limited or not available.

Build a Kit with your unique consideration in mind. What do you need to maintain your health, safety and independence?

Create a network of neighbors, relatives, friends, and co-workers to aid you in an emergency. Discuss your needs and make sure everyone knows how to operate necessary equipment. If appropriate, discuss your needs with your employer. Seniors should keep specialized items ready, including extra wheelchair batteries, oxygen, catheters, medication, food for service animals and any other items you might need. Be sure to make provisions for medications that require refrigeration. Make arrangements for any assistance to get to a shelter.





Kelleys Island Nature Camp 2019

The Nature Camp mission is to encourage children's natural curiosity of the outdoors by engaging them in fun and educational activities. Nature Camp seems like a bubble, an intentionally built community, and there are usually many in the community who love and care about the magic that is the nature camp experience. It takes a village and begins with the community leaders, camp alumni, colleagues, and supporters who make camp possible and provide a great experience each year.

The Kelleys Island Nature Camp was on July 29-August 1, 2019. The theme this year was "Scales & Slime" (Reptiles and Amphibians). We enjoyed searching for snakes, turtles, salamanders, frogs, and toads. We visited aquatic habitats in search of our amphibian friends, as well as sunny spots where reptiles may be found. We met the resident reptiles and amphibians that call OSU's Stone Laboratory and Erie Metro Parks home to learn about their unique adaptations that enable them to survive. Rangers from Perry's Monument came over for a fun day, with hands on experiences to learn more about the frogs who live on the islands and their important habitats.

Environmental Adventure Camp I. (9-10 years old) also experienced an afternoon to Kayak. We paddled around the beach, played games, went for a nice swim, and we ended the day with a much-deserved ice cream treat. Our campout was a nice cool night, we cooked hotdogs, went swimming, had a fire at the State Park's Stone Building, cooked s'mores, and took an evening sunset hike to the beach at the Shellee Nature Preserve.

This year we started the Nature Camp Counselor Program. This is a curriculum-based project geared toward youth 15 and older. This program offered our counselors a one-ofa-kind opportunity to become involved with the education and conservation efforts of the Lake Erie Islands. Counselors experienced all components of the Nature Camp Program, from learning about the island's wildlife, presenting educational programs, working with wild animals, creating displays, and so much more. Counselors are a large asset to the camp program! There is no way we could have as much success without this team of wonderful help and support!

The 2019 counselors were, Jackie Taylor, Tyler McClain, Aerin Doughty, Emily Beal, and much support and help from Chris Ashley and his crew. We could not put camp together without all their great ideas!
