You can make recycling a way of life!

Recycling is a great way to save money and make a positive environmental impact. Erie County has thirteen recycling centers, a list of which is posted at the Village of Kelleys Island posting places.

The following items are accepted at the Erie County Recycling Centers:

Glass: jars and bottles only, all colors.

Cans: Aluminum, steel & bi-metal cans from food & beverages, empty dry paint cans, empty aerosol cans.

Plastic: Beverage & laundry product bottles marked with a #1 or #2 on the bottom.

Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, office paper, junk mail & paperboard boxes.

Cardboard: Clean corrugated, without wax coating or foil.

Keep it clean, remove lids & discard, bag cans, glass and plastics together, separate paper types.

Aluminum cans are collected at the Village of Kelleys Island Transfer Station for recycling.

After a long winter and still in self quarantine, the KILA board met in April. But, rather than the in person, face to face meeting at Estes school, we met via Google Hangouts. And, by all accounts, from computer savvy "geeks" to Luddites, we had a pretty successful meeting.

Of course, the big issue is the covid-19 virus and how it affects our daily life both on and off Kelleys Island. We'll just have to follow our national, state, and local leaders for the level of activities on Kelleys Island.

Scheduled activities on KI are in flux. Local businesses; restaurants & bars, merchants, rental properties, fishing, and all services are severely impacted. Many events are either "on hold" or already postponed/cancelled. KILA's Welcome back Potluck scheduled for May 18th has been postponed. These cards offered discounts to members from several merchants. Because of the business impact of the virus, KILA has not asked these merchants to offer discounts this year. We do encourage everyone to support our local businesses.

Each year, KILA holds a raffle which concludes at Homecoming. We still plan to have a raffle to help support projects to improve and enhance Kelleys Island. KILA will be purchasing gift cards or certificates from KI business to use as prizes for the raffle. So, participating in the raffle by buying tickets will help both KI business and the island in general.

As an island focused project, KILA will be giving washable



cotton masks to KI property owners. We expect to distribute these masks by the end of May. Details of distribution are not finalized at this time, but we expect to give each property owner household



two masks. You do not have to be a KILA member. These are compliments of KILA to promote safe social distancing.



Kelleys Island Park Board Bulletin

The Kelleys Island Park Board is ready to begin another busy summer season, improving our parks and preserves, with projects to enhance the enjoyment of residents and visitors. Monday, May 22 is the first meeting at 5:00 pm at the Village Pavilion. The meetings are open to the public. Ideas and suggestions for Park Board projects are appreciated.

The year 2019 was very busy with numerous projects completed and others begun. Included are improvement to the drainage at the ball field (Dave Marco and Bob Simonson); addition of new picnic table base, picnic table and two park bench bases (Kelleys Island Community Chest, Dave Marco and the military camp kids); re-striping the tennis court for three games, basketball, tennis and pickle-ball; upgrading the electrical system at the Village Pavilion with 250 amp service and all new GFI receptacles; Curilla Preserve trail cut and main entrance sign installed; main entrance sign installed at Huntley-Beatty Preserve; Quinn Preserve trail cut (Chris Ashley, Tom Bartlett and Mike Mielke); privately owned stone stored in Curilla Preserve removed.

On-going projects include the Master Plan for the Pavilion park and pollinator garden areas in Memorial Park and Pavilion Park. More new

projects will be presented this season.

The three Preserves, donated to the Village of Kelleys Island by the Western Reserve Land Conservancy (WRLC), are under a conservation easement of the Cleveland Museum of Natural History and the WRLC. Both agencies make annual inspections of the Preserves and assist in maintaining encroachment from neighboring properties, removing invasive species and assuring that the Kelleys Island Park Board is maintaining the property in accordance with the deeds.

The Park Board's responsibility is to maintain the Preserves and pro-

vide hiking and nature environments that provide wholesome activities for residents and visitors. The Preserves help maintain property values of neighborhoods and the quality life for all to enjoy.


KI Audubon Happenings


I hope everyone reading this is healthy and safe. It looks like we might still be isolated for a little longer. This is the time of year when we normally start to get busy!

"Island Residents *Need to Respond to 2020 Census"*

Good Morning Kelleys Island Leaders: I am a Partnership Specialist with the US Census Bureau, focused on Erie, Ottawa and Sandusky Counties. My role is to encourage participation and to share the selfresponse progress on the 2020 Census. Currently, Erie County's self-response rate is currently 56.6%, but the Village of Kelleys Island's self-response rate is 5.3%. The Put-in-Bay Gazette News article, "Island residents need to respond to 2020 Census," outlines similar challenges (Put-in-Bay- 12.2%).

Leo Goldner



Leo Goldner was born in Toledo Hospital on July 3rd, 1923, son of Herman and Margret Fleichocher Goldner and brother to his beloved sister Josephine (Meyer)

Teitlebaum (deceased).

Leo died on Saturday February 1, 2020 in Aventura, Florida. For many years the Goldner's lived above their family dry goods store called the Chicago Bargain House.

He lived in a Hungarian immigrant neighborhood in East Toledo and learned to speak fluent Hungarian. He was an avid Stamp collector and a yoyo champion. He was the only Jewish Boy in his Elementary and H.S. He learned to defend himself against neighborhood bullies by learning Judo and quickly worked his way up to Black Belt 5th degree status. He had release parochial time in elementary school but instead of taking 2 bus's to go to his synagogue, he agreed at the request of the Monsignor of St. Stephen's Church, to become an altar boy at St. Stephens Church, an interesting choice for a Jewish boy.

There are pictures of Leo hanging in Waite High School and in St. Stephen's Church where he donated the bronze statue of St. Stephen, which still stands there out front today on Genesee Street. He Graduated from Waite High School, as a member of the National Honors Society. After graduating from High School, he attended the University of Toledo to study pre-law, was on the wrestling and tennis team and joined the Lamda Chi fraternity, and tennis. Upon the invasion of Pearl Harbor, he enlisted in the U.S. Army. There, as a lowly private, he was eventually sent to officer's candidate school to become a Lieutenant. Eventually he was assigned to be shipped to Manila in the Philippines where he had many harrowing experiences. In the Army, he served under General George C. Marshall as chief of staff and helped liberate the Philippines under General Douglas MacArthur where he was

injured in hand to hand combat. He had no less than 12 medals and five decorations including the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. He served as director of USO Camp Shows in the Western Pacific after being wounded in battle. He was an expert Magician and Hypnotist.

During the time he was an infantry officer, he used two three day passes to marry, the love of his life, Marian Rachel Baron, to whom he was married for 76 years. Marian always claimed that their secret to a long, happy marriage was easy: separate bathrooms

After being discharged from the Army he worked at the family dry goods store, but really wanted to have a store of his own. In the end, he accepted a job offer from his brotherin-law, Jerry Baron at Baron Steel Company. There he flourished as a salesman, making an unheard of million dollars for the firm, his very first year. Later, he and his brother-inlaw Sidney Baron, started Tyler Steel, in 1953. Two years later, Leo started Parker Steel Company, which today is the number one distributor of metric metals in the nation.

Leo and Marian began their married life in a house on Vermont Street in Toledo. In 1955 they built a home in


Ottawa Hills. He included in the home a Theater room where he could perform magic tricks. The grandchildren remember the room included a free candy machine, a movie screening area, jumbo projection TV, popcorn machine and an ice cream soda fountain with seating for six.

He was past president of the Association of Steel distributors, founding member of Magicians' Ring 68, Toledo, Ohio. He was the longest living member of the International Brotherhood of Magicians (where he was awarded the Order of Merlin), where he joined on his 16th birthday. He and his wife were founding members of the Toledo Chapter of Hillel at the University of Toledo. He of did hundreds Hypnosis demonstration benefiting Waite High School and raised over \$200,000 for scholarships.

For well over 34 years he was State of Israel Bond Chairman for NW Ohio and traveled to Israel over 20 times. He was on the National Board of Myasthenia Gravis Foundation, the Darlington House, (home for the aged) the Elks Club, the Kiwanis, a 32nd degree Mason, the Damascus Lodge, as well as a member of Temple B'nai Israel, Temple Shomer Émunim, Congregation Etz Chayim, and the American Israel Policy Conference. He was also a member of the American Society of Clinical Hypnotists, National Guild of Hypnotists Gold Baton Group at Toledo Symphony Orchestra, President's Council of the Toledo Museum of Art, and the Ohio Governor's Club.

He is listed in Who's Who in America, and is a member of the Jewish Community Center, where he taught Judo for many years. He was an avid boater and fisherman as well as being an expert boat Captain and sea and lake fisherman, known for gourmet cooking, especially Hungarian Turkey.

Leo was President of Parker Steel Company, board member of Temple Shomer Emunim, Couples Club Co-chair, and Chairman of the board of the Footlighters' Club of South Please turn to page 9



1875 - The Telegraph Cable (Part 1) How It Came About

As early as August 1867, a submarine cable was being planned to connect Kelley's Island and Put-in-Bay to Sandusky. However, it wasn't until 1875 that Kelley's Island finally had regular communication with the world with the laying and connection of the much anticipated telegraph cable.

Good planning allowed the cable to accommodate both telegraph and the new telephone technology. The first telegraph messages were exchanged between Sandusky and Kelley's Island. It would take eight years to get any telephone service and several more years before regular telephone service would be available to islanders.

In March 1875, Islanders reported that arrangements were being made to lay a sub-marine cable from the east end of Marblehead and they 'confidently expect to have it laid as early in the spring as the weather will permit.'

The Kelley's Island & Sandusky Cable Co. filed incorporation papers in Columbus in March 1875. The incorporators were Erastus Huntington, Jacob Rush, Addison Kelley, Emeline K. Huntington and Lester Carpenter. With a capital stock of \$10,000, in shares of \$100 each, they organized to lay a cable from Kelley's Island to Marblehead. The company was variously reported as being the Kelley's Island & Sandusky Cable Co., the Kelley's Island & Sandusky Cable Telegraph Co., The Sandusky & Kelleys Island Cable Co., and even the Kelley's Island & Sandusky Telegraph Cable Co. The organizing company held several meetings and by May, telegraph service to the Island was well on its way to becoming a reality. This was due, in great part, to the hard work of Jacob Řush.

May 6 – "It is now a fixed fact that Kelley's Island is to be placed in telegraphic communication with the outside world by means of a cable to Marblehead. Messrs. Jacob Rush and Erastus Huntington have succeeded in raising among our business men the balance of the amount required to put the cable in working operation. The land line on the Island will be run from Erastus Huntington's store to Addison Kelley's Point [the corner of Addison St and E. Lakeshore near Addison Kelley's house]. The cable will be laid from the latter place direct to Marblehead light house, a distance of 3³/₄ miles. The land line on the Marblehead side will be run from there by way of the bay bridge. [The new railroad bridge that crossed Sandusky Bay.]



The telegraph would be located in Huntington's Store (The Store on the Corner or more commonly known as The Lodge), which was also the Post Office (the small building on the left).

A meeting of the stockholders of the company was held at the Island House, Kelley's Island, on Tuesday at which time the following officers were elected: President and Manager-Jacob Rush; Vice President-Norman Kelley; Secretary and Treasurer-Erastus Huntington; Directors-Jacob Rush, Erastus Huntington, Mrs. E. K. Huntington, Lester Carpenter and Norman Kelley.

Mr. Rush was in the city on Wednesday en-route to Cleveland to complete the negotiations for laying the cable, which, it is expected, will be in operation by the 20th. Too great credit cannot be given to Messrs. Rush and Huntington for the enterprise and energy which they have evinced in pushing this matter forward. They have labored assiduously to get the cable, and now have the gratification of seeing their hopes realized for the speedy establishment of telegraphic communication with the main land and points beyond.



The stockholders met at the Island House.

The management of the cable, as will be seen by the list of officers above, is in the hands of those who will spare no endeavor to make it a success and conduct it for the best interests of the stockholders and in a manner eminently satisfactory to the public. We sincerely hope that the company will meet with that success which it so well merits...


Mr. Rush was appointed a committee of one to go East immediately and contract for the cable, and make all the necessary arrangements for laying and putting the line in operation as soon as possible. We confidently expect to send our first greeting by telegraph to you by the 20th of May 1875. This company was organized with a Rush, we intend to put it operation with a Rush, and do business with a Rush after we get it ready for use. EKH"

The May date came and went, but by June 16, hopes were still high for the project. "The Kelley's Island & Sandusky Cable Telegraph Co. have been ready for several days to lay their cable from the Island to Marblehead, but have been obliged to wait for the main line connections to be established. The laying of the cable will probably be commenced next Saturday."

A little behind schedule, on June 19 "to-day the sub-marine telegraph cable will be laid between Kelley's Island and Marblehead. The steamer Gazelle will leave her dock at the foot of Columbus Avenue at half-past 9 o'clock, sharp, this morning. She will proceed directly from here to Put-in-Bay, touching as usual at Kelley's Island. After landing her regular Put-in-Bay passengers at Put-in-Bay Island, the steamer will return to Kelley's Island, take onboard excursionists and at once begin the laying of the cable. When the boat touches at Kelley's Island, those who desire to do so, may get off there and remain two hours while the steamer is going to and returning from Put-in-Bay, or the excursionists may remain on board during the entire trip if they choose. As the steamer will return to this port in time to leave on her regular trip from here in the evening, the people who reside on the Islands can participate in the excursion and return home this evening.

The laying of the cable will be a novel and interesting sight and will no doubt be witnessed by a very large number of people. The land line on Kelley's Island will be run from Erastus Huntington's store to Addison Kelley's Point, and the sub-marine cable will be laid from the latter place direct to Marblehead lighthouse, a distance of 3³/₄ miles.
