




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# **Kelleys Island Brew Pub Update**

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


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
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

This means that I will complete my yearly tasks, but I will not be returning to the island to work in 2022. This is a decision at which I did not arrive easily, but it has been in the making for a long time.

When I began working for the KICC in 2018, my only goal was to raise our island's profile in the region and the country, drawing more attention to our events, attractions, business community, and world class natural areas for people to enjoy. I advised and stewarded a new build of KelleysIslandChamber.com, executed a regular and consistent social media strategy, and pitched stories to the media with frequency. I also networked with like organizations on other islands and on the mainland, took an active role in working with Lake Erie Shores & Islands to promote Kelleys by serving on its marketing board, and turned my focus to the bigger picture of what it means to live on islands by serving on the steering committee for the Great Lakes Islands Alliance. Additionally, I ran our Chamber office with care all year round, handling the questions of visitors, callers, and emailers alike with enthusiasm and sometimes even amusement (oh, the stories I could tell!)

However, what I'm most proud of is the impact my work has had on our community. New visitors are falling in love with Kelleys every year, making memories and filling our island with love. Business owners are thriving as they embrace increased foot traffic. More people than ever know what glacial grooves are, have been to the sculpture gardens, and have experienced our history museum. The tax revenue generated from this will go back to the community to improve our local infrastructure. I'm honored to have been a dutiful cog in the machine that makes this place work.

I'm deeply grateful for all the opportunities working with the KICC has afforded me. I have made many wonderful new friends and found thoughtful colleagues. Serving our members and working with the board and staff has been extremely rewarding and special; something I don't take for granted and will cherish forever.

Our board will continue our good work and recruit new staff to manage and run the operations of the Chamber.

A celebration of life ceremony will be held on Kelleys Island at a later time. Memorial contributions are requested to St. Jude School or the Kelley's Island EMT's.



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





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# **Zion Matters**



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# Kelleys Island EMS Levy on November Ballot

On November 2, there will be an EMS levy on the Kelleys Island ballot. This tax levy is for general EMS operating expenses and consists of two parts:

a) the first part is a 0.87 mill renewal that WILL NOT increase your real estate taxes.

b) the second part is a 0.70 mill increase that will provide an additional \$60,000 of annual revenue for EMS.

According to Zillow, the average KI home value is \$283,000. For this home, the annual tax increase would be about \$70.00 or about \$1.35 per week.

Kelleys Island EMS has recently established a partnership with Cleveland MetroHealth. As a result, services are provided to the Island community that were not previously available such as telehealth Doc2Go and there is no required annual membership fee for the Cleveland MetroHealth emergency helicopter services. In just the first 8 months of our relationship with MetroHealth, the Kelleys Island EMS:

Received state-of-the-art medical supplies and equipment that get replenished by Cleveland Metro Health on an as needed basis at no cost to the Island.

Implemented a new and improved electronic patient care records system (ePCR). This allows for better documentation, population of data and quality/performance improvement for EMS incidents. This data is then reviewed by our medical director and team.

When EMS patients are flown off the Island by Cleveland Metro Health, and if medically and operationally capable, they are taken to the hospital of their choice. This allows for better care and continuity of your medical records and provides outstanding service to the community of Kelleys Island.

Conducted an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) Course on the Island for 10 resident Islanders.

Currently have our largest and most engaged group of public service professionals in Kelleys Island EMS history thru active recruitment and training.

Updated the Kelley's Island EMS

Updated the Kelley's Island EMS station with improved medical equipment for in station treatment.

Began a collaboration with the Kelleys Island Fire Department. This is due largely in part to two factors: 1) The full-time EMS Director

1) The full-time EMS Director Russell Maust is now on both the Fire and EMS Departments.

2) There is now continuous communication between both departments along with joint trainings and fund raisers, resulting in improved service delivery.

A better, leaner, safer, and more effective emergency medical system now exists. As a result, the EMS Director, Metro Health EMS Coordinator, and Medical Director are available 24/7 allowing us to properly triage calls, provide treatment on scene via telehealth. In some cases, this will allow treatment to occur on the Island, thus preventing patients from being transported off the Island and accruing unnecessary medical expenses.

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
