### PARSONAGE UPDATE

You probably noticed last year, that we had heat, air conditioning and lights in the parsonage.

The resale shop is self-supporting and income from the shop is being used to make improvements to the house. The hole in the floor by the sink (over the cistern) has been covered. We ran new electrical service to the house and installed several new (and finally safe) outlets, which allowed us to install some window air conditioners. New LED light fixtures were also installed, which will pull less current which makes them safer. Our thanks to Jean Kuyoth for donating some much needed shelving which should help organize us a bit more. We have lots of ideas on how to improve the house and make it more comfortable for our volunteers. What have we got



planned? The list includes repairs, new windows, the front walk, additional new wiring and outlets, some plaster work, maybe new floor covering in the kitchen, a real sign in the yard as well as a few more items as the list grows. We hear there will be a big sale to clear out some of the backlog of items.

### NEWS FROM THE PAST

March 1877 – Lodge items: "Persons who borrow the water pail to water horses with, will please empty out all the horses leave before bringing the pail back, as some of the loafers object to drinking after a horse and some horses object to drinking after a lodger. It is just as easy to please the beast as not and not get Mr. Bergh after you."

March 1877 – "St. Patrick's Day came in with a ruin. The piercing blast from the North must have forced the mercury down among the small figures. As far as the eye can reach toward any point of the compass, snow or ice and sometimes both obstruct the vision. The fact is, March has marched in upon us so far in a way that means business. We have seen all of the Lyon and think it nearly time the Lamb was coming along. A year ago today the wind was strong from the West and North with frequent snow squalls."

# A GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION

This was such a surprise - we received a Proclamation from the Governor's office recognizing the Kelleys Island Historical Assoc.'s 38th anniversary. It notes our efforts in preserving both Kelleys Island and Ohio history. Leslie accepted the proclamation on behalf of the Assoc. as Datus and Irad Kelley look over her shoulder. They would be so proud of our efforts!





### THE CHURCH FLOOR

This was a long haul project. Pieces parts were delivered early in the summer, but due to a series of oddly missed emails, work did not start until November. Once the problems were resolved, work progressed quickly. But, as you all know, nothing ever goes smoothly on Kelleys Island. As removal of the old, spongy flooring commenced, we made a couple of interesting discoveries.

1 - The underlying support joists were crumbling like dust due to powderpost beetles. Really, the wood just crumbled in your hands.

Basically, the floor was held up by the top floor boards.

2 – The altar area was not original to the church! It was obvious from the pieced together supports that the raised dais was added sometime later. To preserve the original church look and feel, the Board decided to go back to the flat floor, which was a good move since the step up was quite the trip hazard.

We want to thank the Mylander Foundation for

helping get these repairs accomplished. They provided \$2,054 (22%) grant towards this work. More photos can be found on our website.

## DISCOVERING LOST THREADS



We were excited when representatives from the Sandusky Library and the Follett House Museum stopped by our little museum. They were impressed with the quality and variety of our displays and offered us access to their extensive photo collection. They also noted that, compared to other small museums, our storage of artifacts in was really well done.

Jeremy Angstadt, who does those popular cemetery walks in Sandusky, asked about two names on the Veterans Memorial in the downtown park. He could not locate either of them in Oakland Cemetery or V. A. cemetery in Sandusky, or the Island cemetery. Both men, Max A. Schnittker (died 10-12-18) and Carl F. Fedderson-pictured here (died 11-4-18) were killed in action. After a little research Leslie was able to find their final resting place in Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Departement de la Meuse, Lorraine, France, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery and Memorial

Fran spent summers on Kelleys Island from 1930 to 1943 when she married aWW2 US Air force Pilot, and of course, followed him as he was moved around. She died at age 94 in 2016 at Denver Co.
