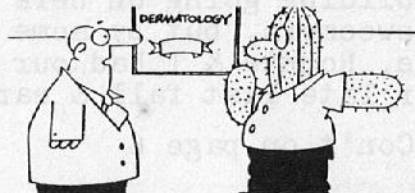

The year 1989 has brought major changes to the campgrounds at Kelleys Island State Park. Our campgrounds have been expanded by 24 sites to a total of 129 & the total area has been doubled to allow for more space at each site. All of the roads were resurfaced & trailer pads were installed. There were two shower houses & one wash house constructed so that the campers no longer leave a ring around the bath tub (Lake Erie). Also, within the shower & wash houses are flush toilets. No longer do the campers have to worry about flies & bees.

The future still holds hope for further improvements. After a few details are worked out, upgrading of the north dock & construction of boat launching ramps appears headed for completion next summer. A large parking lot will be constructed on top of the hill above the north dock & latrine & fish cleaning facilities will be added there. Dockage will still be limited to courtesy docks for launching & loading your boat. There will not be any over night dockage constructed at this time.

Something added this year after several years absence is the naturalist program. This year the naturalist is at Kelleys Island on Saturday & Sunday. The programs range from tours of the glacial grooves to hikes to movies to camp fires. Everyone is welcome, so check at the office for the times of the programs you are interested in & join the fun.

Currents.....

Rinse strawberries under cold, running water. Do not immerse them in water or they will drink it & be quite tasteless. (Some rinse strawberries in sweet wine). Don't remove stems until you are ready to serve them, the juice spills from them & they soften disagreeably.

I didn't know that! Probably everyone & his or her uncle did!

Easy Fruit Dip

- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 7 oz. jar marshmallow cream
- Few drops red food coloring
- Mix well.
- It's delicious!

Tasty Pop

Prepare frozen juice concentrate as directed; fill glass half full & mix with club soda for nutritious soda pop.

The flavors from garlic & cloves become stronger when frozen.

1. Slow down in the summertime. Your body can't do its best when heat and humidity are high.

2. Dress appropriately. Light clothing (in weight and color) reflects heat and sunlight, and helps your body maintain its normal temperature.

3. Eat less, but be sure to eat a balanced diet. The more you eat, the more heat your body produces, and the more water it loses.

4. Drink plenty of liquids to compensate for the fluids lost by perspiration; the more you perspire, of course, the more fluid intake you need. Persons with cardiac or renal disorders should follow their physicians' advice about fluid intake. Consider six or eight glasses of water a day minimal.

5. Schedule participation in active sports during morning or evening hours, when temperatures are likely to be lowest.

6. Check the weather. Don't be lulled into a false sense of security by an overcast day. Heat and humidity are enough to cause hot weather emergencies.

7. Don't get too much sun. Sunburn makes the job of heat dissipation more difficult. Start with gradual exposure—ten to 15 minutes a day is enough.

8. Take a breather. At the first sign that the heat is getting to you, relax in a cool spot. Allow ten minutes of rest for every hour of hot weather activity.

9. Think prevention. Your body will protect you against the damaging effects of heat and humidity, but only up to a point.

10. If you do have the symptoms of any hot weather emergency (cramps, extreme fatigue, headache, dizziness, nausea, or vomiting), get medical attention as soon as possible. ■

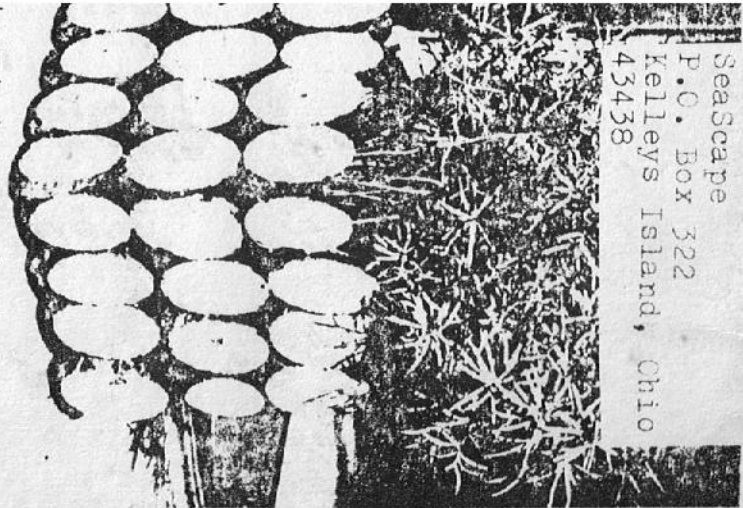
