Good Taste Plus Good Looking Gardens



Your garden can look as good as it tastes. Some vegetables are earning a place in flower gardens. Ornamental pepper plants, specially bred to be compact & bear yellow, orange, red & purple upright pods so they can look very colorful if used as an edging.

If you got a late start planting & have some blank spaces left, look for ornamental cabbage seedlings & ruffled kales. They are zoned with white, pink, purple & blue foilage, are good for an autumn show & are great in flower arrangements. (Don't forget to watch out for & dispose of cabbage looper caterpillars or they will deform the showy heads).

Take caution when you do mix ornamentals & edibles in so far as being careful if you spray herbicides, fungicides or pesticides. Those labeled for flowers are not safe for eating.

You don't need to panic & start spraying chemicals around if you see a bug. Plants can tolerate a few pests without serious damage.

If you need to use an insecticide, look for non-toxics like insecticidal soaps or natural pyrethrin-based insecticides. These products control pests without posing a threat to people, pets or the environment.

Also attracting birds to come around helps reduce insect population.

Simple remedy for slugs: Sink a shallow dish to its rim in the garden & fill it with beer. They will be attracted to it, fall in & drown overnight.

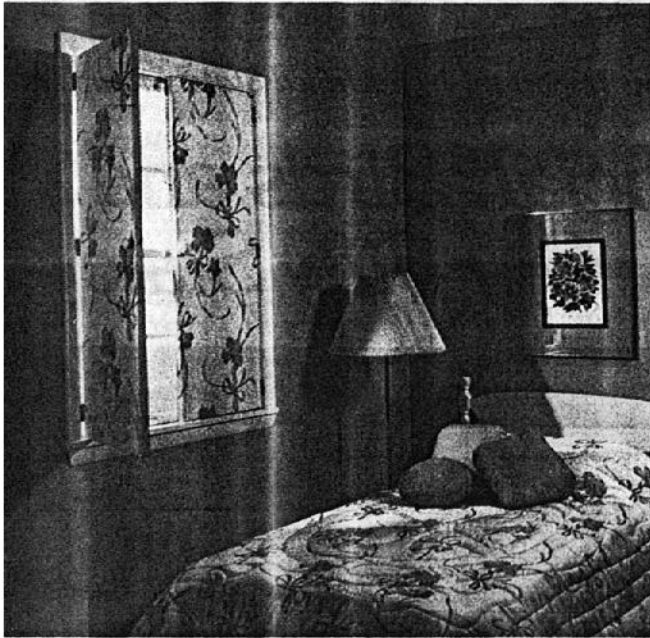

• Fabric-Faced Shutters •



You can fit these shutters into any room or decorating scheme by simply covering them with a complementary fabric.

For this young lady's bedroom, we covered the shutters with a printed sheet that matches the comforter on the bed.

You can build your shutters to open at the center as shown here, or fold to the side like a bifold door. The shutter kit is available in a number of sizes. Order the one that comes closest to matching the inside measurements of your windows and cut it down to size. When properly installed over one layer of fixed glazing, the shutters have an R-factor of about 5.

The kit contains four foil-faced panels and eight 1x2 pieces of wood which form the framework for the shutters. Since the shutters fit inside the window frame from jamb to jamb, you'll have to measure your windows carefully and make adjustments if the windows aren't perfectly square. Cut all the panels (two front panels and two back panels) to size, deducting $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from both the length and width measurements for the two back panels.

Make the frame for the

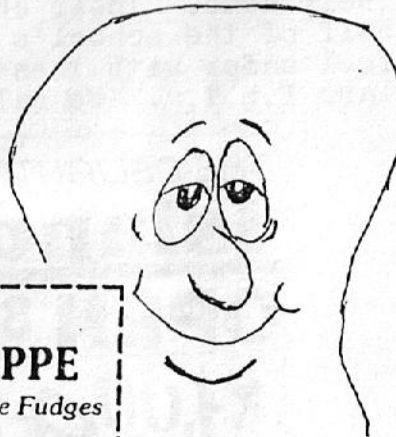
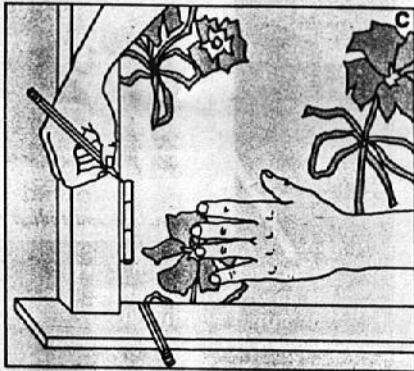
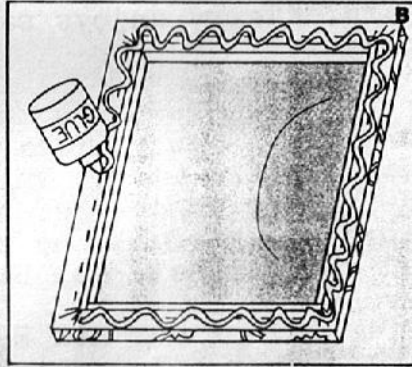
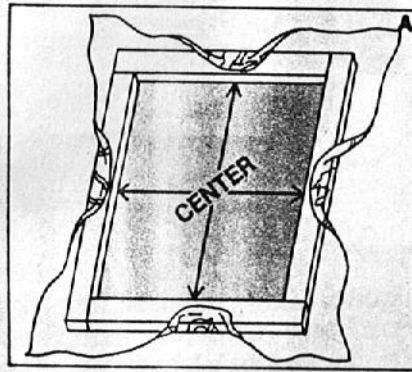
shutters from the 1x2s included in the kit. Butt-joint the corners of the frame, stapling and gluing the wood in place. The outside edge of the frame should be the same size as the front panel (which faces the room). Run a bead of glue along the wood frame. Place the panel, white side up, on the frame, making sure the panel is flush all around. Staple it in place for extra rigidity. Then wrap adhesive-backed weather stripping around the outside of the frame, placing the weather stripping as close as possible to the edge of the frame next to the glass.

Cut two pieces of fabric to cover the shutters, adding four inches to both the length and width measurements so you can wrap the fabric onto the back panels. Iron the material and stretch it over each panel, stapling the center of the top edge first (*illustration A*). Staple the center point of the rest of

the sides, and then finish stapling all around. At the corners, fold the edges of the fabric neatly to the back of the panel or finish with hospital corners.

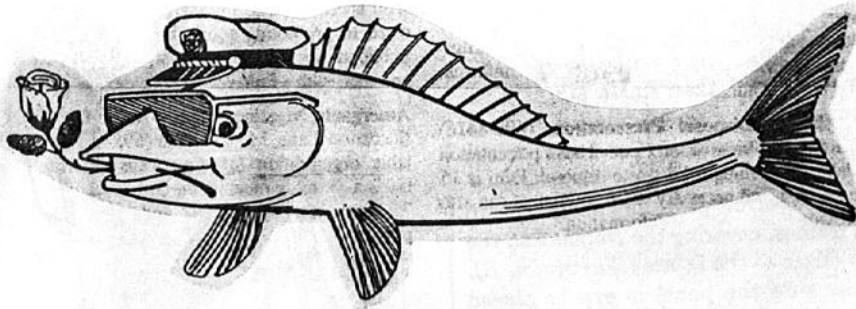
Now glue the back panels to the frames, covering the staples and the raw edges of the fabric (*illustration B*). Make sure the panel is evenly placed around the edges; then nail it securely, using the white nails included in the kit.

Place the shutters in the window frame, and measure and mark locations for the hinges on the window casing (*illustration C*). Attach hinges to the shutter and window frame. (You'll also need to hinge the two shutter panels together if you're making bifold shutters.) Add knobs about midway between the top and bottom of the panels. If you like, you can finish the fabric covering with a water-repellent aerosol spray to minimize spotting and staining.

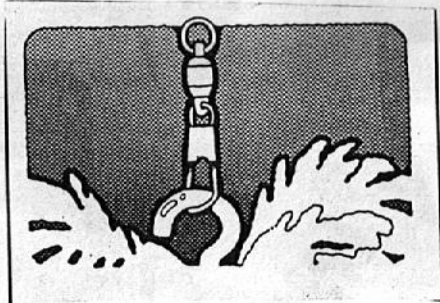

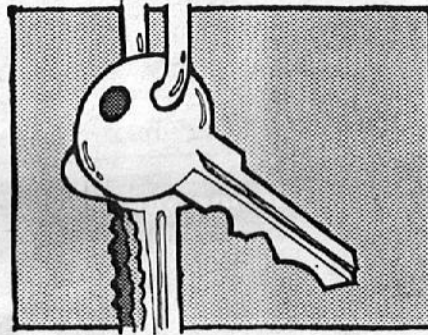
Sometimes left-over latex paint skins over & the can rusts around the rim. Pour it into a clean plastic milk jug. The cap keeps oxygen out, so the paint doesn't skin & there's no rust.

A ball-bearing fishing swivel tied between the support cord & your hanging pot, will allow you to rotate the plant easily. These swivels are rated by their load capabilities & come in various sizes.



If you're working on chrome-plated parts that scratch when gripped by pliers, cut off two fingertips from an old leather glove. Slip these protective "sleeves" onto the pliers when needed.

Getting into your own house at night involves fumbling through keys in the dark. So drill a second hole in the house key (this time at the side) & thread the key ring through the new hole. Next time, hold the ring vertically & the key will sort itself from the others.



If your steel framing square has gotten rusty & hard to read, sandpaper the surface rust & clean out the grooves with wire brush. Then wipe on & immediately wipe off some white paint. Paint remains in recesses & makes nos. & lines stand out.

Does Your PFD Hold Water?

When safety organizations began keeping recreational boating statistics more than 50 years ago, they found that 4 out of 5 people who died in boating mishaps were not wearing Personal Flotation Devices (PFD). This year, the National Safety Council estimates that 1,200 people will drown in boating-related accidents. Of these, 960 will not be wearing PFDs.

Life jackets or PFDs are required for each person aboard a boat 16 ft. or longer. Boaters face several problems in choosing PFDs. One is that they do not match the PFD with their boating activities, & another is that even if they do read the fine print & choose the correct PFD, they don't wear it.

TYPE I - OFFSHORE LIFE JACKET

This jacket is designed for open, rough water where rescue may be slow. In bright, distress orange, the jacket has reflective patches both front & back, has ties at the throat & waist & a snap buckle in the middle with an adjustable D-ring. It is designed to look & fasten the same way even if it is donned inside out.

TYPE II - NEARSHORE BOUYANT VEST

This is the familiar orange vest, filled with either kapok or foam, & covered in either cotton-blend cloth or nylon. The vest is designed for calm, inland water & where there is a good chance of fast rescue. Some effort would be necessary to keep the face totally clear of the water & this PFD may ride up causing a choking sensation.

TYPE III - FLOATION AID

This PFD is a ski-type vest & comes in a lot of colors & styles. It's good for calm waters where there is a chance of a fast res-

cue. This is the most comfortable one as it gives freedom of movement. Available in dark colors which is not a good choice as high visibility is what is essential in a PFD. The worst feature of almost all the type IIIs is that they fail to turn one over into a face-up position.

TYPE IV - THROWABLE DEVICE

These are the familiar cushions, life rings & horseshoes that can be thrown to someone who has fallen overboard. The correct way to wear a cushion is to put a leg through one loop, then a diagonally opposite arm. Never hook your arms through the loops with the cushion on your back. If you become unconscious, you will float facedown.

Before you buy PFDs, try them on in the store for fit & comfort. Once purchased, test them as soon as possible in the water. Put the PFD over the type of clothing you usually wear when boating & jump into the water. If you get that sinking feeling, return it to the store & start over. Make sure PFDs are accessible when boating. Don't use your PFD as a boat fender, kneeling pad or cushion. And before storing your Personal Flotation Devices, make sure they are dry & in good condition but do not dry them in front of a radiator or other source of direct heat.
