
In last month's Newsletter, I wrote about new homes we had visited this past fall

the pleasantly cool nights.

Roses have been around for a long time. Scientists have discovered fossil evidence showing that roses existed 30 million years ago!

One theory is to blame the influx of the Zebra Mussels that have coated western Lake Erie's reefs. They are a freshwater mussel that came on the belly of an ocean freighter from Russia. Most fishing guides from this area have quit for the summer or are travelling to deep-water areas off Lorain & Avon Lake.

The biggest worry for the shoreline cities & industries is the ability of these inch long adult zebra mussels to clog water intake

pipes.

Across the lake from Cleveland, near Whatley, Ontario, an automobile that was submerged for 8 months was hauled out of the water this summer. Every part of the car, from the fenders, tires, windshield & seat belts were covered with layers of the mussels.

Cleveland officials are hosting a symposium about this on Dec. 6 at the Convention Center there & worried N.Y. officials are planning a Rochester Conference some time afterwards.

These mussels can attach themselves to the hull of a boat & also survive out of water for a short period of time. One official called the zebra mussell, the most dangerous threat to the fresh water supply in the U.S.





#### Currents.....





1 White Angel Food Cake (buy one on sale & store in freezer)

Cut about 1 inch of the top off with a serrated knife & set aside. Dig out a cavity from remaining cake, leaving about an inch on bottom & both sides. Save these pieces.

1 small box strawberry jello
1 cup hot water (boiling)
1 lb. pk. frozen strawberries (keep frozen)
Cool Whip or favorite whipped topping

Dissolve jello in hot water & mix well.

Add frozen strawberries & stir until they are
loose. Break up the cake taken out of cavity,
into small chunks & add to jello. Let it
thicken somewhat, pack it back into the cavity
of the cake, place top back on & smother all
over with whipped topping. Store in refrigerator to set well.

Cut with serrated knife to serve.

Beer can be used to replace wine or broths in many recipes. It makes the lightest of souffles & crispiest of batters. It is also used for making pancakes & crepes, for steaming sausages & shellfish & as one of the ingredients of a marinade.

Peanut oil reaches the highest temperature of all cooking oils & is the first choice for Chinese cooking & deep fat frying.

To freeze leftover tomatopaste, drop it by tablespoon onto a cookie sheet lined with wax paper. Flash freeze, remove from wax paper, place in plastic bag & return to freezer to use as needed.


