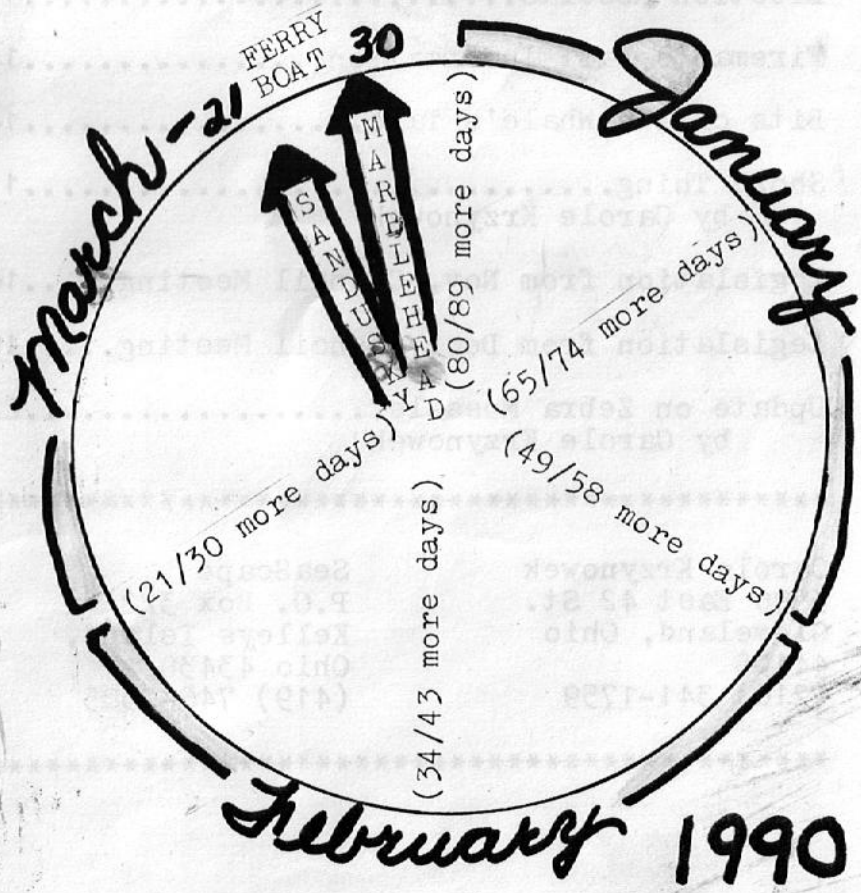

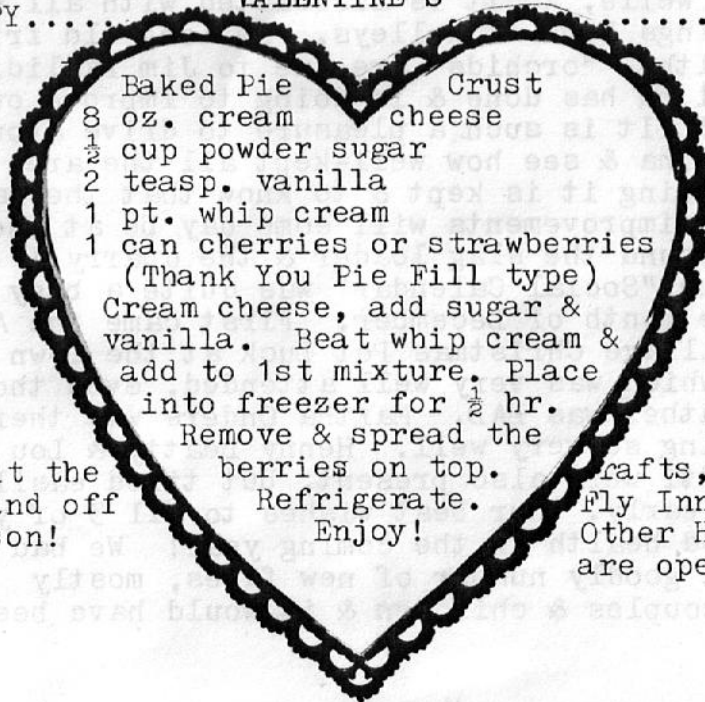

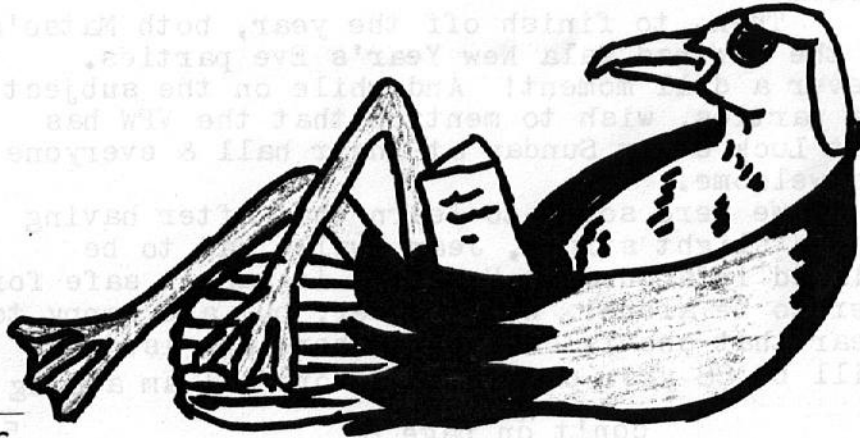
Addison Kelley

Addison Kelley, son of Datus, left Connecticut for Ohio with other members of the Kelley family during the 1830's. He became a clerk in his Uncle Irad's store in Cleveland. When his father & uncle decided to build a schooner for carrying stone & cedar from Cunningham Island, he was to keep accounts & superintend the building process. The vessel, the Ben Franklin was built at Rocky River & launched in June, 1834. It didn't see much service for the island, as it was sold the following spring.

After the schooner was finished, Addison went to Rockport where he stayed until January 1st, 1835. He started for the island, but was unable to get across for two weeks. On the island he lived in a boarding house run by Mrs. Knowlton & went to work helping his father build a steamboat dock. Datus returned to Rockport, leaving Addison in charge as agent for the firm of Datus & Irad Kelley.

In 1835, he built a large log house located on the west side of Division Street about fifteen hundred feet from the south shore of the lake for his father's family. He also kept a store in the house for awhile. Later George Kelley purchased this property.

According to history, Addison Kelley actually purchased the first land sold by his

father & uncle. His deed, dated October 27th, 1836, was for a little over two hundred twenty three acres, valued at one thousand seven hundred & eighty five dollars. His uncle didn't want to sell any of the land & charged what Addison felt was a "high price". This opened the way for others to buy, even though the price got higher for each sale. (Is that the reason for the high price of land on Kelleys Island today?)

Addison was kept busy most of the time building boats. He also built a frame house for himself in the summer of 1837, the year in which he got married. It was the second frame building on the island. It was on the bank of the lake, east of Division Street, overlooking the dock where he worked. Adam Schardt later bought the house which burned to the ground around 1900.

His first child Frederick was born in the house in July, 1838. He was to have five children, all born in the same house. Because of the shifting of the island from one county to another & from one township to another, three of his children were born in Kelleys Island Township, Ottawa County; one on Cunningham Island, Danbury Township, Erie County; & one on Kelleys Island, Kelleys Island Township, Erie County.

In 1840, no longer Cunningham Island, Kelleys Island was established as a Township. When the first election on the island took place in April, 1840, Addison not only served as one of the clerks, he was elected to office as one of three trustees. Altogether, there were fifteen electors registered to vote.

A monument to Addison Kelley still stands on our island, the Kelley Mansion. This was built during the Civil War from 1861 to 1865, a gift that even today we give thanks to his father, Datus. It attracts the attention of almost everyone who visits Kelleys Island.

Legislation from October 12th Council Meeting

Motion to pass 3rd reading of Dan Ahner's Zoning Map Change of the Monarch Wine Co. from R-1 to C-1 failed.

Motion passed for Resolution No. 200 to be declared an emergency & advance same to its 3rd & final reading. (Pertaining to Airport Grant East/West). Also Resolution No.201. Same as preceeding, only Grant North/South.

Committee Reports\*\*\*\*\*

Treasurer - expenditures as \$41,415.98; receipts as \$34,422.17; in general checking acc. as \$282,822.17.

Police Department - 31 complaints, 64 citations, 17 assists to Coast Guard, 27 injuries, 1 accident, 1 Medivac & no serious problems. Chief Moore asked that Council consider approving George Coffman's offer of \$400 for the 1981 Ford police vehicle.

Planning Commision - At Sept. 29 meeting, suggestions for further changes to Zoning Ordinance #303 were made & will come up for public hearing at Nov. Council meeting. A public meeting was to be held Oct. 19 but was never posted.

Landfill - Mayor said we are in the process of finishing the covering of the closed landfill.

Recommended land splits contingent that they present Surveyor's drawing with Seal by Feb. 1: Bill Gorchester's (South Haven Allotment), Frances Kyle's, Tony Discenza's (drawing with seal was presented), Caroline DeBoard (drawing with seal is in compliance).

There is no mention in our Zoning Ordinance #303 regarding subdivision rules & should be enacted in near future.

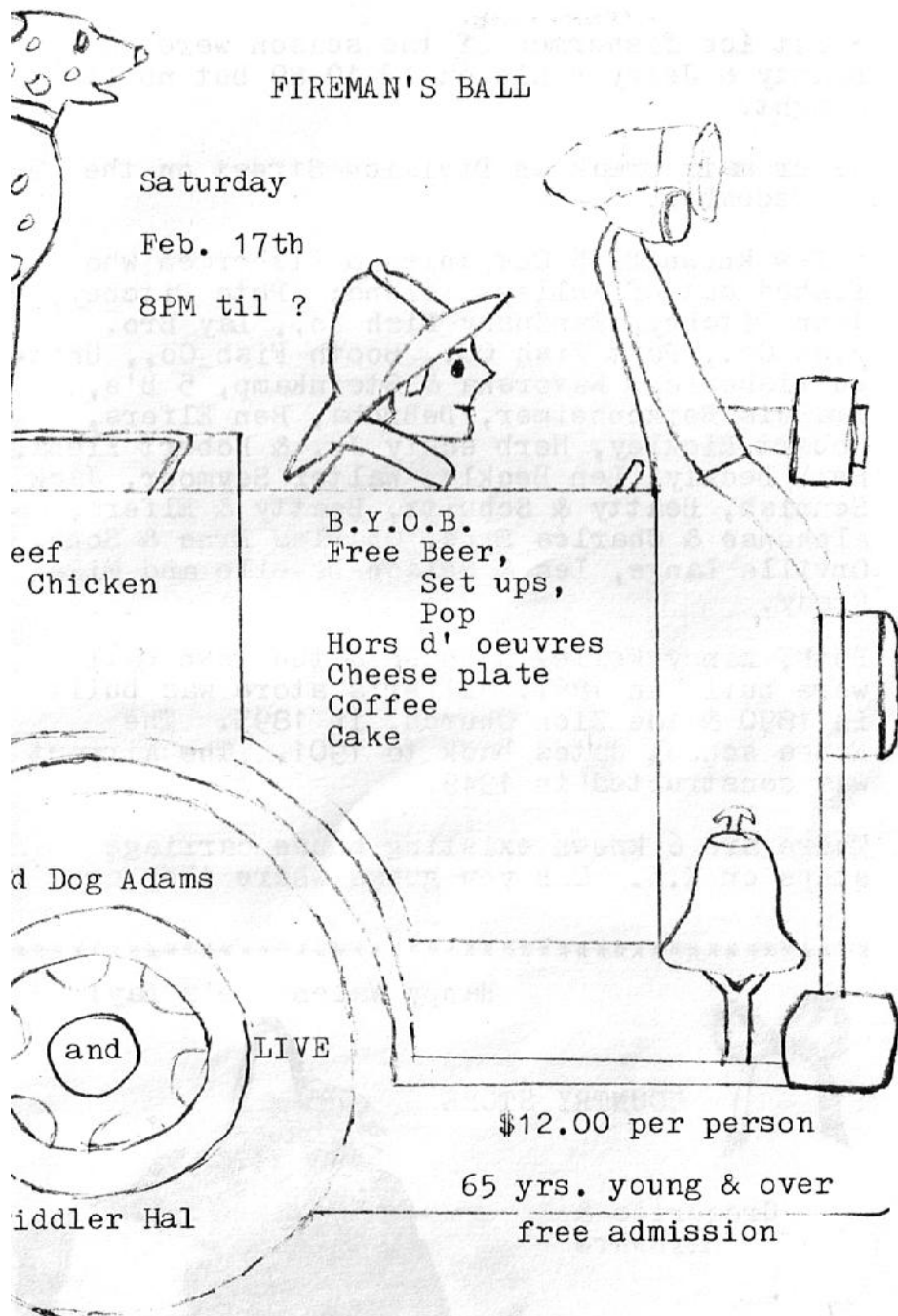

There are 6 known existing house carriage steps on K.I. Can you guess where they are?

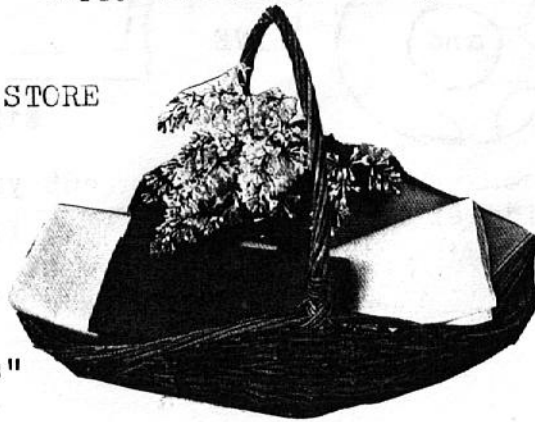

Congratulations to Sandy Spayd & John Kilko on the occasion of their engagement! They plan to be married in Sandusky on October 20. Sandy is the executive director of the K.I. Chamber of Commerce & John is a contractor on the island.

New School Board members are Jon Goodson & Kathy Ulrich. Pat Haig was elected School Board President.

On January 27th, Ann Neuman will wed Coast Guardsman, Greg Raggs, who is currently stationed at Marblehead. The bride-to-be attends Bowling Green University & will graduate in May. The wedding is to take place in Sandusky & the newlyweds will be residing in Cape Cod, where Greg is being transferred to.

A new ferry service for K.I. will become a reality around July of this year. Capital Control Inc. (James Palladino & his family) purchased 5.58 acres of lakefront property in Marblehead. Mr. Palladino plans to build a 300-350 foot dock with a parking lot for 150 cars. On Kelleys Island, a new dock will be constructed at the Palladino's Seaway Marina. It will not interfere with the boater's channel into the 400-boat capacity Marina as the new dock will be built close to Sunrise Point. One ferry boat has already been purchased & will transport passengers, cars & freight. The schedule will run well into winter & early spring depending on ice conditions.

My understanding is that Liz Coleman's parents have had their cottage on the island since 1963. Yet this winter was the first time Liz has flown over. She couldn't get over flying in such a "small" plane although she's passed the K.I. Airport hundreds of times. More of the part-time islanders should visit off season. It's a different island!

## Legislation from November 9th Council Meeting

Public hearings on Fresch's Island House Zoning Map Change & amendment to Zoning Ordinance #303. In response, concern was expressed that if approved, they would proceed to enlarge their parking lot & would possibly open the entire area towards commercial development. One answer was that it would keep the cars off the street.

In response to amending Zoning Ordinance #303, Herndon asked for citizens input regarding the proposed change of present lot size requirement of min. 15,000 sq. ft. to 1 acre; change present frontage from 100 ft. to 150 ft. Matso recommended a change to 3/4 acre & Martin recommended a change to 100' wide x 150' deep. Hand count leaned towards one acre lots. Mayor voiced concern that if building of new dwellings continues at the rate it has under the present lot requirement, eventually sewers & a sewage treatment plant will have to be put in. (means assessments)

Mayor welcomed the following new Council members as a result of new elections: Ed Curilla, Charles Martin & Russ Matso. A letter of appreciation & gratitude for their many hours of service, was given to the outgoing Council members: Nick Bianchi, Charles Pascoe & Bud Yoscovits.

Mayor read a letter received from the Army Corp. of Engineers regarding their annual inspection of Kelleys Island Shore Protection whereby they are requesting the removal of trees, brush & debris along the revetments. The tree roots have a tendency to eventually dislodge the stone protection. They found the cut trees & debris, due to illegal dumping, to be an unsightly mess. If not removed it will become a problem for someone when it eventually washes out.

Both, Fresch's Island House Zoning Map Change & the amendment to Zoning Ordinance #303 failed to meet emergency status. They are considered read

for the first time.

Motion passed to declare Ordinance No. 519 an emergency, to set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading.

Committee Reports\*\*\*\*\*

Finance Committee plans to meet shortly.

Streets/Sidewalks - Bianchi reports all the equipment is ready for winter.

Treasurer - Total expenditures as \$60,424.30; receipts as \$59,016.60; in general checking acc. as \$281,108.16.

Police Department - Chief Moore reported 24 complaints, 1 arrest, 13 minor injuries, 2 Medivacs, 11 assists to Coast Guard & no accidents.

Planning Commission - Herndon reported a special meeting was held Oct. 20, requested & paid for by Bob Gruly, regarding the building permit for his condominium project. Request denied because requirements of Ord. #303 were not met. Gruly will appeal his request for variance with the Board of Building & Zoning Appeals.

The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the following land splits contingent that they present to Council the Surveyor's drawing with seal by Feb. 1: Bud Yoscovits (on Ward Rd.) Ila Dick's (behind residence on Lake Shore), Ed Curilla's, & James Seeholzer's.

B.P.A. - No meeting held, being rescheduled.

No reports from Lands/Buildings, Administration/Public Safety, Landfill Committees.

Steve James submitted his resignation from the Planning Commission.

November Council Meeting Notes con't

Herndon suggested a public hearing be held at next council meeting regarding zoning 300 yds. into the lake. He stated we have extended jurisdiction into the lake, but no zoning into the lake. It is necessary that our solicitor draw up an ordinance for we need to have the Zoning rules in place.

Herndon stated that Dan Ahner requested a discussion of Conditional Use Permit for the Monarch Wine Company's property.

New Business\*\*\*\*\*

Motion passed for the Kelleys Island Historical Society to reserve the Old Town Hall, Sat., May 19, 1990 for dedication of the National Historic Plaque.

Citizens\*\*\*\*\*

Letter from the Ohio Dept. of Natural Resources was given to the Lands/Buildings Committee which stated they are allowing trees to be removed 100 ft. north & south of the centerline of the extension at the airport. It was suggested the Islanders have a tree cutting party enabling them to get wood.

Solicitor gave explanation pertaining to the power delegated to the Board of Building & Zoning appeals. He stated that there is a fine line when an action stops becoming a variance & becomes an amendment.

Motion passed to place Ron Beatty's personnel file before Council.

Motion passed to pay Ordinance No. 842.

Legislation from December 14th Council Meeting

Motion passed to declare Ordinance No. 520 (Transfer/Landfill) an emergency, set aside the rules & advance same to its third & final reading. Ordinance passed.

Motion passes to declare Ordinance No. 521 (Temporary Appropriations) an emergency, set aside the rules & advance same to its third & final reading. Ordinance passed.

Motion failed to declare Ordinance (Village Employees Sick Leave) an emergency, therefore is considered its first reading.

Second reading of Fresch's Island House Zoning Map Change was not read due to a discrepancy between property description & the map submitted. Sent back to Planning Commission to start over.

Second reading done regarding amendment to Zoning Ordinance #303.

Committee Reports\*\*\*\*\*

Administration/Public Safety - Major problem with vandalism at the Village airport. The heater's grill was torn off before it was ever turned on, building's door broken & a sign stolen. Mayor instructed Haas, Bianchi & Herndon to do whatever it takes to protect same.

Treasurer - expenditures as \$91,154.42; receipt as \$28,786.77; in general checking acc. as \$218,640.51.

Planning Commission - Herndon stated they will post a public hearing to begin the procedure regarding sub-division rules. He also stated that rules are being drawn up concerning dock regulations on K.I. They will post a public hearing regarding these rules.

The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the following land splits contingent that they present to Council the Surveyor's drawing with Seal by April 15, 1990: Nadine Brown's, Arlene Steuer's, Don Staas.

Motion passes to move all the winter contingencies to April 15, 1990.

Herndon received request from Kyle Paine that Council adopt a resolution stating approval for use of the submerged lands located at the properties of Bob Neubrandner & Frank Bennett, detailed drawings given. Motion declared & passed.

Landfill - The file on the closing of the landfill has been given to our solicitor.

B.P.A. - Mayor reports there has been a delay in the water project because of litigation.

Motion failed regarding Attorney Smith's request that the village pay plaintiffs fees regarding Board of Zoning Appeals litigation.

No reports from Finance, Streets/Sidewalks, Lands/Buildings, Police.

New Business\*\*\*\*\*

Motion passed to grant Conditional Zoning Certificate to Dan Ahner for the Monarch Winery which was approved by the Planning Commission. Questioned - what Ahner's planned restoration of the winery will be used for. Answered - a commercial recreational facility. When challenged that no public hearing was given, council overruled it. Further challenge was made that there was insufficient detailed plans.

Motion passed to bring all appropriation balances into adjustment.

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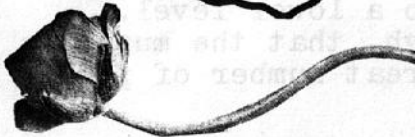

## An update on the Zebra Mussels....

The zebra mussel's reproductive cycle is key to its abundance & rapid spread. Egg production starts when water temperature warms to 54 in the spring & continues until water cools below that in the fall. A mature female mussel can produce over 30,000 eggs per season.

Any firm surface that's not toxic will be colonized by zebra mussels - rocks, fiberglass, metal, wood, vinyl, glass, rubber, paper, plants & other mussels.

The Lake Erie food chain is the growing concern. Each adult mussel is capable of filtering 1 liter of water per day. Nearly all particulate matter, including plankton, is strained from the water. Plankton feeds the larval & juvenile fish which support Lake Erie's sport & commercial fisheries.

The accumulation of the mussels on the rocky areas (can be several inches thick) create a foul environment. As the waste particles decompose, oxygen is used up & the pH becomes very acidic. Research is needed to determine if these acidic conditions will be detrimental to the hatching success of reef-spawning fish such as walleye, white bass & smallmouth bass.

Control methods that appear to work are prechlorination, ozone injection & sand bed filtration. Approved antifouling paints containing copper have resisted infestations on boats.

Reports are numerous of boat engines overheating due to cooling water inlets being clogged by colonies of zebra mussels. Boaters need to make frequent inspections of these areas & are urged to clean boat hulls, trim tabs, outdrives & outboard lower units, & to disinfect live wells with bleach before transferring a boat from Lake Erie to inland waters.

Zebra mussel population should peak in a few years & then decline to a lower level. There is little doubt though, that the mussel's impact will be felt by a great number of people who use Lake Erie.
