Patrick Martin The Patriarch of K.I. Martins

As St. Patrick's Day is the one holiday occurring in March that many American's observe, I thought it fitting to write of an Irish family (other than the Kelleys) who were early island settlers. Of course, it goes without saying, this family is "very dear to my heart". (please excuse the cliché.)

When the Kelley brothers decided to sell

When the Kelley brothers decided to sell some of Kelleys Island, & Addison Kelley issued deeds to the first property sold, Patrick Martin was among the first to receive a deed. Unfortunately, we don't know much about him or his immediate family after his arrival on Kelleys Island. Old maps show property east of what we refer to as the Estes property on the south shore in Mrs. Patrick Martin's name, & that's about it.

Patrick was born in County Mayo, Castlebar, Ireland. He came to America in 1835. No one knows how he learned about Kelleys Island or why he decided to settle on it. He must have liked the island or must

have seen opportunity there, because he later returned to Ireland to bring his brother & family back to the United States with him. This brother was Francis P. Martin, also called Frank & "Shanghai"

Martin.

Francis P. had a nine year old son, John Francis, who came to Kelleys Island with him. He had a wife & other children whom he had to leave behind, as his wife was too ill to travel. Passage had been booked for Francis P. & John Francis, & they either had to embark as planned or loose

their passage. His wife died & was buried in Ireland shortly after they arrived on Kelleys Island. Later his other children came to the New World, settling at first somewhere in Canada & then on to the United States.

Francis P. remarried after the passing on of his wife, this time to a Kelleys Island woman named Bridgette. We know nothing more about her not even her last name. This marriage produced a daughter & a son, both of whom moved from the island. Francis P. moved also, to Fremont, Ohio, where he is buried.

A Charles Martin, born in Ireland, & his wife Alice came to the United States in 1848 & settled on Kelleys Island sometime between 1860 & 1870. We believe that he was one of Patrick Martin's brothers, although we have no definite proof of this. An old store account book in our possession shows purchases of Charles Martin in October 1869. There is also a photograph of some men playing checkers at the Lodge before the turn of the century, & Charles Martin is one of them.

John Francis, the nine-year old who accompanied his father from Ireland, stayed on the island & married Harriet Harwood from England. In 1880, they ran a boarding house for men who worked in the quarry. They had three sons: Frederick, John & Frank.

Frederick married Julia Amanda Erne, & together they had eleven children: Howard, Alfie, "Fritz", Emmett, Charles (my husband's father), Harriet, Eileen, Mary or "Tootie", Catherine, & two other children who died in infancy. He was owner & operator of the Martin Power & Light Company, furnishing electricity to the island for many years before the island's electric co-operative was formed.

From this line of Martins, only two sons, Charles or "Jake" and Emmett's son, William or "Bill" claimed the Martin name for many years. Bill moved from Kelleys Island & was living in Chesterland, Ohio when his only son William Jr. con't on page 16




Seaside....

Wild birds are more than just beautiful to watch & listen to. They are valuable allies of the gardeners, since most wild bird species would rather eat insects than seeds if given the choice. Cardinals enjoy eating Japanese beetles, while chickadees prefer a diet of insect eggs. You can entice desirable birds to your garden with feeders stocked with fresh sunflower & thistle seed. It's a mistake to think that the birds won't eat insects if bird feeders are kept filled in summer.

Planting basil among tomato plants helps protect tomatoes from tomato hornworms.

If you use aerosol deodorants in the kitchen or bathroom, you might want to try something more natural. A "scented geranium" (Pelargonium) has delightful aromatic leaves that help mask unpleasant household odors. There are many species offering a variety of fragrances, such as lemon, mint, rose, ginger & apricot. Scented geraniums are easy to grow, but should not be too far from a window.

Solid waste is the general term given to all trash and rubbish discarded by homes, businesses, and factories. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has found the make up of solid waste to be comprised of the materials in the following chart. Most of solid waste is made up of yard waste, like leaves and grass clippings (18%), food wastes (8%), and paper and cardboard (41%).

Regarding proposed ordinance for part-time Village Sick Leave, they receive less wages than regular help & get no benefits so ½ day of wages per month seems small price to pay.

Items from Council - Motion passed to put "5 Mil Road Construction Improvement Levy" on May ballot.

Future ordering of supplies & materials for Village - Street Superintendent get approval from 1 Councilman, then get purchase order no. from Village clerk. Mayor will clear purchases with appropriate committees from a request voucher by the Village employees.

Finance Dept. to meet Jan. 12th to discuss Police Department's millage.



BEST RUM CAKE EVER

1 tsp. sugar
1 cup dried fruit
1 tsp. soda
2 eggs, large
lemon juice

1 or 2 qts. rum
brown sugar
1 cup butter
baking powder
nuts

Before starting, sample rum to check quality. Good, isn't it? Now proceed.

Select large mixing bowl, measuring cup, etc. Check rum again. It must be just right. To be sure rum is of proper quality, pour one level cup of rum into glass and drink it as fast as you can. Repeat.

With electric mixer, beat 1 cup butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add 1 seaspoon of thugar and beat again.

Meanwhile, make sure rum is still alright. Try another cup. Open second quart if necessary.

Add eggs, 2 cups fried druit and beat till high. If druit gets stuck in beaters, pry loose with drewscriber.

Sample rum again, checking for tonscisticity.

Nest, sift 3 cups pepper or salt (really does not matter). Sample rum.

Sift ½ pint lemon juice. Fold in chopped butter and strained nut. Add 1 bablespoon of brown thugar or whatever color you can find. Wix mell.

Grease oven. Turn cake pan to 350 degrees. Pour mess into boven and ake. Check rum again and bo to ged.

This is my first article for SeaScape & hopefully, not my last - plans are to keep fishermen informed as to "what's happenin' fishin'-wise" around everyones favorite island, KELLEYS!

The island area has always been my favorite - beautiful & plentiful - fish for all seasons. Hopefully I will be able to pass on a few fishin' tips, given to me by such great fishermen as Del Ehbar (probably one of the best ever on the island) Capt. Elton Ensplaugh, Capt. Larry Mullot & Capt. Merle Bickle, all who have summer places on the island, are charter boat captains & know the islands like the proverbial "back of their hand".

Nuff said - let's go fishin'! This time of the year, as the water starts to head for 40° plus, the Seaway Marina should start producing some excellent catches of Crappie, Steelhead & Coho. If you're real lucky, maybe even a Northern Pike - couple of these in the 6 to 8 lb. class have been taken around the marina in early spring the last couple of years. You really don't specifically fish for

these, they are cought fishin' for some other fish - & you wind up with a "surprise".

Crappies are taken around the marina docks on light tackle with minnows & bobbers or small Crappie Jigs tipped with maggots or minnows. One could even wind up with a Steelhead this way. Kids (from 6 to 60) could really get in-

to bobber fishin'.

Steelhead & Coho are around the marina
"fingers" - use small to medium spinner baits,
such as Shyster (black/white or silver/black)
or minnow bobber set could be effective. These
fish have muscles in their "you know what" &
really put up a tussle, one won't soon forget!

Baum is married & has two adult children.


