This uncirculated Lincoln Head Penny is stamped with a profile reproduction of John F. Kennedy looking-at-Lincoln. This unusual commemorative piece is truely a collector's item.

The Romance of George Kelley

Irad Kelley, one of the original Kelleys who first purchased Kelleys Island, had a son named George. Although George did not arrive on the island until 1847, in 1843 he purchased land from Addison Kelley. This parcel of land consisted of one hundred forty acres of lot no. six.

George & his father went to Tennessee to buy sheep, & while there they stayed at the home of one Colonel Eastland. George became very ill & stayed with Colonel Eastland until

he regained his health.

Colonel Eastland had a daughter Martha. During George's period of recuperation, he & Marthe fell in love. He persuaded her to be his wife & to accompany him back North. He brought this new bride from the warmth of the South across the ice of Lake Erie in January,

1848, to live on Kelleys Island.

In the year 1835, Addison Kelley built a large log house on the west side of Division St., about fifteen hundred feet from the south shore of Iake Erie. This log house was not for himself, but for his father, Datus. By the time George arrived with his new bride, Datus had moved elsewhere, & so George & Martha lived in the log house. This log house forms the core of the oldest house on Kelleys Island. It now belongs to Burt Miller.

In August of 1849, Martha gave birth to the first twins born on the island. Unfortunately they lived only a few weeks. They were to have other children, one daughter in particular named Hattie. Hattie married Mr. Stewart Chisholm of Cleveland, Ohio, & they resided in Cleveland. As Hattie was gifted with an excellent soprano voice, she sang for many years in the choir of the Second Baptist Church of Cleveland. This is the church to which Mr. John D. Rockefeller belonged. Cleveland critics judged her voice to be equal to the best soprano of the world at that time.

George Kelley made many contributions to Kelleys Island's history. He was the first postmaster. He was the first to register ear marks for hogs & cattle in the township record book. The record reads: "Irad & George Kelley left for record July 1848, round hole through the right ear." As livestock wandered the island, these ear marks served as identification in case a dispute arose over the proper ownership of an animal.

George also operated a general store. In 1854, he traded his store business to William S. Webb in exchange for Webb's quarry. He then opened several small quarries in various places on the island. He built a dock for shipping his stone. Here the keel for the Island Queen, which was put into service in 1855, was laid.

George Kelley is an example of the many versatile pioneers who made Kelleys Island a growing & prosperous community.



Legislation from November 15th Meeting.....

Motion to declare Resolution No. 212 (pertaining to certain lands underlying Take Erie/Yako) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed. Resolution No. 212 then declared passed.

Motion to declare Resolution No. 213 (pertaining to certain lands underlying Lake Erie/Bechtel) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed. Resolution No. 213 then declared passed.

Committee Reports.....

Finance - passage of a levy is needed in the Landfill Fund which ran out of money a month ago; have to borrow against money we may get next year. Village will have to cut back on costs; need legislation to transfer money out of the General Fund into Landfill Fund. Landfill Committee will have to come up with a package for next year's landfill rates. Suggestion for 1991 bills to go out in January. Mayor wants legislation on every Councilman's desk the week prior to next month's meeting. Solicitor to receive Delinquent list soon. Solicitor stated the purpose of Collection is to deter non-payment; it will take some time to retrieve the delinquent money. Suggestion to get scales - Must purchase gas monitor wells first. Committee will check into finding another hauler who's rates are lower. Suggestion to look into State grants. The Poggemeyer Group is going to try getting Village some grants.

Streets/Sidewalks - other than a little patching, normal cleanup & fixup, nothing more happening. Mayor made a third monthly request for a short-term & long-term plan from Committee.

Lands/Buildings - no meeting held. Problems still remain at the Town Hall; furnaces need to be fixed. Joe Trainer agreed to take responsibility for sport activities there.

Administration/Public Safety - a demo on "rescue" was given our EMT's by Don Mortis, Fire Training Instructor, using up-to-date equipment available for broken bones, backs, etc., namely, the PAAR VACUSPLINT MATTRESS, which enables the injured party to be placed in an ambulance without disturbing the patient. Prices given Chief Moore were \$260 for blankets & Leg Arm Case, \$650 for Mattress with pump, total cost \$910. Motion passed to purchase the Paar VacuSplint Mattress & to be paid out of Medical Service Fund. Suggested that arrangements be made to give a demo to everyone once the mattress arrives.

Treasurer - Receipts of \$51,182.19, expenditures of \$29,291.46, with a balance of \$187,832.89 in general checking account.

Police Department - Chief Moore reported things have slowed down. There was 1 arrest, 16 complaints, 2 accidents, 3 medical runs, daily patrols made, & that the vandalism regarding road signs was solved.

Planning Commission - Meeting will be held on Friday, Nov. 16 at 8 am, then meet with the Poggemeyer Group & people of the community to get the report study rolling before the last boat leaves.

Landfill - Meetings were held with Recycling Committee in preparation for a pilot mandatory recycling program; the "Pavilion" not used during the winter & having a sheltered area, was chosen as the Recycling Center site. Complete details forthcoming. Purpose of the program is to defray shipping costs & help eliminate extraordinary Landfill costs. 400 communities already have mandatory recycling.

B.P.A. - Reported that any monies, interest-wise, should go to BPA, not Village General Fund. BPA can no longer give "free" water to anyone, such as Cemetery, down town fountain, pavilion, etc., the result of being involved with Federal funding.

Motion made to appoint Megan Joyce as Clerk of the Village, filling the unexpired term of Sharon Bianchi who resigned declared passed.

Discussion of Volunteer Fire Department's amended Resolution has been tabled pending further review. Mayor requested Matso to follow-up with Solicitor regarding Village Liability. Herndon stated the Fire Department should let Finance Department know how much money they need. He also stated the need to discuss necessary legislation for a levy which would be for Capital Expenses.

New Business....

Motion to approve use of the Pavilion & Town Hall for two 1991 reservation requests, failed, lacking a second; pending further discussions, has been postponed until next month's meeting.

Items From Council.....

Request Lee McDermond, Village Solicitor, to check into impact taxes on commercial boat docks.

Herndon & Village Clerk, Megan Joyce, to meet on Saturday, Nov. 17, to discuss legislation needed amending 1990 Appropriations, transferring a said amount to Landfill Fund. notify Solicitor what was secided, then arrange to hold special Council Meeting. Also stated Airport Fund is in the hole.

Motion passed to pay Ordinance No. 854.

Legislation Notes from Special Council Meeting November 19th.....

Subject: Proposed Ordinance amending the 1990 Annual Appropriation Ordinance/the transfer of funds to Landfill Fund from General Fund & Street Maintenance Fund. - Consider Resolutions for placement of issues for February's election.

Motion passed to declare Ordinance No. 545 (Amend. 1990 Appropriations Ord./transfer of funds) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading. Ordinance No. 545 then declared passed.

Resolution (Declaring amount of taxes to be raised by proposed levy/Iandfill Capital Funds) to declare an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading failed.

Resolution (Declaring amount of taxes to be raised by proposed levy/Operating Funds) to declare an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading failed.

Matso stated it would be unfair to have an election in February while the summer residents are not on the Island, suggested waiting until Spring to present & explain the above resolution to everyone. Herndon stated summer residents could vote absentee ballot. Mayor voiced concern & disappointment that the two resolutions did not pass at this time, for due to lack of funds, the Village would be in jeopardy of losing our self government, therefore could lose it to the County Commissioner whereby taxes could triple; stated we are 10 Mills lower than any other community.

Legislation from December 15th Meeting.....

Ordinance (Temporary Appropriations/Jan., Feb. & Mar. 1991) to declare an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading failed due to motion being withdrawn. Finance Committee agreed to meet before adjournment regarding transferring of funds to accounts in the "red."

Committee Reports.....

Finance - Committee will have to stay after the meeting to balance out 30 accounts in the "red" & to also try & come up with money to pay BFI due to Landfill Fund being out of money.

Administration/Public Safety - EMT's had a work session with the Paar Vacusplint Mattress that arrived. Would like to have a mattress demo for the public sometime in Spring.

Police Department - Chief Moore reported 11 complaints, 3 citations issued, 2 accidents investigated, 3 medical runs, 2 assists to Coast Guard & daily patrols made. Stated the Paar Vacusplint Mattress came in.

Planning Commission - After adjourning their regular monthly meeting held Dec. 14, they later reconvened with representatives of the Poggemeyer Group to start work on the Port Study & received a good amount of information from those attending.

Landfill - Village is in deep trouble over the Landfill. Received notice from BFI of a rate increase effective Jan 1, 1991. Would like to see new Landfill Fees for 1991, Residential & Business which show an increase, be sent out sometime in January.

B.P.A. C. Smith attended a Conference on Zebra Mussels which dealt with treatment on how to keep the intake clear.

No reports from Streets/Sidewalks, Lands/Buildings

nor Treasurer.

New Business.....

Mayor stated appointments to the Park Board will be set aside until January's Council meeting.

Motion passed for Village Solicitor to set financial planning meeting with Squires, Sanders & Dempsey.

Motion failed to enter into contract with Love Insurance for Public Liability & Police Liability Insurance which expires Dec. 31st. Motion passed for Village Solicitor to put Public & Police Liability Insurance out for bids. Motion passed to secure coverage extension, if necessary covering period of time new contract goes into effect. Motion passed for Village Clerk to mark calendar every October, to remind Council of said insurance expiring, also remind Council couple months in advance of other expiring insurances.

Village Solicitor is drawing up proper documents to be discussed at next month's Council meeting regarding Pavilion & Town Hall reservation requests cleanup fees.

Report regarding Fire Dept. needs & Village liability will be ready for next month's meeting. Report regarding short term & long term plans for Road Construction & Repair will be ready by early Spring.

Since we no longer have a landfill, it should be referred to as a Transfer Station. A trial Recycling Program should begin sometime in January. Bills for 1991 Transfer Station Fees will be sent out as soon as new rates are set & approved by Council. Also reported that the Village can collect deliquent accounts through Small Claims Court. It is only fair that everyone does their fair share to maintain the Transfer Station.

Due to several questions raised, Mayor McCullagh, will ask the Park Board to find out the State Park rules for Islanders wishing to use it.

Items from Council.....

Motion for State Auditor to audit Village books which is done upon resignation of previous Clerk & in fairness to newly appointed Clerk. Audit will also include Mayor's Court books passed. Solicitor will research if it must be done by Ordinance.

Suggestion to change all the door locks of the Town Hall & key given to an authorized person. Vandalized piano was repaired & St. Julian was requested to make a box with a lock, to enclose piano when not in use. Suggestion that perhaps only the Mayor or Village Clerk should give permission to anyone wishing to use the Town Hall.

Motion passed to pay Ordinance No. 855 as amended & contingent on final approval by the Finance Committee Chairman stating that all appropriations were brought into adjustment.

Special Council Meeting, December 21st.....

Motion to declare Ordinance No. 546 (Temproary Approperations/Jan., Feb. & Mar., 1991) an emergency, set aside the rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed. Ordinance No. 546 then passed.

Motion to bring all appropriations balances into adjustment passed.

Motion to approve amended Pay Ordinance No. 855 passed.

Well now, here it is - the end of January already! Winter going down hill - Spring not too far away & visions of the ferry boats running to the island are starting to materialize in my mind.

Walleye fishin' during late Fall was really fantastic from the shoreline docks with fish taken almost all the way to Christmas Day (pro-


viding the ice wasn't around the island).

Did something this Fall that made me feel really good - practiced catch-and-release with the big fish. Only kept the smaller fish (4 lbs. & under) & the males (which were scarce). Let the big mamas go to hatch a new brood.
