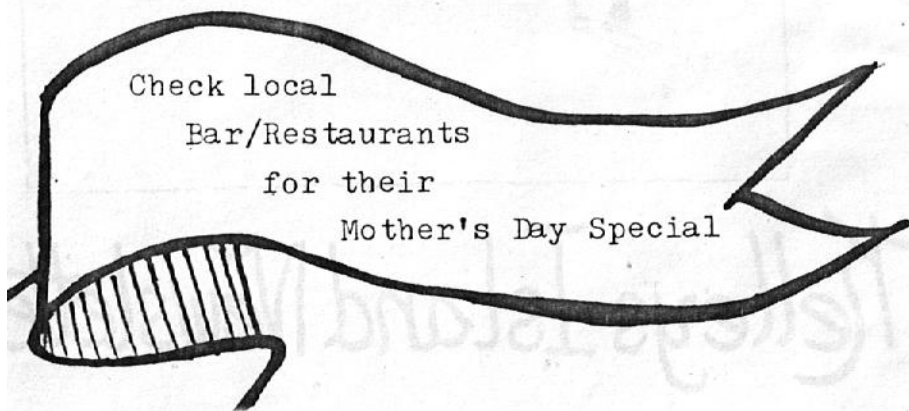

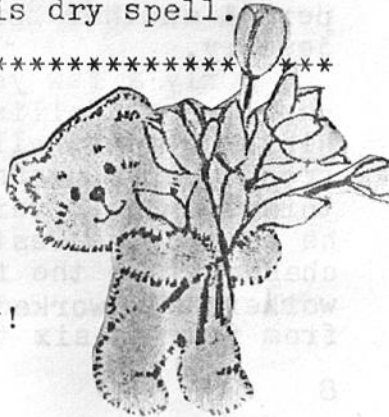

### More Quarry Activities

Each day that I go to the store or post office, I see new faces, people I haven't seen before. When I ask, "Who is that?" I'm told that it is either so & so who works in the quarry or that person's wife or friend. Nearly everyday I can look out my front windows & see the little red quarry boat making its routine trip to & from Marblehead to transport quarry workers. Recently I've been able to watch the barge pass by on its way to the west side of the island to be loaded or on its way to Cleveland "full to the brim" with stone for an asphalt plant somewhere. These quarry activities provide a bit of excitement, something different from day-to-day activities for the average islanders. As I watch the boat & the barge make their ways across the water, my thoughts go back to recorded history when quarry activities brought a sense of adventure to those living on Kelleys Island in a by-gone era.

On May 1st, 1875, the schooner Consuelo was loaded with heavy stone bound for Toledo. The lake was rough. About half-way between Kelleys Island & Marblehead the boat capsized. Five members of the crew drowned. Two remaining crew members held on to the cross trees of the ship for nearly two hours. Three young men, brothers, from Marblehead went in a flat-bottomed skiff to rescue the survivors. A steam tug from Kelleys Island came along & rescued the five of them along with a tin box containing the captain's papers & another box containing the drowned cook's jewelry.

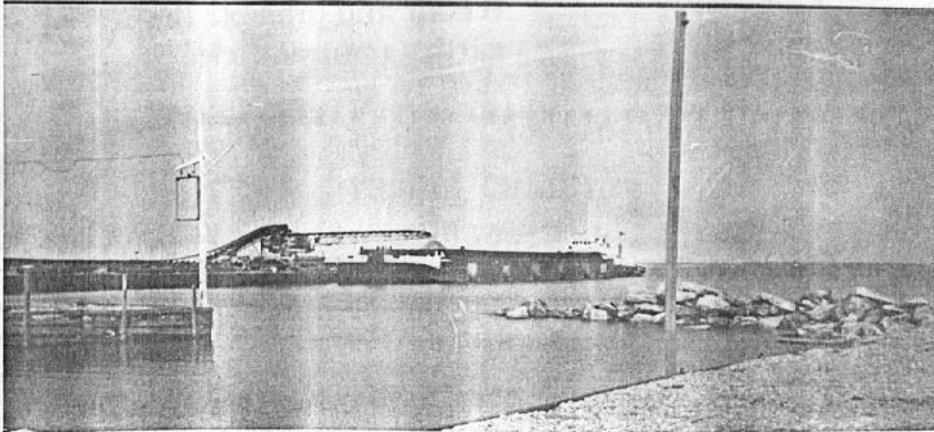
Only a few years later, 1877-78, Captain Edward Ross Collins was captain of the steamer Hickox of the Kelleys Island Lime Company. He became superintendent of the quarries owned by this company & served from 1879 to 1881. In 1882, he leased the West Bay Stone Quarry & then purchased it in the fall of 1883. He employed forty workers who worked with steam power & shipped from four to six thousand cords of stone a year.



Captain Collins was born in Jefferson County, New York in 1826. He worked on a farm with his father until 1841. He then went to work for Messrs. E.G. Merrick & Co. of Clayton New York. This company was engaged in a large lake business. During his six years of employment with this company, he became familiar with Lake Erie. In 1847, he settled in Cleveland. He worked on various vessels as mate, master, & captain including the City of Sandusky before he captained the Hickox. He & his wife, the former Miss Jane Thompson Clampitt, were married in Cleveland in 1854. The couple had two children, Edward Frank Collins & Sarah Jane.

One could write volumes about activities connected with the Kelleys Island quarries & their workers who came from all walks of life over the years. Some are tragic occurrences; others day-to-day chores that help produce product & earn a livelihood for families. My plans are to present some of these stories to you from time to time in future issues. These quarry workers were instrumental in bringing other settlers to Kelleys Island & providing jobs for future generations. My hopes are that our present hard-working men can avoid any tragedy & will bring only prosperity to themselves, their families, & our island.

Legislation from February 14th Meeting.....

Due to winter storm conditions, meeting was continued until Saturday, Feb. 16th at noon.

Motion to declare Ordinance No. 548 (Road Opening Permit Fee Increase) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

Motion to declare Resolution No. 215 (Proposed Levy/May Ballot - 4 Mills - Police Dept. Motor Vehicles) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

Motion to declare Resolution No. 216 (Proposed Levy/May Ballot - 1½ Mills-- Airport Construction) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

Motion to declare Resolution No. 217 (Proposed Levy/May Ballot - 1 Mil - Fire Dept. Apparatus) an emergency & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

First reading done on proposed Ordinance No. 166 - Village Volunteer Fire Dept.

Motion to accept bid received from Marie St. Julian regarding mowing of the Cemetery & Down town Park, amount charged for mowing being the same as last year, passed.

Motion declared passed approving the following 1991 reservation requests:

- Sat., Feb. 16 -Town Hall-K.I. Fire Dept.  
Annual Firemens Ball
- Fri., May 31 -Town Hall- 6 to 9 pm
- Sat., June 1 -Pavilion- 7 to 10 pm
- Sun., June 2 -Pavilion-11 am to 1 pm  
to Island Inns Assoc.

Mayor McCullagh congratulated Sandy Trainer & her award-winning Island Girls Drill Team for doing such a fine job at the Drill Team Competition held in Ashland, Ohio.

Committee Reports.....

Lands/Buildings - Haas reported the heater at the Airport building was vandalized again. Nick Bianchi installed another heater donated by Russ Matso. Haas suggested locking the building after hours. Mayor suggested having a sign posted stating "Criminal Trespassing/\$500 Minimum Fine/\$100 reward to anyone witnessing vandalism".

Police Department - Chief Moore reported 2 accidents were investigated & daily patrols made.

B.P.A. - Smith reported contracts were signed for assessed project. Litigation still pending.

Citizens Participation.....

Ken Neuffer informed the Mayor that he will provide a list with information concerning the 11 abandoned cars at the airport.

Bud Yoscovits stated that, as a matter of record, the Presidents weekend in February had been designated as the date set for the annual K.I. Fireman's Ball at the Town Hall, no longer needing Council's approval.

Motion declared passed to pay Ordinance No. 857.

February 16th Meeting adjourned due to lack of quorum.

Legislation from February 22 Meeting.....

Motion to declare Ordinance No. 549 (Contract with Love Insurance/Public & Police Liability) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

Motion to declare Ordinance No. 550 (Transfer Station 1991 Fees Increase/ Residential & Business) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

Motion to declare Resolution No. 218 (approving settlement of Litigation) an emergency, set aside rules & advance same to its third & final reading passed.

Mayor advised Matso to contact Kellstone to renegotiate a Road Repair Bond Contract so a new Ordinance can be written up.

Haas reported gathering more facts for our recycling program. Also that the 1991 Transfer Station bills should go out within 30 days. Resident & Business owners will be charged an "availability fee" & they cannot use the station if their fee has not been paid.

Mayor requested Haas to check into the "Afford-A-Call" discount service being provided by the Ohio Municipal League.

Solicitor advised Matso to have the Village Clerk check & see if the EMT's are covered by Insurance on the Village policy. Matso asked Solicitor to investigate if EMT's can charge a fee per each run.

Mayor advised Council to submit a letter to the 4-H Camp asking that the "Band practice beginning hour" be changed to a more reasonable hour; instead of 7 am, to begin 8 or 9 am, per signed petitions from citizens living nearby. Legislation will have to be set up if the 4-H Camp does not adhere to the request.

Mayor informed Council of letter received from Toby Zettler requesting that a "Noise Ordinance" be enacted regarding Cigarette Boats. Mayor felt the matter should be turned over to the Port Authority Commission.

Motion declared passed approving payment of bill



from the Poggemeyer Group regarding the Port Study.

Joanne Golias submitted a letter of resignation to the Mayor, Council & Clerk Megan Joyce. Her position for the past 2½ years was that of Part Time Clerical Help at \$5.00 per hour.

Legislation from March 14th Meeting.....

No new legislation.

Committee Reports.....

Finance - Herndon reported the Finance Committee will meet on March 15 at 9 am to work on the new appropriations. Stated that they have to figure out how to bring in more money because our Village is rapidly running out of same.

Streets/Sidewalks - Matso reported that the winter has devastated the Village's black-topped roads, causing a considerable amount of work to be done in the Spring.

Lands/Buildings - Haas reported that he would like the Town Hall's parking lot extended but it will depend on appropriations. Mayor reported that due to the Ohio Dept. of Transportation's severe budget limitations, grant funds for use at the K.I. Airport will not be awarded through the "Fiscal Year 1991 Ohio Airport Resurfacing & Improvement Grant Program". Only grant requests for paving & cracked sealing have been awarded, but if a grantee should not accept their grant funds for FY 1991, K.I.'s application would be considered. The application will remain on file for possible funding in early FY 1992, beginning July 1st. The Mayor stated that hopefully, May's levy would help support the operation of the airport. Haas said the Village plans on taking bids for the Airport's runway widening.

Administration/Public Safety - Matso said that as of this day, two applications have been received for the Chief of Police position which becomes open May 1st. Matso stated the EMT's have been busy cleaning & storing equipment at their new location. A heater has been installed in the Emergency vehicle which will take a victim to a hospital on the mainland. Matso stated he plans on meeting with the Village Clerk regarding application received from Love Insurance for the EMT's & Firemen.

Treasurer - Seeholzer stated her report was incomplete at the time of March 14th's Council meeting due to Village Clerk's records being incomplete.

Police Department - Chief Moore reported 5 complaints, 1 traffic accident investigated, no arrests, no citations, regular patrols made, & received only one paid fine to date of non-paid fines due & suggested bench warrants be issued.

Planning Commission - Herndon reported there has been good progress so far in meeting with the Poggemeyer Group regarding the Port Study.

Transfer Station - Haas reported they have been working with Ed Feick, Erie County Engineer, to close old Landfill & that he asked the Environmental Protection Agency to excuse the Village from some of the requirements to close the old Landfill, such as gas & water monitor wells. Haas reported the Transfer Station "Availability Bills" may go out in the next two weeks.

B.P.A. - Phinney reported the PHC lawsuit has been heard but the judge has to formalize a decision. Stated Squires, Sanders & Dempsey & the Poggemeyer Group will meet with our Village Solicitor on March 20th.

Citizens Participation.....

Ken Neuffer said there are 3 cars with fictitious

licence plates, & 3 cars with expired licence plates at the airport & suggested citations be sent registered mail. Motion for Solicitor to do research on an Ordinance for same & also to make sure the Ordinance states "there will be a fine for towing" made.

Motion passed for second reading on proposed Ordinance No. 166 - Village Volunteer Fire Dept.

Matso reported he plans to meet with Kellstone regarding new terms on the Road Repair Bond contract so that an Ordinance can be drawn up.

Haas reported the Recycling program should go into effect around the first of May on a trial basis in a temporary shelter set up at the Transfer Station.

Haas reported that he checked into the "Afford A-Call Discount Service" provided by the Ohio Municipal League & found that the savings would be 3/4 cents per call. Stated he will contact GTE about an extended service area for the Island.

Haas reported that the Village would receive guidelines on "signage" from the Poggemeyer Group in reference to the posting of Airport Vandalism signs.

Matso stated he will have a report at the next meeting regarding EMT Insurance Coverage.

Mayor reported that a letter was sent to the Director of the 4-H Camp requesting that band practice for the summer "not begin prior to 8 am & not past 11 pm" in accordance with the existing Village Ordinance.

Matso reported that research is being done into legislation regarding a Noise Ordinance of Off-Shore Racing Boats.

Motion approving Condo Association's request to hold a meeting on Sat., April 13th at the Muni-

cipal Bldg. at 1 pm (which will be held after the Planning Commission's meeting with the Poggemeyer Group) passed.

Items from Council.....

Herndon suggested that before Council agrees or disagrees on Ken Neuffer's request to construct an Airplane Ramp on Village property (Neuffer stated he would cover the labor, material, maintenance costs & submitted plans approved by Ed Feick, County Engineer), that the Village Solicitor put together an agreement requiring Neuffer's signature. Also, wants Neuffer to provide a letter from all Regulatory Agencies such as the FAA, stating his request would not infringe on any available grant monies.

Matso called the attention to those attending the Council meeting, of the nice rug with non-slip features, that lies at the entrance of the Municipal Building's Council Meeting chambers. It was donated by Huntley Cleaners. Letter of thanks was sent by the Mayor.

Motion to pay Ordinance No. 858 passed.

FISHIN'.....By Grandpa Walleye

April ends & May brings Small Mouth Bass Fishin'. When the water temperature gets around 50 - 54 degrees F. - the Small Mouth Fishin' hits its peak as the females are ready to spawn & go on a feeding frenzy with the males hangin' around just to make sure mother nature takes care of things properly. The best bait for these are soft shell crabs, however, at a cost of \$3.00 - \$4.00 per dozen (if you can find them at the baitshops) this seems "cost prohibitive" to me. As an alternative, use lead-headed Jigs tipped with either maggots or meal worms which cost approximately \$1.50 a container & could be very effective. Also try a minnow on a lead-headed Jig (brown or black color) being the best. Remember, the possession limit on Small Mouth in Lake Erie is a bag limit of eight & must be of twelve inches minimum length. Also - Walleye bag limit has been reduced to five instead of the prior season six fish.

Fish Ohio Recognition:

- Small Mouth - 20 inches
- Walleye - 28 inches
- Yellow Perch - 13 inches
- White Bass - 16 inches
- Drum (Sheepshead) - 22 inches

Entry forms can be obtained at local bait shops & all entries must bear a witness signature.

Reminds me of a story about a fisherman who took a comparatively inexperienced friend fishin' for Muskellunge. The Muskie is a fierce & vicious freshwater fighter, grows quite large, may weigh around 60 lbs. & is difficult to land. He hooked into a big one! Played it well, but despite every effort, the fish shook itself loose less than 20 feet from the boat. He slumped in his seat, wiped his brow & said, "Wow, wasn't that something? You know, for a while there I didn't think I'd ever get away."
