## Have you Considered Growing Herbs?

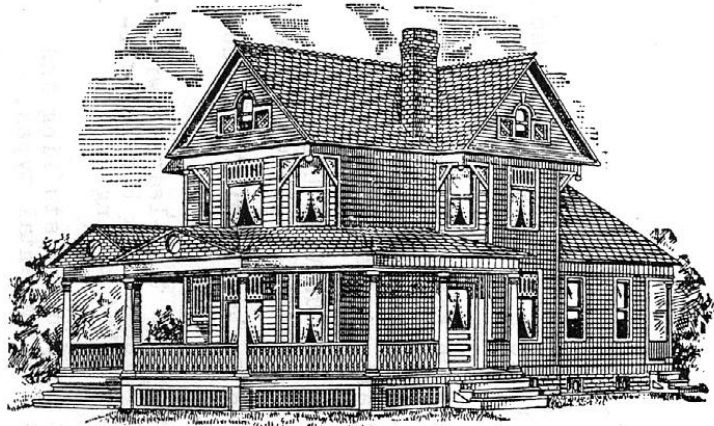
1. CHIVES - Plants multiply and come back each year bearing rose colored spring flowers with their own culinary uses.

# **RULES**

## KEEP YOURS FLOWING SMOOTHLY.....

Within the septic tank environment are specialized bacteria which feed upon cellulose, starches & so forth, contained in waste matter. These living organisms are so small that perhaps 25 million might fit in a square inch of area. Bleach & many household cleaners contain acids & salts that will kill this bacteria if used in excess.

Paint thinners, cigarettes & hair may never break down. Brine from water softeners will alter clays in the soil, which encourage clogging. Colored toilet paper, disposable diapers, coffee grounds & cat litter are highly resistant to digestion. Even some drain cleaners that say to clean septic tanks are risky if used regularly. Anything containing potassium or sodium hydroxide (lye) can affect & temporarily loosen & precipitate solids. The result is loss of bacteria & accumulation of bulk at the tank inlet or in the drain field.

Check the absorption field. Don't allow run-off from downspouts & driveways to flood area, redirect the surface flow. Trees, deep rooted shrubbery & vegetable gardens should be kept off the field. The roots can penetrate & clog pipe & trenches. Edible plants can absorb toxins from household chemicals. Parking or driving over the space, compacts the soil & may crush a leach line.

Another aid is to make a conscious effort to reduce water usage. Schedule showers, dishes & laundry over a broad period of time.

Additives? Well, a bacteria treatment adds millions of bacteria to a system populated in the many billions. On the other hand, enzymes are catalytic proteins produced by living bacteria; they alter the rate of digestion, not the amount that existing bacteria can consume. One additive that does neither of these things but may help the system is plain baking soda. It tends to buffer the pH level to control short-term fluctuation.

Easy Cheese Strudel

- 2 cans crescent rolls
- 2 (8 oz. ) pk. cream cheese
- 2 egg yolks - save whites
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 teasp. vanilla
- 1 teasp. lemon juice

Pat 1 pk. rolls in bottom of ungreased 9 x 13 glass baking dish. Seal cracks in dough with fingers.

Beat rest of ingredients & spread over the dough.

Roll 2nd pk. of rolls over top of mixture. Beat egg whites with fork & spread over top.

Bake 350' for 30 min.

Cool & sprinkle with powder sugar or glaze of 1 cup conf. sugar & 2 tablesp. milk.

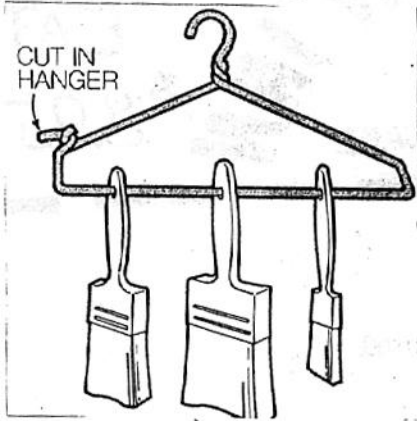

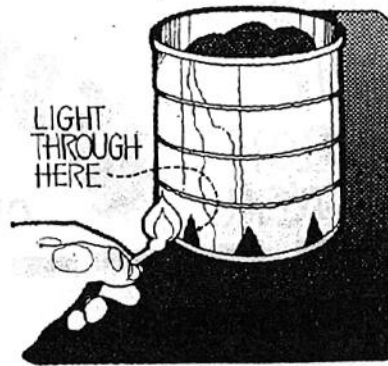
# Odds....



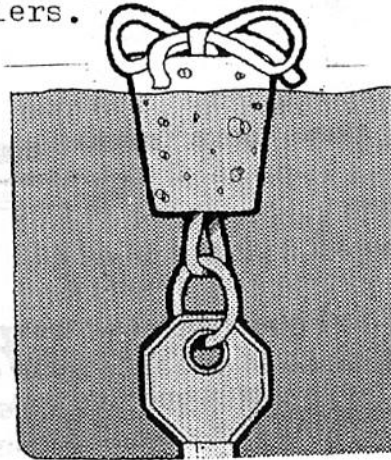
Cut the shoulder of a wire clothes hanger & form a hook on each side of cut. String the lower hook through the holes in your paint brush handles & hang them where they can drip dry harmlessly.

For a quick, convenient way to clean up after getting paint, oil or wood sap on your hand & arms, moisten a small towel or rag with turpentine & seal it in a qt. jar. After each use return rag to jar & re-seal. Add turpentine occasionally.

Make a key saver from a large cork, key ring & leather thong as shown. Paint the cork with a bright color for easy visibility (nail polish).



For a fast, effective alternative to charcoal fluid or an electric starter for your outdoor grill: Remove both ends from a 3 lb. coffee can. Punch holes as inch apart all around the outside edge of one end, using a beverage can opener. Stand the can, holes downward, on your grill, fill bottom quarter with crumpled newspaper, add charcoal briquets & light the paper through one of the holes. When the coals are burning well, remove the can with a pair of pliers.

To remove old, waterbased paint from jeans, spray with Easy Off oven cleaner, let set for 30 min., then wash.

For spots on plexiglass, pet stores sell a cleaner for plexiglass tanks that clean & remove scratches & nicks.

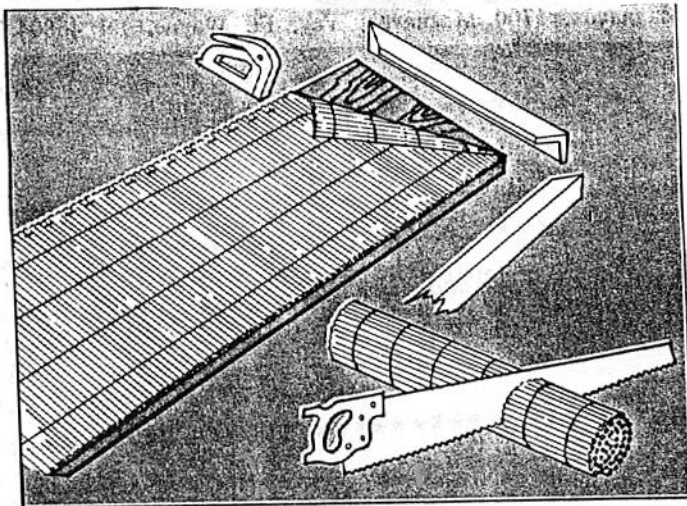
For shower curtains that are mildewed, wash in hot soapy water, rub with lemon juice & hang out to dry.

## HOW TO BUILD A FOLDING SCREEN

To make the standing screen, cut three 16"W x 72"H panels from  $\frac{3}{4}$ " plywood. Roll 48"W x 72"H matchstick blind tightly top to bottom. Cut into three 16" strips with handsaw. Staple strips to plywood panels. Frame panels with pre-painted, mitered cornerguard molding. Touch up nail holes with paint. Hinge with two-way hinges at top and bottom of panels.

For musty smelling rug or mattress, go over it lightly with a sponge dampened in rubbing alcohol. Or place newspaper between mattress & spring, leave it 2 or 3 weeks & repeat. Or sprinkle baking soda between & vacuum occasionally. Or sprinkle kitty litter on the mattress & let set for a week.
