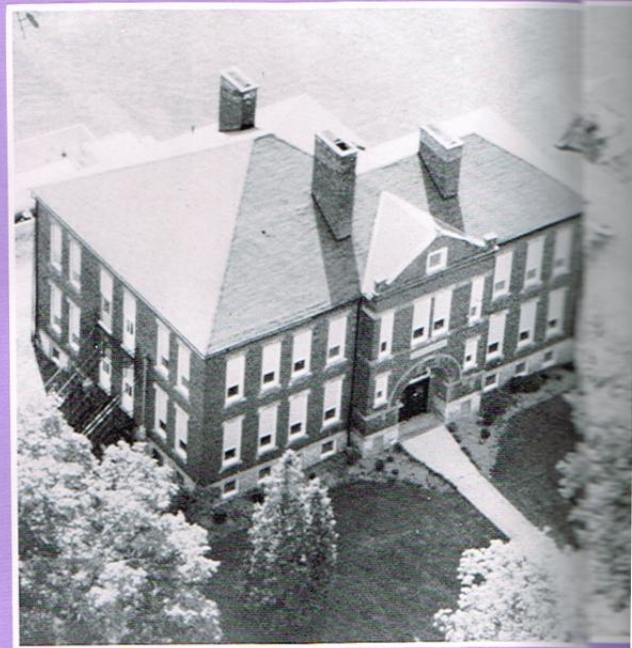
More Than

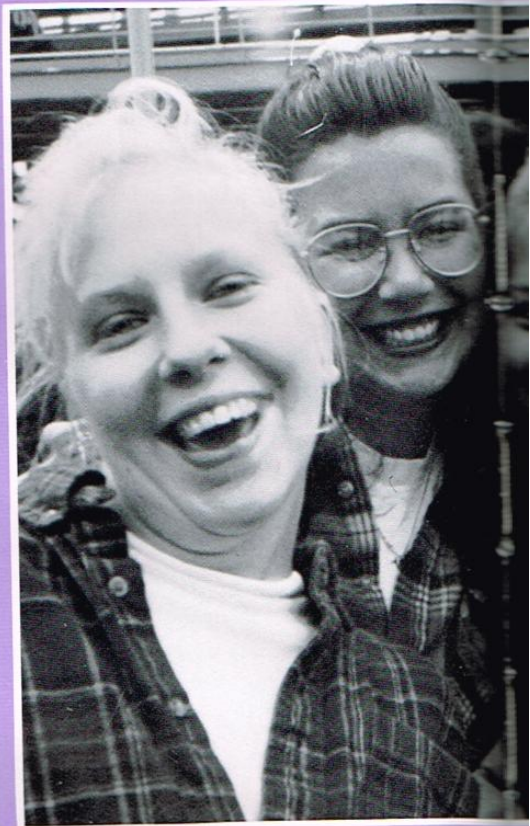

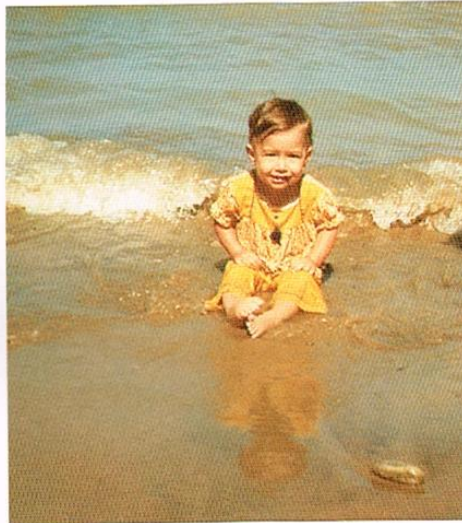
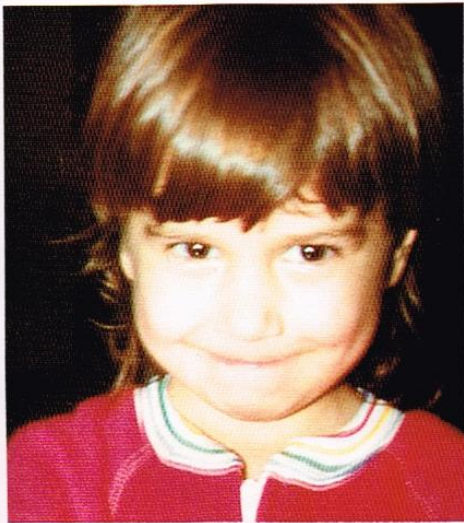
I have one sister and two stepsisters. My sister Diana attends Kelleys Island School. She is in the eighth grade. My two stepsisters are married and both have children.

Off To A Running Start!

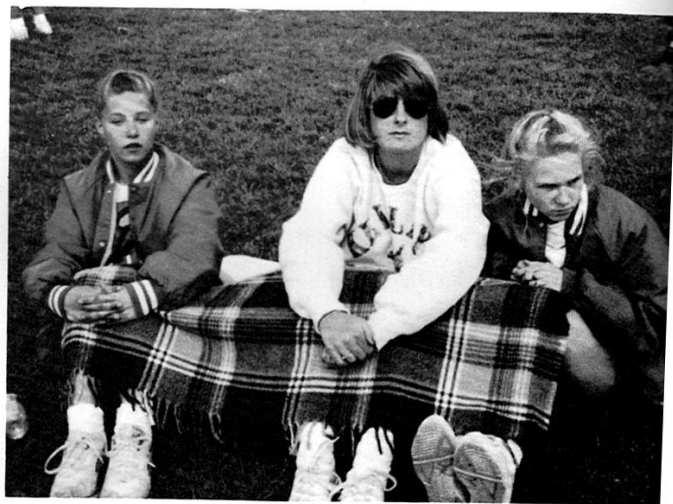

"In twenty years, I see more people and more ways in which people can work here instead of the mainland. I think there will be a larger population in the winter and more year-round residents."

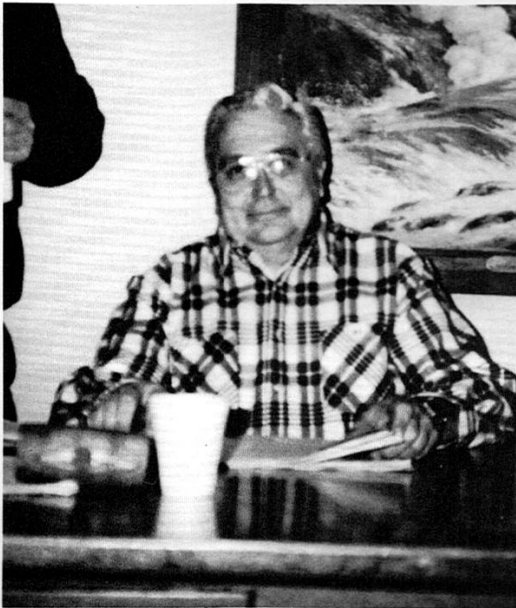
