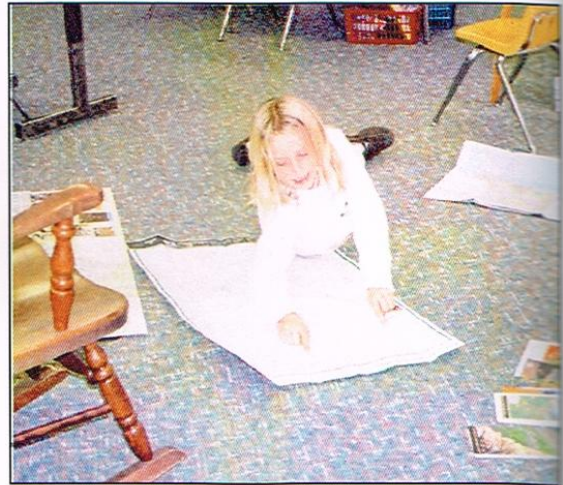

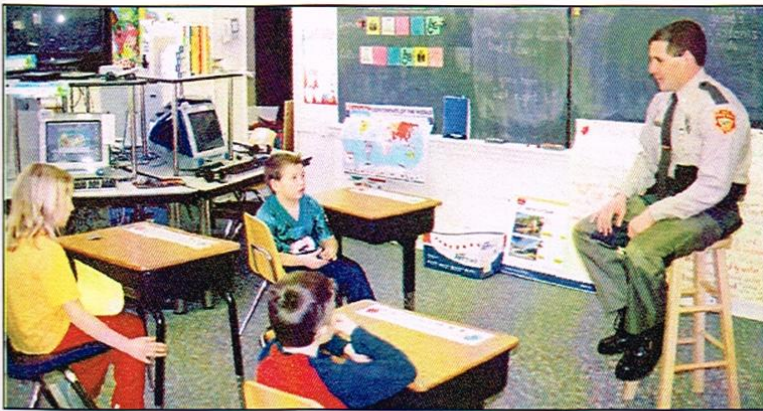

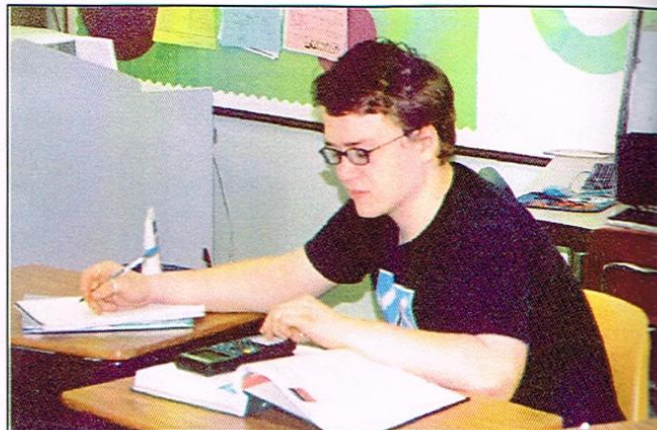

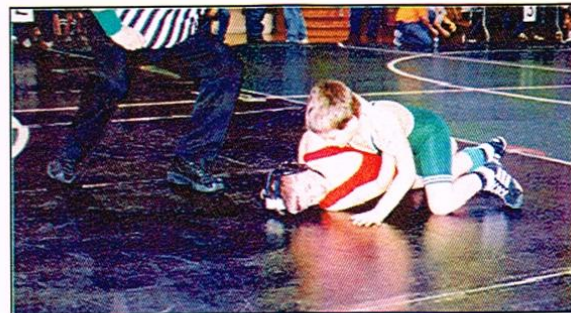
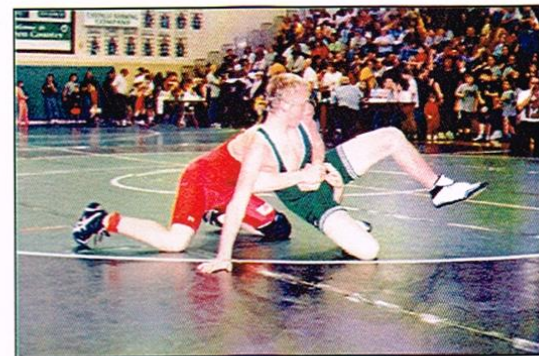
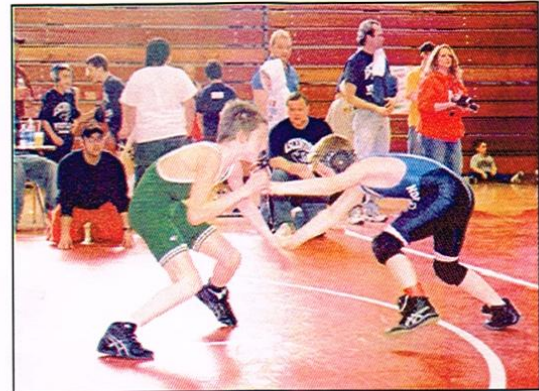
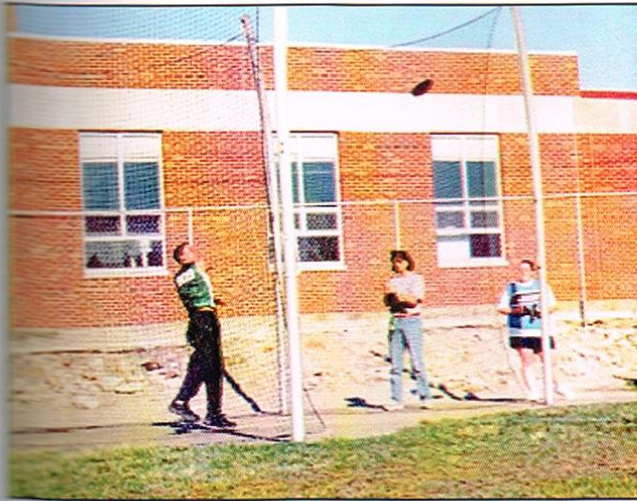


Sports
