Winter is approaching and KIHA is getting ready for it

The Old German Reformed Church will not have another cold winter. The Board voted to install a heat pump system. Bayside Comfort is doing the installation and should be finished before the real cold hits. During this project, crawling under the building and placing vents at various points, a serious problem was found structurally in the northeast section of the church.

Rotting joists were reinforced and re-supported. More work to address the floor joists will be done in the spring. The interior plaster is being repaired and paint has been purchased for the interior walls and ceiling.

Highlights from The President's Report from August 10th, 2013 Meeting

Charles Herndon, on his second term as president of KIHA, reported that over the last year, the association had been active on many fronts, and noted many problems with the buildings of the historical association. The German Reformed Church steeple has been repaired. REM Construction did the repair job. The damage was caused by raccoons trying to enter and boards rotting. This lap siding has been replaced and the steeple and attic area is now raccoon-proof. The attic area has been cleaned and insulated to R30 or better. Some plaster patching has occurred and more to follow. After final patching, the winter project is to paint the inside of the church. This can be done now that the church has a furnace.

The Parsonage, its repair, and further use continues to be a challenge for the board. Ideas floated were to repair it, convert it to house with period furniture and artifacts, or do nothing. Sources of funding are being explored.

The Gift Shop, with advice of board member Dee Dee Ritchie, and management team for 2013, Patti Fresch and Bev Luck, did a great job bringing in new merchandise to sell and display. They deserve our warm apprecia-

"We are always working on making our museum better" Herndon reports. An educator, **Jennifer Souers** Chevraux, from The Inter Conservation Museum spoke and fielded questions about Best Practices in August. This proved to be a productive meeting. The **Lakeside Historical Group** joined the presentation. It is an important step for future partnerships. The Sandusky museums could also offer partnerships we look forward to cultivating in the future.

We have purchased new signage for the Museum and Church. It is professionally crafted and brings a more formal look to the association.

Jeri Himmelein Yoest has agreed to be in charge of our oral history initiative. Many issues have been discussed and explored by Jeri on this endeavor, copyright law being of primary importance.

The memory brick/paver number increases apace. Thanks to volunteer, Mike Feyedelem, for installing the bricks and to the **Balconis** for their great work and partnership with us.

Internet has been installed at the museum, as well a scanner, making our jobs more efficient while at the museum doing cataloguing, transcriptions, searching a database for museum inventory and research. The website has recently been updated. Thanks to **Delores Cole** who is our current webmaster and **Leslie Korenko** who continues to do amazing work as Corresponding Secretary, assisting with updates for the web page, and her efforts in cataloguing and organization.

Thanks to **Greg Ritchie** for his years of service for KIHA. He has resigned as treasurer and from the board. His wife, Dee Dee, freshly retired from a financial background is now a board member and Treasurer. Herndon states, "We thank Greg Ritchie for his service and for his wife."




